he virtual world is no longer reserved for gaming, with technology advancing daily and changing the way we lead our lives. With this in mind, McDowall resident Anthony Rice and his business partner Reuben Brennan have created an innovative virtual reality learning platform. VReddo, established in 2018, is changing the way businesses and students undertake education.

VReddo co-founder and chief of sales Anthony Rice said that virtual reality (VR) was powerful in its impact and its users regularly said how "real" it felt using the technology.

"We enjoyed doing VR learning experiences as users, but wanted a platform that could not only provide access to experiences, but act as a 'campus' to bring trainers and students together to commune, connect, and grow," Anthony said.

"Learners simply put on their headset and they get teleported into their classroom. Within this classroom, they can meet and interact with their fellow learners and trainer – exactly like they can in a physical classroom. However, VReddo classrooms can also provide learners unique experiences to enrich their learning."

Anthony said that the VReddo classrooms provided a learning experience similar to face-to-face learning, with the benefit of being at any location around the world. They are finding that progressive businesses are ditching the PowerPoint presentations and immersing their staff into a realm where they can experience their lessons in a real-world scenario, rather than watching it on a screen.

"With VReddo, we can teleport them into a workplace, mine site or another planet, and they can experience and feel what it is as if they were really there," Anthony said. "VReddo classrooms can project holograms and teleport learners into locations or scenarios – think a tourism class where they're not only learning about the Eiffel Tower, but they actually visit it within class."

Anthony said VReddo merged with software company TUTIS in November 2020 to form TUTIS VReddo, and now license its software to companies to train their own courses through the VR headsets. The headsets are currently being used for formal training in certificates, diplomas, and in some companies' orientation and in-house training programs.

"Many futurists have described that education, or at least the traditional schooling variety, is rife for disruption given its set-up; and the format really hasn't changed in decades," Anthony said. "I can see a world where schools are setup as co-learning spaces – where students attend to enjoy the community – but they follow a curriculum that's been personally curated for them and their lessons are all delivered within VR, so they can access a diversity of subject matter and teachers from anywhere across the globe."

edron Wavell Snooker, one of Queensland's biggest billiards club, has been around since 1970.

However, club president Nate O'Connor said COVID restrictions last year almost closed the club for good during its 50th year.

"When we were told to close the doors for three months, we had no revenue coming in at all but still had expenses," Nate said. "We didn't have much money in the bank because we hadn't been about revenue building before."

When restrictions began to lift last year, the club's long-term president retired and a new volunteer board took over. Nate said this kick-started the club in a whole new direction.

"I've been involved in this club for about ten years all up," he said. "I'm the current president of the Queensland Billiards and Snooker Association, so I'm heavily involved in snooker and billiards in Queensland and at the Australian level. When the opportunity came up to help out my actual home club, I jumped at the opportunity.

"Now it's a younger board. We pretty much revamped the whole club. We couldn't have

done it without COVID grants from Brisbane City Council and RACQ Foundation that helped us recover some of our losses. The whole room has had a complete face-lift. We've doubled our membership numbers since October and we're just about to sign up our 200th member."

Nate said the club was very accessible and not overpriced to join.

"What sets us apart is availability, 24-hour access for our members, and we are a premium venue," he said. "We regularly re-cloth our tables and have the best equipment money can buy, including ex-professional tables. We've got a good social atmosphere too, with music on in the room and Kayo sports on the TV."

Nate said they are always on the lookout for new members, including juniors.

"It doesn't matter what age or skill level, snooker and 9-ball can be played your whole life, over multiple generations," he said. "It doesn't matter your gender, physical ability or walk of life, it's a game you can definitely enjoy."

hat if a bird could save someone's life? It may seem an unlikely scenario, but that's exactly what Manko the macaw has done, according to his owner, Wavell Heights resident Catherine.

Emerging from a traumatic life experience and with three young daughters, Catherine had become anxious and afraid to leave her home, until a friend suggested she might like a feathered companion.

"I had become like a hermit," Catherine said. "I wouldn't go out and I had so much anxiety about everything. The doctor put me on anti-depressants, and I just became a zombie; it was just terrible.

"My friend breeds macaws, and he said in America they use them as therapy pets. So he gave me a six-month-old baby [Manko] and within six months, I was off all my medication and I was back to living my life. I was a better mother again."

That was four years ago. Manko has now grown into a stunning, vividly-coloured, 1.5kg beauty, who is quite the local celebrity. He's made music videos and had TV appearances, as well as being a live model for artists in art classes. He's also picked up some photographic work at a Gold Coast holiday park in the school holidays. He adores people and is very chatty. He loves going to pick the girls up from school; Catherine's daughters call him their "brother".

Catherine wants birds to be officially allowed as therapy and companion animals in Australia, as they are in the US – an option that she said would benefit many people who are unable to have a dog or cat.


She cautions potential bird owners, however, to think long and hard about the commitment required for sharing your life with a feathered friend.


"They're a lot of work, so don't get one just because you think they're cool and awesome," she said. "It's literally like having another child. If Manko doesn't get his breakfast on time, he yells at you.

"And, they [macaws] can live until they're 150 years old.

"He's a next-generation pet – with dogs, you may have three in your lifespan, but he could last three human lifespans."

mbark on a ride back to the '90s with Taxiride's powerhouse lead singer Jason Singh. Revisit your youth with all your favourite throwbacks from the band of heartthrobs Australia fell in love with.

Australian band Taxiride hit the bigtime in 1999 with the release of their debut album, Imaginate. The overnight success of the young men had them touring all around the world and boasting nine top-40 singles. Get Set and Everywhere You Go, along with their other charting songs, are still popular on Aussie radio and playlists today and have fans singing every word to their pop rock tunes.

Lead singer and original founding member of Taxiride, Jason Singh has a career spanning 20 years, and said he was looking forward to bringing his latest acoustic tour - Jason Singh plays Taxiride: Hits, Bits and Beyond - to The Lounge at The Royal, Nundah.

Jason said he decided to do the tour because of the isolation of last year. He spent lockdown reflecting on his journey with Taxiride, his solo career, and with other artists that he had worked with. While flying solo, Jason had achieved two top-10 Aria club hits with The World As You Know It and One World alongside his two albums.

"This tour is my take on the songs I loved most from the band and is a journey through the history of how the band evolved musically," Jason said.

"The big songs will obviously be what people sing along to, but a lot of the fan favourites are the bonus tracks that were on our singles, so I'm going to go out and play them again for everyone."

Jason said that this tour would be a one-on-one experience between him and the audience. He will take the time to chat with his fans and answer questions while showcasing his powerful vocal and musical talents.

"I'm excited to be this vulnerable with people," he said. "It makes me both nervous and excited at the same time, and it's the first time I've spoken about my relationship with Taxiride.

"It's a massive difference doing a solo show than with the band. We always relied on the harmonies - that was the power of Taxiride. In

this tour, I strip that away and tell the story of the songs."

Jason will also feature some of his solo songs and personalised covers of artists that influenced himself and Taxiride over the years.

No one would ever have seen me or Taxiride's songs like this before," Jason said. "It's a throwback to the '90s - Australian bands ruled back then. Silverchair, Powderfinger, Grinspoon, Killing Heidi, Savage Garden - the list goes on.

"Music is a time machine for me," he said. "When I hear a song, I can instantly go back to when I heard it or when the song was important in my life. So, there's a few songs in the setlist that, from my point of view, had a real connection with the band and made us go down a certain road. It's not only a journey into the band but about a areat time in music."

Jason said during his 111 days of COVID lockdown in Melbourne, he spent valuable time with his family and took to the tools to build himself a 60sqm studio at home to continue creating music for years to come. He also has plans to record a new album at the end of the vear.

"It is a nice way to sum up the last 20 years for me," Jason said. "I compared COVID to being a career half-time. This tour encapsulates the first part of my journey. I still feel like I'm in the middle - so we will see what the next half brings. I still have a couple of albums in me that can have an effect on people."



Work Begins on Interchange Upgrade

A construction tender was awarded in January, and works were scheduled to commence last month, to transform the Gympie Arterial Road and Strathpine Road intersection into a diverging diamond interchange (DDI).

Member for Aspley Bart Mellish said this groundbreaking interchange design was proven to reduce congestion and would make the busy intersection more efficient and much safer.

"Diverging diamond interchanges are shaped like a diamond and consist of two key intersections at the top and bottom of the shape," Bart said. "Between these intersections, motorists actually drive on the right-hand side of the road.

"While this may sound strange, it serves to alleviate one of the key pressures on a traditional interchange – right-turning motorists crossing in front of oncoming traffic. Now these drivers can simply turn into exit lanes without interrupting traffic flow.

"Australia's first interchange of this type in Caloundra has been highly successful."

A Transport and Main Roads spokesperson said the project was set to be completed by mid-2023, weather and construction conditions permitting.

Under the Urban Congestion Fund, the Federal Government committed to jointly fund \$30 million for the upgrade with the State Government.

The Great Outdoors

Watch the best in the business from all around Australia compete in bull, saddle and bareback rides for the adults and the U16's will have junior bull rides and poddy calves.



Audiologist at the Burnie Brae Centre Paula Stanz said that her job often involved helping people sort out the misinformation around hearing aids.

"What happens is everybody hops onto the internet and they can see that they can buy this or that type of hearing aid," Paula said.

"But not every hearing aid and not every hearing loss match. There is no one-size-fits-all. It's very individual on how we set the prescription, how we explain things to people, how we get them to manage, and what we focus on for them – everybody's different.

"A lot of people come in with preconceived ideas about hearing aids. They compare them to what their parents had, which is comparing technology from 50 years ago.

"Some people think all hearing aids are the same or that they are only for much older people.

Others say that because they can hear me, they don't need a hearing aid."

Although 70 per cent of people aged over 70 experience hearing loss, Paula said that many people delayed seeking help.

"Sometimes people don't realise what they're missing and what they put up with. Because it's a chronic illness, you just compensate. You just turn the TV up louder and you just miss bits of conversation."

Paula said new research suggested a link between hearing loss and dementia.

"We always knew that there were social issues associated with hearing loss, like when people misjudge you or that you can become isolated or withdrawn," she said. "Now we know that it can have a direct effect on how our brain functions.

"They say that one of the things you can do to reduce your risk of cognitive decline and dementia is to wear hearing aids. So if the brain gets the right sounds, you can actually reduce your risk of dementia. It's phenomenal."

Lilley community organisations will have the chance to support their volunteers through the 2021 Volunteer Grants program, which is now open.

Groups in the Lilley electorate will be able to share in funding of up to \$132,450.

Expressions of interest can

be submitted for the Volunteer Grants program, which offers funding of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to eligible not-for-profit community organisations to support the efforts of volunteers.

For example, grants can be used to purchase small equipment to be used by volunteers or for the reimbursement of volunteer fuel, transport or training costs, or for promoting awareness and increasing participation in volunteering.

To be eligible, applicants must be a legal entity, a not-for-profit organisation, utilise volunteers (which make up at least 40 per cent of the organisation's staff), and have an ABN (or provide a Statement by Supplier Form).

A community consultation committee will develop a shortlist of recommendations, to be submitted to the Department of Social Services for assessment.







oosely tied to Christian tradition, our modern Easter is represented by the Easter Bunny rewarding good children with eggs to remind them of rebirth and resurrection, and bless them with fertility. But how did the hare make its way into our history books?

For German- and English-speaking nations, Easter is derived from Ostara, a pagan goddess of fertility, and for most other languages it stems from the Hebrew holiday known as Passover, or Pesach.

Way back in 1682, the Easter hare was published in a German children's book, mentioning a rabbit that brought eggs to well behaved children during the season of Eastertide or Ostara.

Traditionally, Easter commemorates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, three days after dying at the hands of the Romans at Calvary. But in today's world, the religious aspect is not always featured or acknowledged, as the commercial trend of Easter has seen a surge in confectionery, Easter eggs and the Easter Bunny, with the origins of Easter expanding to celebrations, feasting, games, and unique customs.

One widely accepted tradition is the hot cross bun. These sweet and spicy buns date back to 12th-century Monks who made and decorated them with a cross in remembrance of Jesus' death. Also known as Good Friday buns, folklore stories state Queen Elizabeth I, in the late 16th century, made it law that hot cross buns could only be made at Easter and funerals.

In addition to hot cross buns, the Easter Bunny, and eggs, the Easter Christian festival and holiday is further celebrated in various ceremonies. rituals, and cultural events around the world.

Similar to Australia, the UK and many European countries decorate eggs for Easter, and there is lots of chocolate involved. And in some European countries like Bulgaria, traditional meals such as ham and eggs, and lamb roasts with sweet bread are common.

However, in Poland, Slovakia, and the Czech Republic, Easter customs are much more startling. Spanking on Easter Monday was traditionally carried out by men, softly spanking their women with a handmade whip called a pomlázka. The willow rod whips were decorated with colourful ribbons and the ceremony ended with cold water being thrown over the women. According to folklore, legend declares that women should be spanked with a whip to keep their health, beauty, and fertility for the next year. Fortunately, this tradition is no longer very popular, and has been replaced with an all-day water fight known as Dyngus Day, or Wet Monday.

Much tamer customs are observed around the world such as the USA, with Easter egg rolling contests, and in Bermuda, colourful kites are flown on Good Friday.

Further south in Columbia, Easter or Holy Week is the largest celebration of the year, with dances, parades and home-cooked feasts. In Russia, floral wooden painted eggs have famous symbolism. Many of the eggs are exquisitely handcrafted and decorated with flowers that have bloomed to represent new life and the renewing of the spirit. In Russian folklore they are meant to bring people good luck and have become popular with collectors.

So wherever you are from and however you acknowledge Easter, enjoy the festivities - and those chocolate eggs.

Wavell Heights Local Anzac Frank McCosker Remembered

ow can any of us forget last year's Anzac Day when, for the first time in history, Australians came together with their neighbours to commemorate in our driveways. So many of us, whilst still social distancing, showed our appreciation. It was a sombre time acknowledging how grateful we were for our freedom.

With Anzac Day upon us, we again set aside time to remember those brave souls who fought and served for our country. The sacrifices, actions, and experiences of these men and women has indeed made them extraordinary.

One of these extraordinary souls was well-known Wavell Heights local Frank McCosker who, like many, lied about his age to join the army and fight for his country. Frank was born on 30 November, 1922 and was the ninth child to his parents. He grew up on a dairy farm in the Glass House Mountains. Whilst serving, Frank rose to the rank of Lieutenant in the Australian Army and recalled

in vivid detail the Battle of Milne Bay during his video interview for This Story Australia. After his service in New Guinea, Frank was discharged in 1949 and joined the Queensland Police Force, where he served a long, distinguished career of 33 years. Frank retired in 1980 as a superintendent of the Queensland Police. In his video profile, Frank recalls many fond memories of those he served with and the life they lead whilst at war.

Brisbane charity This Story Australia is on a mission to preserve the many untold stories, like Frank's, by documenting them through profiles, biographies, and digital video vignettes, preserving them for generations to come.

Frank joyfully recounted many stories for This Story Australia in 2019 at his home in Wavell Heights, and sadly passed away on 9 September, 2020.

s another Anzac Day approaches, we remember those who gave their lives for the freedoms we enjoy today.

In the years between 1914 and 1918, Australia had a population of approximately 5 million. 400,000 young, fit Aussie men and women volunteered to go to the other side of the world to fight for king and country. Of these, 61,800 died. 153,509 were wounded. So many more had mental scars that couldn't be seen or cured.

On the 25th of April each year, we honour those who made the ultimate sacrifice for us. 106 years ago, so many young Australians and New Zealanders died on a lonely beach in Turkey, now known as Anzac Cove. And so the monument at the Kedron-Wavell RSL Sub Branch has special significance in its design.

The memorial and the ceremonial space surrounding it integrates a number of traditional symbols. Although this monument is quite modern, the symbols are still relevant.

The large circle represents wholeness. Within that space are three smaller circles, representing

the different branches of Australia's armed forces - Army, Navy, Air Force.

The shortened pillars symbolise all the lives taken too soon.

At the centre is a raised three-sided triangle, commemorating those who were lost from the three branches of the defence forces. An illuminated glass prism represents regeneration and looking towards a positive future. Forms of light, including the rising sun of the army badge, came to have new significance in Australia during WW1. Though the rising sun had been adopted at Federation, after the dawn landing at Gallipoli on 25 April, 1915, it became the symbol for national birth, an essential part of our traditions.

Paving on the driveway is inspired by the rising sun on the army badge and shows a link from the memorial to the landscape surrounding it. And the walkways represent the undulations of our sea and lands, for which so many died.

So, as we commemorate Anzac Day, take the time to really look at this memorial, designed by artist Dennis Magee. Take a moment to reflect. We will remember them. Lest We Forget.



"There will be some great bands to rock on to," he said. "We have a great Creedence Clearwater Revival band and a Cold Chisel band that are very popular."



his song from the 1970s and '80s iconic hit TV show Happy Days entered my head the moment I stepped foot inside Scotty's Garage and the T-Bird Diner.

The 1950-1960s inspired museum and restaurant the Barn is nestled on three-and-a-half acres of lush Lockyer Valley farmland and it's a life-long dream come true for proud co-owner Scotty Wright.

"In 2011, just after the floods, we started to build the garage," Scotty said. "But I've been collecting since 1996.

"It all came about with buying the 1956 Thunderbird car, so when it was 40 years old, I started collecting all this," Scotty said.

On arrival at the Barn, the '56 Thunderbird is parked out front amongst a plethora of vehicle parts, vintage memorabilia, and the entry to the Garage.

This is where you will find Scotty doing museum tours while his wife Sarah runs The Barn, catering for hungry and thirsty visitors.

Once inside the Garage, it's mesmerising to walk amongst the restored cars and motorcycles of a bygone era, and notice the tribute to the days of poodle skirts and slick rockabilly pompadours, carried through to the T-Bird Diner.

With the juke box filled with tunes from Elvis to Buddy Holly, and a dance floor to ruffle skirts and jive the night away, the T-Bird Diner evokes the fun and authenticity of the era.

"I grew up in the '70s, but it's the simplicity and the innocence of the time compared to where we are now; and when things were cool, even the cars of the time were stylish, influential and individual," Scotty said.

"The '50s and '60s were all about not needing supplements to have fun. Life was the high in those days."

Scotty said investing in classic cars and memorabilia was not the driving force behind the business, and gets most satisfaction and enjoyment when elderly visitors come to the property.

"It's so precious when it comes to history, but it's not about money in relation to the importance of preservation," he said.

"We've been privileged and honoured to have a local gentleman from Gatton celebrate his 99th, 100th and 101st birthdays here with us, and we see dementia patients coming through who come alive when they walk into the shed.

"Their carers say it's incredible to listen to them talk animatedly about specific items as if they have literally stepped back in time. It's extremely rewarding."

Scotty said the tours and events grew from so many motorcycle and car clubs making daily drives to the region.

"We now have a constant influx of car and bike clubs coming through as it's a really lovely drive from Brisbane," he said.

"We are a revolving door for club events and all sorts of activities, from weddings to birthdays. Any excuse for a party."

Aside from the Barn, the Garage, and the T-Bird Diner, there is also Flagstone House available for bed and breakfast stays, and sprawling farmland perfect for boutique weddings.

Just one-and-a-half-hour's drive from Brisbane. you can easily spend a few hours here enjoying a banana split or hamburger in the Barn, a walk around the grounds, and enjoy a very informative tour with Scotty.




