hermside locals and commuters may have noticed something missing on their drive along Gympie Road in recent times. The iconic big brown boot, which has sat on top of car yard The Car Mine for decades, was recently removed from its home.

Owner of the boot Alfie Senese said taking it down saved its life.

"The boot was in pretty bad condition and was beginning to deteriorate so, first and foremost, we pulled it down to avoid it being a hazard or a danger to the public," he said.

The big boot began its life in South Brisbane on a boot factory used during World War II. After the closure of the factory, the boot was relocated to Paddington. There, it became a feature of the popular Spaghetti Emporium, and then for subsequent businesses in the same location. It was moved to Chermside by a man who owned a camping store and has been in the area for the past 35 to 40 years.

Safety is not the only reason the big boot has been taken down from its Chermside location, though. The Car Mine site has recently been sold and is earmarked for a new development. "The new owner of the site will be eventually demolishing the existing building and the big boot did not fit there," Alfie said.

A development application was approved in October last year for a health care service, shop, and food and drink outlet to be constructed on the site. Development group Cornerstone said Chermside Health hub would offer a diverse range of health and medical services for the broader community under one roof.

"We view our efforts as being for a far greater outcome than simple bricks, mortar and real estate," said a spokesperson for Cornerstone. "Chermside Health Hub will serve as a welcoming medical precinct that will play an important role in delivering improved outcomes as Brisbane's population continues to grow and change. Our vision is to achieve exceptional health and wellbeing for all communities."

Construction is expected to begin in mid-2021, with completion due around mid-2022.

For those left wondering about the fate of the big boot, we may not have seen the last of it yet.

"If all goes to plan, The Car Mine has every intention of one day bringing the boot back to its former glory – although it needs a lot of work and money spent on it," Alfie said. "Also, we are unsure of our new location at this stage."

"I've lived in Wavell Heights [with parents John and Andrea, and brother Jack] since I was born. I guess I have a long history with the area; all my friends and family are really close by. There's lots of things to do around here as well – nice places to eat and go out and catch up with friends. It's very central too. It's always been home for me and probably always will be. networks. After a month there being a general news reporter, they offered me the producing role, managing a team of about six people who produce the local news every night. Then just before Christmas, they gave me a call and said 'do you want to move back to Brisbane?' Obviously yes, I really wanted to come back. I'm doing general news reporting – reporting on anything from crime to coronavirus.

I would love to end up working for Sunrise – that's kind of my 10-year plan. So, hopefully I can move to Sydney in the next five to 10 years. But I definitely don't see myself getting out of the industry. The one thing about this industry is that every single day is different. You start fresh every single morning, and you never know what you're walking into when you go to work – which I really like, because I'm the kind of person who needs a bit of excitement to keep me motivated.

I was only away for about a year and a half, but coming back to Brisbane, it still feels exactly the same, all my friends are still here, my family are still here and still doing the same thing. It's nice for us all to be back together again.

earning another language can be a costly exercise, and finding a language school in a convenient location can be a challenge. But, for those looking to learn some conversational Italian, Claudia's Conversation Classes in Geebung will have you talking like an Italian in no time.

Claudia D'Ambrosio said it was normally very expensive to do classes like this, but she had tried to make it more affordable.

"For me, it's got to be light and fun and enjoyable," she said. "It's always been a passion for me to teach this way and I try to keep the prices low."

The language classes run in eight-week blocks throughout the year and are available at beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. Private classes are also an option. The real difference with Claudia's classes, though, is her relaxed and effective teaching methods.

"I use a different technique where, as soon as I teach something to the student, they straight away put it into practice," Claudia said. "So, they can speak straight away. It's an easier, lighter and more enjoyable way of learning the language. It's one of the hardest romance languages. It's the most detailed. It's like discovering a code. Once you've got it, it's easier."

Claudia said it was a passion for her to open up her culture to others and show them learning the language was easy. She has plans to offer Italian cooking classes at the same venue soon, as well as expanding her offerings to include other languages and cultures by welcoming in other expert teachers.

"It's all about opening the mind and being able to think differently," she said. "It's not just learning words, it's about the culture and learning the reasoning behind things."

For those who are considering going along, Claudia ensures the classes are easily accessible and invites you to be open to a different way of thinking.

"There's no formal assessment," she said. "I don't want people to feel pressured in any way. I don't want to teach to an exam. You've got to be prepared to be open to different things and really learn."

ith Brisbane's largest waterpark located in Chermside, gone are the days of having to travel to the coast for some 'splashtastic' fun in the sun. Despite recent Coronavirus restrictions in Queensland, the park has reopened for the remainder of the season.

City Venue Management general manager Roger Hawke said the summer holiday period was always busiest for the park, but that attendance would continue to flow.

"Although it's a touch quieter now, the waterpark is still open until the end of the Easter school holidays and we're ready for some more busy days," Roger said.

Adults and children have weekend access to more than 200m of water slides and a wading lagoon pool at the dedicated waterpark, which is a part of the Chermside Aquatic Centre.

"Adults most enjoy the Flume of Doom, which involves buddying up on a raft, and can get quite surprisingly fast," Roger said.

There's extra fun for the kids with birthday parties at the waterpark, with not only all the fun of the water slides, but also party food and drinks supplied.

"Kids' parties involve unlimited access to the slides, lily pads and lagoon for the entire day (or as long as a parent wishes to hold a party for)," Roger said.

City Venue facility manager Shani Gold said that alongside the waterpark, the Chermside Aquatic Centre offered plenty of drawcards of its own, such as the outdoor 24m lap pool, indoor heated hydro pool, and adult fitness classes.

"We offer adult 'Swimfit' classes with our swim coaches who put adult swimmers through their paces," Shani said. "There are the early mornings before work or evening 'cooldowns' - be it for fitness, social, or event training purposes."

She said coaches were happy to adapt lessons for personal goals and that there were a variety of fitness classes for different demographics.

"We have something suitable for everyone including the elderly and pregnant women looking for low resistance-based exercise options."

f you've ever imagined yourself fencing like Zorro or The Three Musketeers, then Spanish sword fighting classes are a great place to start.

The Brisbane School of Iberian Swordsmanship is holding classes on Wednesday nights at Stafford State School for those keen to learn how to wield a rapier, or who want to impress their friends with an exciting new hobby.

Instructor Kate Hickey said the school was founded in 2015 and was the only place in Brisbane where students could learn the traditional Spanish style of fencing known as La Verdadera Destreza.

"What we do is a bit different," Kate said. "We've taken an art that is not used anymore and we are interpreting textbooks written in the 1500s and 1600s. One of our members, Lois, speaks Spanish and does the translations.

"We try to be history-based but it's also lots of fun."

If learning how to swordfight isn't motivation enough, the school also offers the first lesson for free. Students are supplied with everything they need, including eye protection and a loaner sword. Kate said beginners would learn safety and footwork in the first class, as well as basic attack and basic defence.

"Destreza has 14 specific actions and some of them take a bit of work, but within three to four weeks, you'll learn enough attacks and defence to be able to slowly fence someone without knowing what they're going to do next."

Members of the school are aged between 14 and 56 and include people with an interest in history, who enjoy the community aspect, and those looking for a fun way to exercise.

"People get more coordinated and fitter as they start to master the sword and can move faster," Kate said. "For me it has been an amazing fitness benefit.

"We also try to build a community by going out for ice cream afterwards and breaking in the middle of training so people can chat and get to know each other."

"The best time to start is this Wednesday. We always make people feel welcome when they arrive. It's really important that everyone feels safe and comfortable with us."

at, Play, Speak. Those words are at the centre of it all for speech language pathologist, Michelle Wallace.

At her Chermside clinic, Michelle works with families to support children in all areas of speech and language development and feeding and mealtimes.

While she has experience working with people of all ages, Michelle said the clinic was more centred around providing support to younger children.

"I tend to focus on the littlies," she said. "The zero to 10 age group."

She also has a clinical focus on disability, speech and language delays, and can even assist families with fussy eaters.

Instead of a one-size-fits-all mentality with fussy eating, Michelle said it was about tailoring interventions to the unique needs of each child and family.

"There are different approaches, depending on what the difficulties are for the child," Michelle said.

"Sometimes with fussy eating, you might take a bit more of a behavioural approach where you use your rewards."

Michelle said that sometimes putting more pressure on a child to eat may not necessarily help them to eat more.

There's another process where it's more about exposure," she said. "Exploring the food without too much pressure, so that the child is the one initiating the interaction with the food."

Some children can also experience difficulties in transitioning to solid food. Michelle said it could be related to how the muscles of the cheek, lips, and the tongue function in eating.

"If your muscles aren't working properly, then it's hard [for children] to breastfeed or to bottle feed and then sometimes it can be hard to transition to solids. They can become averse to eating and then their diet can become more and more restricted."

For feeding issues, Michelle said that it was "never just one thing", and that a combined approach with other health professionals like lactation consultants and occupational therapists could be effective.

Having a clinic in Chermside is a plus for Michelle, who said the area was central in terms of access to other specialists, with the Prince Charles hospital located "just across the road".

Queensland Irish Choir president Barbara Poole said the traditional songs would be a mixture of Irish ballads and upbeat Irish songs including the popular tunes, I'll take you home again Kathleen and The Rose of Tralee.

"This will be our first time performing at the Chermside Kedron Community Church," Barbara said. "We have special guests in each half of the concert – The Queensland Irish Association (QIA) Dancers and the QIA Pipe Band. The audience always loves watching the little ones dancing."

The choir will be a sea of shamrocks with the female singers donning the lucky, bright green clovers on their tops, and the men in matching green ties.

"I've learned through the great diversity of women at Soul Dance that all women's bodies are capable of achieving beauty and that size, age and shape have nothing to do with it.



Pier Prepped To Party



The Evolution of an Aussie Rock Goddess: Sarah McLeod

ans of Sarah McLeod will be ecstatic to see her in a one-time-only tour where she showcases not only her electric rock style you all know and love, but also a show where she is her own support act in a vulnerable and raw piano set.

The charismatic songstress took time out from her birthday getaway – with a vodka in hand – to chat to Chermside Guide about her One Electric Lady in Concert Tour. The show will be at The Lounge (Royal Hotel) Nundah on 6 March.

Sarah said that the 2021 tour had morphed into a new concept, as her electric show from last year was cancelled due to the pandemic. She spent her time at home mastering the piano and decided to combine the original show with her new passion – in a way she has never been seen doing before.

"This is the only time I am going to do a show like this," Sarah said. "So, if you want to see the electric show and the warm-up piano show, this is your only chance.

"It's the best of everything I can muster in one show. It's the only time I will do a tour where I do two sets. I'll get it out of my system and then tour like a normal person."

Sarah said the electric show sounded like she was with a full band, however, it was only her on stage.

"I built a guitar that I can play both bass and guitar at the same time and then constructed this elaborate pedal board where I can trigger drums," Sarah said. "I've relearned all my songs so I can sound like a full band. I've got electric, dirty guitars, bass, drums – but it's just me."

"I'll be playing the piano prior to the electric show. I'm warming up for me - and then coming out as the main act as the wild electric lady. It's such a different headspace and attack on music for each part of the show.

"The piano is really stripped back, raw and beautiful and then it's the rock show and it's Wild

"I even get changed for each show; different setup, different light shows - two different personalities."

You will see the wild, rock star Sarah in the electric show with renditions of songs from her Rocky's Diner and Beauty of the Tiger solo albums. Her piano set features some of the Superjesus tracks - completely rewritten, interesting renditions, covers and some new music.

"I'm really enjoying the remake of Gravity," Sarah said. "I rewrote it with different chords, and I attack it differently. I am enjoying it because when I was doing it solo on guitar I would get so bored with it because everyone wanted me to play it - I'd find myself rolling my eyes, but I have found a way of loving it again. Now Gravity is new to me and the audience.

"I always love playing it with The Superjesus but not so much on my own. Now my heart is in it again and it's beautiful."

Sarah said she enjoyed the tranquility of the piano and found herself mesmerised by the music each time she sat in front of it.

"Going from The Superjesus shows to Solo is quite a different headspace," she said. "When I'm playing electric guitar, I'm on edge - there's so much going on and it's all so quick, jumping around.

"I don't think anyone's ever seen me calm. I'm always quite erratic on the stage, running around. I am way more vulnerable live now as I'm so used to going over the top to make sure everyone is having fun and moving around on stage."

Sarah describes herself as a "musical hermit" as she stays home and practises her piano all day, every day. She has started creating new music for her next album that she is hoping to release at the end of the year.



"I'm excited about this album because it's going to be very different," Sarah said. "I love every song and love every word on it. This record is written from a different place within my soul, so it has a totally different angle.

"I usually get a little hook or melody come to me while I'm out in society. Then I formulate the chorus and it becomes like a puzzle; I work backwards to create the story to fit in with the hook.

"I get inspiration from things I learn along the way - how to treat people, love people, about mother nature, mistakes I've made, where I've been, where I'm going, things I should have done, what someone else should have done. I put it into music so everyone else can learn too."

Sarah has a fan group on Patreon – McLeod's Wolf Pack, where she passes her demos on to her "Wolfies" to see if they like what she is producing.

"They are the first responders of my music," she said. "We talk about what they like, and then I groom my songs more. Everyday fans, they subscribe to join the wolf pack and hear everything first. It is great to connect with them - we have a lot of fun."



n undeveloped transport corridor between Carseldine and Everton Park has been identified as a potential solution for growing traffic congestion in Brisbane's north-west.

The nine-kilometre North West Transport Corridor is being considered as part of a business case being developed by Brisbane City Council, which will explore options for improved transport after identifying challenges with the current transport network.

Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers said the council study was being done at the request of the Federal Government to establish the transport needs of residents in north Brisbane.

"The business case will provide feedback on alternate travel options and look for ways to improve public transport," Sandy said.

The Federal Government has committed up to \$10 million to the development of the North West Transport Network business case.

With the population of South-East Queensland set to double in the next 20 years, Brisbane's north-west will face a significant increase in road and public transport network congestion.

Council's infrastructure chair David McLachlan said the plan was all about proposing a range of travel choices and bus, rail, and active transport options for consideration.

"Delivering high-quality public and active travel infrastructure would reduce the need for travel by private vehicles," David said.

"This will not only reduce congestion for residents, but also improve efficient movement of freight and business vehicles.

"Providing suitable transport options for the growing region is a key objective of this plan."

The project timeline has four stages and is currently in stage 2 of the business case development.

"In this stage, we have identified potential transport solutions for further analysis, and are using community and stakeholder feedback to inform the business case and refine potential solutions," David said.

Stage 1 began in late-2019 and involved problem identification and community feedback. More than half of the community responses identified public transport as the best way to improve

transport in Brisbane's north-west, followed by road improvements and bicycle infrastructure improvements.

McDowall councillor Tracy Davis said the community would play a vital part in developing the business case.

"The most recent round of community consultation provided residents with the opportunity to have their say on how we could provide safer, better connected transport options in their local area," Tracy said. "We will take this feedback and further develop the business case."

Residents have also taken to Facebook to voice their thoughts on the matter, with several users stating a tunnel was the best use for the North West Transport Corridor because another road would only cause congestion further down the road.

"Tunnels are the only answer to public transport; very little need for resumptions and disturbance to homes and businesses in Chermside and Aspley," said one Facebook user.

Others seemed to prefer the possibility of a multi-modal use for the corridor, suggesting surface corridors could be used as a community space and for parks and bikeways, while traffic flows underneath.

Meanwhile, some Facebook users had concerns that putting in rail would "impact residents around the corridor that purchased housing with no rail plans in place".

The North West Transport Network Strategic Assessment Key Findings Report, published late last year, stated it was unlikely one solution would address all the identified transport problems, and that a number of initiatives would be explored.

A report summarising the community feedback is to be released in the middle of the year, with the business case due for completion by the end of 2021.

CHERMSIDE'S NURSING ANGEL ALICE MABEL COCK-WOODSIDE

ittle was known about Alice Mabel Cock-Woodside until the Chermside and District Historical Society (CDHS) found the WW1 honour board that had belonged to Chermside State School. It was in a shocking state, but Alice's name was at the top; the only woman on the role.

More information was gathered when Alice's nephew, Maurice Cock, had a chance conversation with a member of the CDHS. Further history of Alice's family was brought to light by John Woodside, nephew of Alice's husband, James Woodside. Albeit short, the story of this mysterious woman at the top of a WW1 honour board was remarkable.

Alice was born on 11 February, 1890, the youngest child of Thomas and Elizabeth Cock. Elizabeth came from one of the earliest settled families in Brisbane – the Chalks, after which

Chalk Street in Kedron is named. Her uncle John also owned Brisbane's first bus service.

Thomas owned a slaughterhouse on Rode Road, Chermside, into which he incorporated a small cannery in the 1890s. He named it Devonia, after Devon in the UK, where the family originated. Sadly, the business failed in 1901 because of severe drought.

Alice attended Chermside State School from 1900-1905. She qualified as a nurse in 1917 after four years of training at the Brisbane General Hospital, now the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital. She immediately enlisted in the Australian Army Nursing Service and was sent overseas, serving in Southall, UK. She became ill with influenza while on active duty and spent seven weeks in hospital.

In early 1919, with the war at an end, Alice returned to Australia where she was discharged from the nursing service.

It is not known exactly how Alice met James Woodside, whom she married in June 1919. James was firstly a strapper, then a driver in the Engineering Corps. According to his service record, James spent a large part of the war in ill health with some time in hospital. It is speculated that she may have nursed him at some point. We do know that he purchased a substantial engagement ring before leaving England for Australia in 1918.

Following their marriage, the couple moved to a property at Warrawee, west of Brisbane. It was a hard life, with no conveniences of modern life. Their first child, Eleanor May, was born and died on 11 January, 1922. Then on 30 December, 1923, Alice died during childbirth, along with her second daughter, Helen. Tragically, James was left a childless widower after only four years of marriage. The lingering effects of Alice's wartime illness may have contributed to her death.

Alice was buried on the Cock family plot at Nundah. When CDHS restored the Chermside WW1 Memorial Gates, Alice's name was added – the only woman mentioned and a fitting tribute to her war service.

ith over 120 groups and around 300 people turning out for two local open homes on the first weekend in February, indications are that the local property market is still extremely strong with consumer confidence high. This has created a sellers market – this means that where the sellers have their terms and conditions met and with multiple offers being submitted, they can choose from those with the best price and most desirable conditions.

Agents have indicated that due to this, the time allocated for open homes has increased from 45 minutes to up to two hours to allow all buyers to view the properties available in a COVID-safe manner. With many buyers trying to view properties, it is advisable that buyers should set up a free account with www.realestate.com.au to get instant alerts when a new listing comes to the market, to avoid disappointment.

Buyers can place their best offer at open homes and should have their finances in order, with pre-loan approval, so that they can confidently make an offer with the knowledge that they will be approved for their loan.

Record low interest rates continue to drive buyer interest in home purchases across the full spectrum of all price points in the local market. It is interesting to note that the higher end suburbs of Kedron and Wavell Heights have shown a 4.9 per cent and 6.3 per cent increase respectively in median capital property price growth in the last 12 months. Geebung has seen a 1.9 per cent growth in residential homes, Stafford 2.8 per cent and Aspley 4 per cent. Carseldine is the only local suburb to show a drop of 2.3 per cent in capital median growth whilst the neighbouring suburbs of Bridgeman Downs are at 3.9 per cent and McDowall at 6.3 per cent respectively. Chermside remains at 10.5 per cent with the highest median price in the area being Bridgeman Downs at \$800,000 and Kedron at \$771,000.

Unit prices remain low with the highest median for Aspley at \$415,000 and lowest median of Stafford at \$363.000.



uskick is a well renowned and established pathway into the sport of AFL in schools and clubs right across Queensland.

This month, under the guidance of their Auskick coordinator Rob Cray, Kedron Lions Juniors will be rolling out its eight-week Auskick program.

Kedron Lions Junior Football Club vicepresident Steve Lang said one of the things the AFL had done really well over the last number of years was the Auskick program.

"Our Auskick program has been running since the early 2000s and is essentially for boys and girls five to eight years of age, and in a difficult year last year we still had 75 turn up," Steve said.

"Our President Rob Cray was nominated and won the Auskick Coordinator of the Year Award at the 2019 AFL Old Awards."

The Auskick program was about teaching basic skills of the game, from handballing to kicking. The club promotes a fun atmosphere where mums and dads can get involved while learning skills alongside their kids.

Steve said all participants at Kedron Auskick received a backpack that included the rightsized footy for them to be able to practise.

"It's all about foundation, putting a footy in their hands, and getting them to 'buy into' a little bit of what the game is about; understanding the fundamentals."

The club has a natural progression for boys and girls from when they start. After Auskick there's the Superstars program, which is more structured. They play on smaller sections of the field where skills learnt at Auskick can be translated into a game situation.
