

BSB vice-president Maggie Augustyniak said the BSB Swing was looking forward to a fresh and exciting start to 2021, with the upcoming Metropolitan Bands in the Parks Outdoor Cinema in the Suburbs.




"Last year saw gigs cancelled and we had restrictions on our rehearsals," Maggie said. "We had our first and last performance of the year in November 2020. "I'm an Adelaide boy, and my wife Vikki is an Adelaide girl. Vikki and I have been together 23 years. We met at the Gay Mardi Gras Sleaze Ball in Sydney – two straight people met at a gay ball!

We [with son Noah] came to Brisbane six years ago. We had six months in Spring Hill and then we bought the house at Wavell Heights.

The location is great; going up the coast, and getting into the city, and if you ever want to travel, the airport is really close. They're all the reasons we picked it.

I'm a hairdresser and a barber; I'm qualified in both. I'm actually a master hairdresser. I've been hairdressing and barbering combined for 43 years now. I was actually an [Australian Rules] footballer when I started doing hairdressing – that was very, very rare. I still love football; I'm a Port Adelaide fan.

I cut Julia Gillard's hair in Canberra when she was Prime Minister, and I cut the Swedish Prime Minister's hair a couple of weeks later. And, a couple of rock people back in the 80s – Billy Idol was one.

Barbering I've actually only concentrated on for the last four years full time. I'd done just about everything in hairdressing – I'd owned my own businesses, I'd worked for some of the big-name salons, worked internationally and nationally. I just felt like a change, and barbering was a scene that was starting to pick up and become quite happening. In the last six years, barbering has really taken off. Men are finally starting to embrace it.

Some men are fussy. Some of the young ones are really fussy. I had one young bloke come in the other day and said 'I want a mullet, do you know how to cut one?' The guy next to me just about burst out laughing. He goes, 'He was cutting mullets before you were even thought of!' The young ones forget the wheel goes round.

I took Noah away for his 21st in February last year and we went to Chicago. When we came back through LA, you could feel that something was happening. We got home about 10 days before it all went bad; Coronavirus hit, and Black Lives Matters hit. We would have been in the middle of some very interesting demonstrations."



Getting Into the Swing

mpire Swing is keeping the jive alive by offering swing dancing classes for beginners at Wavell Heights Community Hall this month.

You can relive the best moments of the big band days by learning how to do the jitterbug, charleston and lindy hop over an eight-week course. Owner and instructor Kameron Davis said the dance classes were a great way of bringing the community together because they were fun, upbeat, and inclusive.

"Swing dancing cuts through a lot of generations," Kameron said. "I've seen people from their early 20s through to their 60s having fun together on the dance floor.

"All you have to do is dance to one song and you're instantly part of the group, sharing that community."

Now in its tenth year of operation, Empire Swing is the longest running swing dancing school in Brisbane, teaching popular dances from the 20s, 30s. and 40s.

"These dances came about during a time when things weren't the best," Kameron said. "They make people happy. What I love about dances like the lindy hop is you can put it together in any way. It's not regimented. It's a social dance."

Kameron, who has been dancing for 15 years, said the beginner classes have been designed to teach people who had never danced before.

"You don't need to be a natural dancer," he said.
"The way we design our beginner block is to teach people the fundamentals and basic steps.

"Those who aren't sure if they want to do the eight-week course can come along to one of our Summer of Swing taster classes and see if they like it.

"The classes will be operating in accordance with an approved COVID-safe plan."

With Valentine's Day coming up, it might be a good opportunity to meet someone special. "I've seen lots of relationships develop from swing dancing," Kameron said. "I've seen people get married and have babies, who met through swing dancing."

Festivalgoers can expect an exhibition of over 130 local craft beers and ciders, and will be able to find a flavour to suit their tastebuds by sampling the brews from the endless selections on offer.

The day will also feature gourmet food trucks serving delicious eats to complement your brew of choice and keep your belly full so the 'beer goggles' do not come out too early.

Eatons Hill marketing and events coordinator Lauren McCarthy said the focus of the Beer Fest was on the local brewers and suppliers that will set up their market stalls with their craft creations for everyone to sample.

"Our main event of the day is the Keg Races," Lauren said. "People are in teams of two and run kegs from one side to another. The winner will get an incredible prize."

"We have pretty cruisey music on through the day from our live entertainment (yet to be announced), and as it progresses into the evening we have more full-on, fun music so everyone can have a dance on the dance floor in front of the stage, before continuing on to our nightclub inside when it opens."

The Beer Fest tickets are currently only \$10 if purchased online, however, will cost more at the door on the day.

Lauren said they also have a dress up competition to add to the fun of the day with patrons getting more creative each year - any theme you like.

"Over the years we have had Where's Wallys running around, people wearing beer shirts from Lowes, and one year some festival goers dressed up as Power Rangers," Lauren said.

"It's a great event to get out and celebrate with your friends. Try some new beers - there's a huge variety - for example last year we had a watermelon sour, and some of the smaller, local breweries will create some new, special flavours iust for the day."

As we kick off 2021, our plan for Queensland's Economic Recovery is well underway. A key part of this plan is easing the cost of living on Queensland households - that's why I'm urging northside locals to check their

eligibility to receive the Palaszczuk Government's electricity and gas rebates. These rebates can be worth up to \$416 per year.

The Palaszczuk Government is already delivering 625,000 Queenslanders a share in \$212.8 million worth of concessions, but thousands more are eligible and we're calling on Queenslanders to talk to their energy retailers about what savings are on offer.

To access these rebates, you'll need to contact your electricity retailer or gas retailer - providing your eligible concession card information and answering a few questions about your eligibility. If you are a holder of an eligible concession card, you'll receive a credit automatically applied to your monthly or quarterly electricity bill.

The last 12 months have been challenging, which is why it's so important that every cent of support available gets to those who need it most.

The grants can be used for small capital projects

\$20,000 and in this special round of the programme, will cover up to 100 per cent of the eligible project costs.

Examples of eligible projects can include, but are not limited to, upgrades or fitouts of


community centres, sporting facility upgrades, kitchen renovations, purchase of equipment, park furniture, community barbecues, and community gardens.



"From there, I discovered artists like Keith Urban and Carrie Underwood and listened as they helped country music to evolve into mainstream music," she said.


"I've always adored and respected the story telling lyrics of classic country music, but I also love creating new sounds, so I would describe my style as just that."

he Northern Transitway project covers 2.3km along Gympie Arterial Road. The project promises to provide a high quality public transport corridor to support high frequency bus services and encourage more people to use public transport. Not everyone is happy about the plans in the current form, though.

Owner of Kedron News and Post Peter Lincoln is concerned about the impact of the construction on local businesses. One of the major concerns is that there would be restrictions to on-street parking in both directions.

"This cuts down trading times to some shops to six hours, which is impractical in the business climate in Queensland," Peter said. "The impact on my business will be minimal but, I believe in if my mate has a problem, then I have a problem."

Yvette Cottrill from Consign-A-Car on Gympie Road, Kedron also had concerns about the project.

"The highest crash zone in Brisbane is Gympie Road, Chermside. Followed in a close second by Gympie Road, Aspley, and there are no plans for anything there," she said.

Other concerns include the narrowing of lanes to 3.1m wide and installation of traffic lights on the corner of Gympie Road and Boothby Street. The lights are intended for those wanting to get to businesses on the eastern side of Gympie Road, requiring travel through residential streets.

"There are no plans to make the intersection at Hamilton and Gympie Roads any more workable either – which it isn't at the moment. There'll be more traffic jams at this intersection, holding up traffic back along Gympie and Hamilton Roads," Peter said.

State Member for Stafford Jimmy Sullivan said all feedback was carefully considered by Transport and Main Roads (TMR) when determining the final design and operating arrangements for the Northern Transitway.

"In late 2018, TMR first informed the community about the planning and design of the Northern Transitway project," Mr Sullivan said. "In September and October 2019, TMR undertook various community consultation activities, including one-on-one meetings, to gain an understanding of the community's issues and concerns."

Once complete, the project will reduce travel times by an average of six minutes during peak periods and will also mean more frequent buses for some travellers.

Construction of the Northern Transitway is set to begin in early 2021. You can find out more by visiting www.tmr.qld.gov.au



Thanks to the pandemic causing problems at her Brisbane café, Dark Tonic owner Rosie Campbell made the decision to set up shop in the northern suburbs instead, taking a wealth of experience and her trusted barista - with her.

"My husband and I bought this café for a discounted price as the owner wanted to move back home to Gympie, and we saw so much growth and future opportunities here," Rosie said.

"Running a suburban café has always been an ambition of mine as I find it easier to connect with customers - they have more time to talk and get to know you.

"Our customers also know each other and talk about our coffee to each other, which is lovely and we have put in a lot of time, effort, and commitment to really make our business grow."

Coffee is certainly the star, with Dark Tonic roasting its beans on site.

"People love the fact we roast here on site and we love to show off our little electric roaster and explain the process to anyone that asks," Rosie said. "We also educate our customers about alternative coffee brewing, like V60 and cold drip."

"We have had customers buy whole kilo bags of our beans and we even have a wholesale customer on the southside who has our beans in their café.

"The flavour of our beans and choice of different milks really sets us apart, and word has been getting around at how good our coffee and food is - we have had quite a few new customers saying, 'I'm so glad my friend told me about you quys'."

A close-knit business, Dark Tonic successfully mixes business, family, and friendship, with the couple's three children and a handful of close friends participating in the running of the popular roastery.

"My husband and I run the business together and we have recently had my husband's best friend help out, who is also a chef, and our barista Tessa is a great friend also," Rosie said.

"My 14-year-old old son helps out in the kitchen, while my 13-year-old old daughter loves the front counter and making coffee.

"Even my toddler daughter just likes to spray and wipe the glass and sweep."



Each month I'll be sharing a snapshot of what's current and happening in real estate in the Chermside and surrounding areas.

ur property market ended on a high last year in light of the global pandemic. Australia has managed this well against many overseas countries and local agents have reported that the housing market is extremely busy. Why is this so, and what is driving this hive of activity?

orthsiders have always loved bagging a stylish steal at Fab Finds Markets, and now the second-hand fashion events are gearing up for a fresh new venue at Geebung Bowls Club. Shoppers will have access to over 30 racks of quality second-hand fashion and accessories with entry free to the public.

Market manager Michele Murray said she was excited for the first event of 2021 at the new venue.

"The Bowls Club offers us the ability to have both inside and outside stalls, is air-conditioned, and has a coffee shop attached – so we are fully caffeinated for the early start," she said.

Michele said she still had outdoor stalls available for sellers, and that guidelines and practical support would be included in the booking fee.

"We offer an extensive sellers pack, which gives people great ideas on how to style their stall and how to price their items," she said.

"When you arrive on the day you know who to see because I am there in a bright pink vest to show you where to set up and answer any questions."

Michele said that alongside perks for sellers, there were many silver linings to shopping second-hand – one of the biggest being the sustainability aspect.

"The feeling when you find that dress at a market, hardly worn or still with tags for a fraction of the price, is priceless," she said.

"Also, shopping second-hand helps to divert textiles from landfill – did you know that textile waste is the third largest contributor to landfill?"

For Fab Finds Markets, the spirit of giving back does not stop there. It partners with local Geebung charity shop Broken to Brilliant, which supports victims of domestic violence.

"At the end of each market, stall holders can leave what they don't want to take home and we bundle it up and donate it," Michele said.



he Pollinator Link project aims to bring birds, butterflies and bees back to our urban habitat. It will do this by providing water, food, and shelter in backyards, balcony gardens, school yards, and other areas in our community. The trial will begin in the Chermside area with the help of Councillor Fiona Hammond, Local gardeners will be recruited as 'quardians' to accommodate homes for solitary native bees.

Michael Fox, who is running the trial, said providing suitable shelter for safety and breeding was a key factor in bringing wildlife back to our city gardens.

"While stingless native bees have become well known, most people do not know we have around 2,000 species of solitary native bees in Australia," he said. "Solitary native bees are ideal for our gardens and school yards because of their unique pollination services, like buzz pollination. Also, with no hive to defend, they rarely ever sting."

If the bees have no hive, how are solitary bees attracted into our gardens? Michael said the initial research was focused on leaf-cutter and resin bees using nesting tubes from the UK and the US, as well as paper straws.

"Guardians will host bee homes in their gardens using specially designed nesting tubes that are returned at the end of the nesting season," Michael said. "These filled tubes are processed with some cocoons returned and others sent out to hatch in gardens of new guardians."

Blue Banded Bee Amegilla cingulata

These bee homes are very different to the ones you'll find at your local hardware store, according to Michael.

"Those aim to provide shelter for leaf-cutters and resin bees," he said. "However, most are very poorly designed with tubes too short, which unbalances the male / female bee ratio, and holes with too large a diameter, which attracts ants and grass-carrying wasps. Our research compared the commercial products with our research design."

The Chermside Parks research started in late 2019, however, Michael said building up a guardian program would take years.

"Initial deployment of bee homes will be at no cost to our research gardeners, so a key step is to source funding for materials," he said.

s the Brisbane Netball Association enters the pointy end of the summer season, we showcase one of its premier clubs, Kedron Lions.

Kedron Lions Netball Club president Adam Disney said the club was established in 1988 by founder Len Davis

"Len was associated with the Kedron Lions Aussie Rules Club, but once his daughters came along, they and their friends wanted somewhere to play netball." Adam said.

"Len has since moved away from the area but still drives down to coach his favourites, our little 'Go' group," Adam said.

The Kedron Lions have 30 teams across 17 divisions from U10s through to seniors.

Adam said the club was very much about the social development angle as well as the athletic angle.

"We try to give our kids really good habits, but also good direction and understand how good sport is for community and individuals as well," he said.

"We like to breed community and do some blanket drives, which I feel is a nice effort from a sporting club."

The club has fully funded programs with sponsors like Nitro Boxing, where they send the girls to do boxing sessions.

"It's a bit of fun but also an eye-opening lesson for them that's great for strength, change of direction, and being light on your feet," Adam said.

Beach Sports at Wooloowin is another venue where members go to train in the sand and do beach netball sessions.

The club hasn't left out the older girls either, and has a strength and conditioning trainer come in and work with them.

The club averages 20-25 rep players per season, with five premierships collected last season.

Adam said he was quite optimistic this season they would get five or six premierships.

"I think it's nice being a bit patriotic having your club and colours, but the netball community is a nice community in general anyway, although they're competitive once they cross the white line," he said.

ity people who own herding-breed dogs as pets may find this all too familiar. Chasing cars, birds, rounding up other dogs at the park, and ignoring recall are most likely signs your dog is simply trying to herd.

Working dog breeds that are domestic pets who play in back yards, visit the local park, and have never seen a sheep, often transform in front of their owner's eyes in their first visit to trainer John Borg.

"The problem is we are trying to communicate with our dogs with human language, human instinct, and human emotion," John said.

"The issue is they are dogs, not humans, and we have to learn to talk to the dogs in their own language, which is body language."

John has always had an affinity with animals, and began training and competing at sheep-herding shows in 2012 with his first working dog, Bindi.

Born and raised in Redcliffe, John competes against farmers and sheep-station owners, and learned that by using sheep to train people's dogs, he could help city dog owners understand their pets.

"I tend to have a natural connection with dogs and they with me, so my training started evolving and I don't train like a lot of other guys; I'm more in tune to the animal and the dog," he said.

John said he learned that it was not about domination, but respect.

"Because I'm surrounded by dogs all the time and have 14 of my own, I see the body language between them," he said. "My pack leader, the alpha, does not dominate the other dogs, they all show mutual respect.

"So that's what I try to convey to people now and that helps change the way they communicate with their pet, by understanding their body language."

With more than 200 city dogs a week coming to see John, he said the most rewarding part of his day was seeing the enjoyment the dogs got from doing something instinctive.

"I love the new dog when the light comes on and they realise what they have got to do; it's a moving thing," he said.

"Then when their humans see their city pet never been on a sheep farm before - naturally work the sheep, they are just so happy and proud."

All types of sheep herding breeds can come to the farm, such as Border Collies, Kelpies, German Shepards, Samoyeds, Rottweilers, and even Corgis.




This is the second year that the market will be run, with the first market day in 2019 attracting

owards the end of the 19th century, a new form of transport came to Downfall Creek (now known as Chermside). Horse-drawn trams modernised the small settlement. However, there is some dispute over the exact date these new trams arrived – 1883 or 1885.

In 1883, Downfall Creek consisted of a few small dwellings, a store, and a smithy, surrounded by small farms and bushland. It was very much a working-class area, and other businesses in the area included a carriage builder, a slaughterhouse, and a tannery. There were no big homes or wide streets as in other, more fashionable suburbs of Brisbane.

Early photos showed that the slow-moving vehicles ran on the ground, but soon were running on rails. They were so slow that a buggy could outpace the tram, but the tram could carry more people.

In 1897, the first electric tram came to the area. These were faster and smoother than their horse-drawn predecessors, as well as being able to go further, carry more people, and operate in all weather.

Over the next few years, the services were extended. In 1912, when several horse bus companies in Brisbane amalgamated,

Chermside was suddenly without a public transport system. With Aussie gumption and out of necessity, a group of locals formed their own Kedron Omnibus Service. From 1914, the buses would go as far as Kedron Brook. Windsor was also added in 1914. By 1925, trams reached Lutwyche Cemetery.

As the rail network expanded, more people could travel to work in the city, school attendances increased, and the area boomed as more people moved here. Housing estates expanded along Gympie Road, which was widened to take the trams.

Twenty years later, at the end of WW2, Chermside had become a thriving and growing area. With the opening of the new terminus on Hamilton Road, ordinary wage earners had clean, reliable transport options and the area thrived.

Massive changes took place over the next decade, and with the opening of the shopping complex at Chermside (now Westfield), the automobile took over as the major mode of transport. Trams were phased out and the trees and rose beds planted along the tracks were removed.

We now have a multi-laned major motorway where once, horses leisurely plied the tracks.

PIGEON NESTS A PEST FOR PANELS

igeons may not always rule the roost, but when it comes to solar panels, their nests become the ultimate pest.

Pure Sunshine Solar Cleaning owner Luke Vervoorn said pigeons nesting in solar panels were a big problem in the local area.

"We can't be sure where the problem started, but the bird numbers are constantly going up," he said.

"The boom of the solar industry has provided hundreds of new nesting areas for the birds, and they breed constantly - the homing nature of the bird means they stay local.

"We have completed more than 200 bird proofing jobs in our region alone and close to 500 in total."

Luke said the reason behind the rising numbers was the solar panels sit on rails above the roof to

allow air to flow underneath and to prevent them overheating, however, this space was a perfect nesting and roosting area for pigeons.

These birds can cause thousands of dollars worth of damage, and if ignored, the problem gets worse with time," he said.

"Once new birds have been hatched at the property, they consider it home, and it is then harder to move them on, and the numbers grow rapidly.

"The amount of poo these birds make is incredible, and it is not only smelly but can corrode metal roofs and gutters in time, block gutters and downpipes that cause water to spill during storms.

"Bird poo on solar panels also dramatically drops the efficiency and causes hot spots, which can burn out the panels."

Luke said a solution was to get a pest proofing system, which extends to other pests including possums.

"Clips fix to the underside of the solar panels and are attached to a heavy-duty, outdoor plastic mesh to keep the pigeons from getting under," he said.

"The mesh is plastic to prevent any metal-onmetal reactions and can be clipped on and off easily, so it doesn't interfere with the system.

"People should get the problem sorted straight away as it only gets worse and more costly as time goes on."
