More than 120 eco-experts will share their knowledge and advice when Brisbane City Council's longest running sustainability event returns to Chermside this month.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the fair was about encouraging residents to keep Brisbane clean, green, and sustainable in a fun, family-friendly environment.

"Council is inspiring residents and businesses to affect global change through local action and this fair is a great opportunity to participate in practical environmental workshops, discuss environmental issues around the home, and receive a free native plant to contribute to Brisbane's urban forest," Cr Schrinner said.

"Small, everyday decisions by households are having a big impact on our city's sustainability, and the Green Heart Fair is not only a fun day out for the whole family but a great way for residents to have their questions answered first-hand by eco experts."

With a schedule jam-packed with presentations and workshops, fair-goers will be given all the information they need to reduce their ecological footprint. From gardening and recycling tips, to minimising food waste and going solar, attendees will discover what they can do to implement positive environmental change.

Stock up on sustainable products at the artisan markets and sample locally sourced produce from a variety of food trucks. Bring a reusable cup to get a discount on your coffee, or borrow a mug from the designated Mug Library.

There will also be plenty of family activities including live entertainment and a special zone for the kids to have fun with free craft workshops, nature play activities, and giant games.

Green thumbs will want to get in early to grab one of Council's free native plants.

"Brisbane is a city that lives and breathes its dedication to a clean and green lifestyle," said Cr Schrinner. "This fair is another way we are

The Wizards is thrilled to have signed Courtney Woods, who returns after playing college basketball in USA and for the Townsville Fire. The club has also been fortunate enough to sign on Georgia McCarron and Regan McCarthy, who are both outstanding female players and will make an impact in the game.

Star player Mitch McCarron, who currently plays for Melbourne United and is a member of the Australian team, has also been signed up to play for the Wizards. Mitch originally played as a junior for Northside Wizards and then went on to play in Denver and professionally in Spain, before returning to Australia. He has been an Australian Boomer since 2019 and was selected in the squad that will represent Australia at the upcoming Olympics in Japan.

Northside Wizards board member Kate Boon said how proud she was to see so many junior players go on to playing in the state team. "We've seen many of our juniors go on to achieve greatness," she said. "Bracken Ridge local Jacob Arthur and Cameron Thew have also been selected for the team, and they were also junior players with Northside Wizards, which shows that it is possible to make your way from a junior local northside club all the way to NBL1 level.

"We are looking forward to an exciting and magical season. We have some fantastic half-time entertainment and high-paced competition to watch with our season opener on 22 May, NBL1 Competition, which due to COVID restrictions will be held at the Brendale sporting facilities."


rench enthusiasts will unite to celebrate all things 'français' at Kalinga Park this month.

Le Festival is a large-scale event which is typically held at Musgrave Park this year. Due to potential risks, Le Festival 2021 will be held in the form of 'Four Seasons' - four smaller events held at various locations throughout Brisbane.

Event Coordinator and Assistant to the Director, Sophia Slancar, said the 'Four Seasons' concept is something they have been brainstorming for a while now.

"We have anticipated for some time that the situation as it stands would pose too great a risk for us financially and logistically if we were to hold our event in its usual format. As such, the change was made to allow us to maintain the essence of our activities and our passion for French culture, but doing so in a way that adapts to the circumstances. There was an opportunity to still do something and make an event happen, albeit in a restructured way, so we took it."

This all-day event includes free-entry and will be something akin to a family gathering in a park, but on a larger scale. There will be a couple of small French food stalls as well as a small French bistro and bar. Attendees can also enjoy children's activities, a merchandise stall, a raffle and the main activity - a Pétanque competition for those aged sixteen and over with some great prizes to win.





IIIAs usual, everyone is welcome to our events, whether or not they have a French connection. We encourage everyone to visit us, and there will definitely be something for all ages," Sophia said.

"There has never been a better time than the present to help multicultural communities come together. The past year has certainly been challenging for events, and especially community events, so please come to support us. women's only event – The Feel Good Festival - will be taking place at the Uniting Church Hall, Wavell Heights this month. The afternoon will encourage self-love and workshops to inspire women to take a break from their everyday responsibilities and look after themselves.

The festival will consist of women's well-being workshops, a healthy cooking class, and a Pranayama and sound healing session. All of these workshops will be conducted by specialist practitioners, including a psychologist and health and wellness coaches.

Women's wellness mentor Kimberley Hopkins knows only too well how busy women's days can be. She is the mother to three daughters and "has felt the burnout from the struggle of the juggle as a modern-day career mum".

"I have a beautiful home studio called Stillness Urban Retreat for Women where I offer massage therapy and run a program called Return to Me," she said. "I guide a small group of women through self-care practices, including heart meditation, stretches, movement, aromatic dressing, chanting, sacred cacao, and journaling, to reconnect them to their inner being and stillness."

Kimberley said the festival was an afternoon wellbeing retreat with workshops facilitated by local, heart-centred women in business. The concept was to create a space for women to be nurtured and nourished to switch off.

"The day will be a delicious flow of meditation, essential oils, a women's emotions and mental health talk, a live cooking class – that will become our yummy snacks for the afternoon – and finishing off with yin yoga and a sound bath healing," Kimberley said.

"In my practice, I'm always telling my clients, 'you can't give from an empty cup', and it's so true; women especially need to prioritise their health and well-being and The Feel Good Festival is the perfect way to fill their cup and enhance or begin their self-care practice."

Kimberley said this was the first festival and was looking forward to many more to come.

"Women should come so they can take some well-deserved time out for themselves," she said. "Time away from the noise and chaos of modern life so they can experience relaxation and stillness and be reminded of the beautiful space that resides within themselves."

other's Day is globally celebrated by more than 40 countries after being founded by American peace activist and suffragette Anna Jarvis in 1908. It was to be a day dedicated to peace and honouring all mothers.

Her intention was to create a memorial day based on sentiment, love, and gratitude.

However, due to its nationwide and international popularity it quickly became associated with commercial profiteering. Ms Jarvis regretted this immensely and eventually protested to have the national day she created scrapped. But the profits from selling Hallmark cards, carnation flowers, and gifts became more prevalent and the worldwide phenomenon was unstoppable.

In modern times, Mother's Day is still a commercial frenzy, but is also associated around the world with medieval connections to Mother Earth, Mother Nature, goddesses, the religious connections to Mary, mother of Jesus, and International Women's Day.

The original and exclusive association of Mother's Day with a biological definition of motherhood has evolved over the years to be a more inclusive celebration.

A very noticeable difference from the early 20th century to today is the recognition of mother figures, not just biological mothers.

There is the saying, "it takes a village to raise a child," and we live in a society where children are raised by dads, aunties, uncles, cousins, grandparents, siblings and non-blood relatives including step-parents, foster mums and dads, care-givers and legal guardians.

If we are going to honour those who mother with a special day, it's important also to acknowledge the mixed emotions it can bring for many families, especially mothers who have lost children and children who have lost their mothers.

So, from Japan to Brazil, and Germany to Australia, the celebrations around the world may vary, but the ties to gratitude and love are universal. Whether you celebrate with giftgiving, flowers, cards, or special parties and meals, Mother's Day has been set as a reminder to honour all those who are caring and raising the next generations.

It's May and what a beautiful time of the year to live in Brisbane.

As many of you may know, we had to cancel this year's May Day celebrations at Lanham Park, Grange. Sadly, it was near impossible to host an event with such

a transient crowd and have appropriate contact tracing in place. I am, however, excited about a few other events happening in Marchant Ward.

I'll be hosting a Family Fun Day on 8 May, from 2pm to 5pm, with free entertainment, face painters, popcorn, fairy floss, and much more. Council will be showcasing some of the plans for stage 2 of the Bradbury Park upgrade, which will include a state-of-the-art playground, toilet block, and expanded car park.

Brisbane City Council will be again hosting the Green Heart Fair in Marchant Park on 30 May. This is a great opportunity for green thumbs to learn some tricks of the trade and to learn how we can work together to improve our sustainability practices to keep our city clean and green.

Lilley community organisations trying to keep a lid on their electricity costs can apply for a helping hand through the Powering Communities Grant Program, which is now open.

Up to 12 grants, ranging from \$5000 to \$12,000,

are available to support projects in the Lilley electorate that will improve energy efficiency and lower power bills for community organisations.

Grant funding can cover up to 100 per cent of the eligible project costs.

Traffic noise reduced for Aspley residents.

With heaps of construction happening around the Aspley Electorate, it's great to see that the noise barriers along Gympie Road at Aspley are getting underway. I've

fought hard to deliver these barriers, which will reduce overall traffic noise and have enormous benefits for our community.

Work started in late March is expected to be completed by September 2021, weather and construction conditions permitted.

Residents have raised concerns about traffic noise from Gympie Road and I am pleased their concerns have been considered in the project design. Noise monitoring was completed in the planning stage and helped to determine the current levels, where it is coming from, and the predicted levels for the next decade. Traffic speed, road surfaces, existing buildings, and future traffic volumes were all taken into consideration in the design.

The Palaszczuk Government has committed \$4 million for the new noise barriers along Gympie Road from Ellison Road to Nevin Street, Aspley, and we've also allocated \$5 million towards replacing and improving noise barriers along Gympie Arterial Road in Bald Hills, with planning underway.

consultation committee will conduct a preliminary assessment of proposals.

Nominated projects will then be invited to apply via the Powering Communities grants portal.

Are those vegetable peels, eggshells and banana skins going in the rubbish bin? There is a better answer. Local resident and keen recycler Renee Bugden said composting kitchen scraps didn't feel wasteful - like putting them in the bin did.

"Nutrients go back into the ecosystem, supporting plants and wildlife," Renee said. "Our family garden is healthy and provides food not only for us but for worms and native birds too.

"Composting is super easy to get started and soon becomes a daily habit."

Compost is miraculous stuff – it boosts the health and vitality of your plants, and even improves the flavour of your home-grown produce.

There are lots of exciting projects happening across McDowall Ward.

In Bridgeman Downs, work is progressing on the Idonia Street Crossing Project over Cabbage Tree Creek, from Idonia Street to Coolabah

Crescent Park. This three-metre-wide shared path will create an important link to the Cabbage Tree Creek bikeway, and is part of Council's ongoing program to improve access and connectivity for residents to get out and about and enjoy our great outdoor Brisbane lifestyle.

Council is also currently in the process of delivering a new playground in Dr Valentine McDowall Park, which will provide safer play equipment and can be enjoyed by children of all abilities. Fencing is also scheduled to be installed near the two playgrounds in this park, which will help improve the safety of this area for local families.






# FAMILY DESTINY IN CHILDCARE

Story **Robyn Baker** Photo supplied by **Janine Schokman**  hen Daphne Schokman married at 21 and migrated to Australia, she never thought she was setting the scene for generations to come.

Born in Ceylon in 1937, Daphne's dream growing up was to work with the poor in a medical career. After marrying, she and her husband applied under the white European heritage policy to migrate to Australia. As full-fare passengers, they embarked on the

boat trip to Australia, which Daphne said was the most horrific time of her life. "Arriving in Melbourne we had no idea of Australia's culture or climate, and encountered racism and a cold climate for the first time," she said.

After teaching herself shorthand on the boat, she very soon started work as a stenographer, even though she found the Australian accent very hard to understand.

Daphne's first child was born in 1959 and she loved being a mother, but found it lonely as she was used to a house full of children.

They purchased a corner shop – it was a steep learning curve and times were tough living at the back of the shop and working 5am to 10pm, seven days a week.

In the 60s, and for the first time ever, jobs were easy to find and they had money to buy what they wanted. After sponsoring Daphne's family to migrate, they sold the shop and moved to Queensland.

They loved Queensland with its warm weather. For a time they owned shops, but later settled on farming as Daphne wanted to spend as much time as possible with her second child, who was born in 1969.

In the 1990s, Daphne and her daughter, Janine, a qualified kindergarten teacher, decided to build and run a quality early childhood centre. Times were still difficult. especially for women to obtain a bank loan with no experience. Luckily, they found a bank with a female manager who believed in them.

Today, Daphne and her daughter Janine, and granddaughter Anais proudly run two child education centres - Bright Beginnings at Chermside West and Taigum Child Educare.

The Taigum centre is Daphne's second home, and she loves hearing the children and watching them grow, instilling her family values and her cultural values of respect for children and the importance of education.

"For all those starting their journey, I encourage you to work hard and achieve your goals," Daphne said. "In Australia, you have every opportunity at your fingertips, and I truly hope your life adventure is as wonderful as mine."





o you often tell yourself, 'That's it!
Starting next week, I'm going to be the fittest person on Earth', yet by the time next week rolls around you still haven't moved a muscle?

Regular exercise can do wonders for our health, but finding the motivation to stick with it can be challenging.

Accredited exercise physiologist Luke Rabone said that finding your emotional driver or the 'why' behind your exercise goals was key.

"Some people come in and say that they want to lose weight," Luke said. "I ask them, 'Why? Is it to be able to engage with your children or grandchildren more easily? Do you want to be able to fit into your clothes more easily? Feel more confident within yourself?' It's trying to get that emotional driver early because that can really help with motivation as we go'."

While a large part of Luke's job involves giving advice on lifestyle modifications and the amount of physical activity they should be looking to do, he also assists people in managing chronic diseases and complex medical conditions.

"I help a lot of people with things like diabetes, cardiac complications, and cancer," he said. "If someone has been diagnosed with cancer and they might be going through chemo or even after treatment, I help them with reconditioning to get them back on their feet so that they are stronger and have confidence back in their body again."

Another aspect of his job is helping people who have injuries or are experiencing joint pain.

"For joint pain, it might be chronic or it might be something that has come about recently," he said. "It's working through those challenges, trying to find out why the pain is occurring. Hopefully, people leave the appointment in less pain or in no pain, which is always really satisfying."

Luke said that seeing an exercise physiologist can also reduce pain in your hip-pocket.

"There was a study from a few years ago where they found every dollar spent on exercise physiology equals about \$10 in savings on things like medication, other appointments, and hospital visits," he said.

hile there are plenty of martial arts centres around Brisbane, not all of them are created equal.

Aspley Martial Arts Centre owner David Vernon has been practising martial arts for over 30 years. He grew up in a "rough" neighbourhood in South Africa, and said he had been drawn to combat sports because he didn't want to feel afraid anymore.

"The kids at our club, thankfully, will probably never have to experience what I did growing

up," David said. "I feel I can make a difference to their lives, offer them some guidance, give them a positive path to follow, and instill confidence in them, which is so important."

Aspley Martial Arts Centre offers a range of classes including taekwondo for adults and children, weapons classes, and Spartan Kids training. While some use very strict discipline and a lot of technical teaching, the Little Martial Arts program was designed by David and his wife Erin to be play-based and fun.

"My overriding principle was, and still is, that we should operate to serve our customers and



not our own egos," David said. "There's a bit of that in martial arts, unfortunately. It needed to be all about the students' positive experiences and progression. We should be there to serve others and not the other way around. This philosophy remains with me today, so much so that I had it embroidered on my black belt: 'to serve'."

David said the centre's main point of difference was the way students were split into their specialist classes all the way to black belt.

"We also run a comprehensive stripes system, which means we have a 100 per cent pass rate

at gradings," he said. "That's a much better system than putting people up for grading who aren't ready and then failing them on the day, in front of all their friends and family. That doesn't build confidence."

"The centre employs 12 staff, mostly adult black belts who started with me as beginner kids. We currently have around 400 members and continue to develop an awesome family culture."

# THE LEE FAMILY -GENERATIONS OF SOLDIERS

Ithough four generations of the Lee family have seen military service, only one is buried at Lutwyche Cemetery.

Sergeant-Major Henry Robert Lee, A.S.C, served with distinction in the Crimean War (1853-1856) and the Abyssinian Campaign of 1868. Regimental Sergeant Major Lee enlisted in the Medical Services Corps and joined the British Army in 1855, leaving it in 1876. With

his wife Emily and younger son, he arrived in Queensland in 1885.

Henry lived at Farrington House in Alderley, which was noted to be a superior private board and residence. Henry died at the age of 85 and was buried at Lutwyche Cemetery. However, there is no marker on his grave.

Lieutenant Colonel Harry William was born in London in 1868 and arrived in Australia with his parents in 1885. He commenced training with the Queensland Volunteers that same year. He was then 17. He was adjutant to the Wide Bay regiment and served in the Australian Military Forces when WW1 broke out.

Married in 1891, he and wife Susan had six children. Harry was made commander of the Queensland AIF 9th battalion. Harry Junior was captain of the same unit. Col. Lee landed in Gallipoli in April 1915. Unfortunately, he sustained fractures and was hospitalised, then contracted diarrhoea and was hospitalised again, this time in Malta. His military appointment was cancelled in April of 1918 and he returned home.

He was a dedicated teacher in Chermside, where he was head teacher until 1926, when he was transferred to Toowoomba. Harry would have trained cadets as part of his scholastic duties. It was only his service in the Great War that took him away from his true calling. He died in 1932 and is buried at Toowoomba.

Major HW Lee Jr., Harry's son, was killed in action on 21 March, 1917, in France. He served under his father in Gallipoli and Egypt before heading to France. In civilian life, he had been an articled clerk and was an excellent sportsman.

He left Brisbane in September, 1914, with his father's regiment. Henry, too, served with distinction.

Further generations have also served in the Australian Armed Forces. Harry's grandson Captain W. Lee was a transport officer, and his great-grandson, Corporal Clive Lee, was a cadet.

A wonderful history, and a truly loyal family.

"I'm the teacher-librarian at Northgate State School, but I'm on leave at the moment, looking after my aged mum and my aged mother-in-law.

I started teaching when I was 19 in Cairns; I was a preschool teacher in charge in a little pre-school. I've been teaching now for over 30 years.

My lovely then-boyfriend [now-husband, Wim], and I decided to travel, and we went to his home country, Holland. We ran out of money straight away and we had to work, so I got a job at an American international school as a kindy teacher, and worked there for three years. Then we travelled and cycled all over the place. We had mad cycling adventures all through Europe.


[I've always been] on Brisbane's northside. My husband's family, when they emigrated from Holland, lived on the southside, and I said 'I can't go there; no way'. He just had no choice. We're big on the outdoors, and there's fabulous cycle paths and the connection into the city is just so great and safe now. It's beautiful.

[After 30 years' as an early childhood teacher and teacher-librarian in various positions in Queensland], now, I have got into childcare, at Habitat at Nundah. I have never worked so hard in my life. It's really great, because it's back to my philosophy of teaching, which is play-based and child-centred.

I believe that critical thinking and problem solving are two of the core things children should be exposed to. We need them to read; we need them to love reading, and we don't need them behind a screen.

I don't have a car – I do all my errands on a bike. Your health is everything; I have an extraordinarily fit husband, so I have to either sink or swim with him. You've got to move it or lose it.

I think you've just got to take action sometimes in your life, and take a risk. It often might not be the safest, or the surest, steadiest path, but sometimes you have to ruffle a few feathers and move on and do what's right for you and your principles. I want my daughters [Nina, 22, and Ava, 21] in particular to do that; to live a life that they have made by choice."

onsidered one of Brisbane's top day trip destinations, the quaint country town of Dayboro is real living history.

With all 17 of the town's historical buildings in operation, this picturesque community is alive with local business, hospitality, and traditional country style.

Dayboro Historical Society president Carmel Bond said the town of yesteryear got its name from the buildings along the main street, which are still occupied by local businesses.

"Unlike other small rural towns, none of our businesses are empty, and we get a lot of people who will stand at the end of the street and just say what a lovely feel the town has," Carmel said.

Dayboro offers a little something for everyone, and attracts car and motorcycle club enthusiasts, caravanners, school trips, tourists, and city folk heading for some country R & R.


Carmel said she encouraged visitors to take time when they visit and really have a look around, where you can visit the butter factory, Dayboro Café, and Crown Hotel.

Visitors can book into a farm stay or bed and breakfast, and enjoy baked goods from the bakery which opens at 5am every day.

"I would recommend the historical town walk and heritage trails to really learn about Dayboro and its rich pioneering history," Carmel said.

Start at Dayboro Cottage, the oldest residence still on its original block for the town walk, visiting all 17 buildings that date back as far as 1867. Or explore the heritage trail, a self-guided walk that shares stories of this Moreton Bay region, following 19 markers that each have a photograph and descriptive text.

Dayboro turned 150 years old in 2017, after being discovered by John McKenzie in 1866. Referred to as Upper North Pine District, it was renamed Hamilton in 1875, when the first mail service began. It got its third name of Terrors Creek in 1892, after an arab stallion called Terah.



The name Dayboro was given to the town in 1917, after William Henry Day who leased the town land for a sugar plantation in 1867. Other names the area was known for include Fishery Pocket, and Hellhole, thanks to the scary river crossings.

With development going on in the surrounding area, the town of yesteryear remains home to many descendants of these early settlers and is also becoming more popular with younger generations and families, who like the semi-rural lifestyle.

Less than an hour's drive from Chermside, Dayboro is a growing region that has retained its rural charm. Experience Dayboro for yourself on 3-4 July at the annual Dayboro Show.




