Major developments in McDowall Ward

n the past 12 months, McDowall Ward has seen big developments. From upgrading play parks and community grants, to road repairs and wildlife awareness monitors, residents have given feedback and the office for McDowall Ward have listened.

Among the upgrades, Shand Street Park Bike Skills Loop was opened on 15 April 2022. This was part of a larger project of major refurbishments to Shand Street Park, and adjoining Grinstead Park and Corbett Street Park, which were also recently reopened. The project was targeted at children and teens who are BMX, skating and scooter enthusiasts. This was an opportunity to enhance the existing recreational features at Shand Street Park by upgrading the skate half pipe, and by installing a new skills loop track with scooter and skate features.

New stairs have been added to the Milne Hill Reserve, the final step in a series of projects which Council has invested in to upgrade the surrounding walking tracks and restore the viewing deck. The lookout provides fantastic views across the Chermside Hills Reserve and beyond, and these stairs will provide a more direct route from the car park just off Hamilton Road so that the lookout is easier to access and enjoy. The new stairs opened at the end of July.

Local parents provided feedback that they would like to access toilet facilities at Keong Park, a very popular meeting place for families. The park offers a playground, barbeques, picnic areas, a basketball court and outdoor exercise equipment. These new toilets will mean that families will be able to stay and enjoy their local park for longer and families are already enjoying this welcomed addition.

A citywide Kerbside Collection will be running again this year, with Stafford and Stafford Heights being serviced the week commencing Monday 14 November, Aspley, McDowall and Bridgeman Downs from 28 November, and Chermside West from 21 November.

HISTORY CHERMSIDE

THE HISTORY **OF THE PRINCE CHARLES** HOSPITAL

he Prince Charles Hospital opened on November 14, 1954, as a purpose-built tuberculosis sanatorium. The state government granted just 7,500 pounds for the purchase of the land and when the hospital opened its doors, it had 186 beds spread across three wards.

In 1959, the hospital added 3 more buildings including the main building, which would accommodate 412 beds, a nurse's block to house 8 medical officers, the Matron, the Deputy Matron and 152 nurses and an administration block.

Throughout the years, the hospital has undergone several name changes. Opening in 1954, the hospital was given the title of 'Brisbane Chest Hospital', because at the time it was specially equipped to care for and treat patients suffering from TB. Due to the success of the TB eradication program, the hospital was soon able to treat patients with other illnesses, so in 1961, the hospital changed its name to The Chermside Hospital. It was on



February 8 of this year that the hospital would perform its first thoracic surgery.

Just over a decade later, the hospital hosted a visit from His Royal Highness, Prince Charles, and it was decided that in honour of the visit, the hospital would be renamed to, 'The Prince Charles Hospital'.

Since opening, the hospital has had a reputation in leading the way for new and innovative medical procedures. In 1975, TPCH established the world's first viable Cryopreservation Valve Bank for paediatric and adult heart valves. In 1995, surgeons at TPCH performed Queensland's first paediatric heart transplant. 2003 saw the hospital perform Australia's first triple transplant operation and in 2009, Theatre 4 opened as a new hybrid integrated operation suite, the first of its kind in the southern hemisphere.

Today, the hospital cares for more than 420,000 patients a year and boasts having 663 beds. It employs 3,200 staff including 2,150 nurses, 635 doctors, and is known as the "leading cardiothoracic hospital in Australia". It also specialises in emergency medicine, orthopaedic and general surgery, general and geriatric medicine as well as rehabilitation and mental health services, all great achievements from its early beginnings.

isadvantaged learner drivers are being given the opportunity to complete their mandatory logbook hours with the support of a volunteer driver mentor program.

PCYC Zillmere and PCYC Sandgate are providers of the Braking the Cycle (BTC) program, where young people without access to a supervisor or registered vehicle can prepare for their provisional licence by driving with trained mentors.

BTC coordinator for PCYC Zillmere and PCYC Sandgate, Mandy Cotterill, said many young people could not afford driving lessons with an instructor, which could cost thousands of dollars.

"They are also unable to regularly access a vehicle or supervisor to help get the 100 hours needed before they can go for their open licence," Mandy said. "Therefore obtaining a driving licence for many young people was something that was impossible.

"This program enables young people to develop a core life and employment skill that supports further opportunities in the workplace, training and education environments. Young people are empowered to break the cycle of disadvantage, unemployment, and anti-social behaviour thereby reducing crime and traffic incidents."

BTC was developed in 2012 by PCYC Ipswich and

PCYC Logan in response to a study that identified 180,000 young people were unable to reach the 100 hours of certified supervised driving experience required to apply for their provisional licence.

The program gives participants the chance to drive vehicles provided by the PCYC and pairs them with mentors who offer encouragement and promote road safety.

"The program coordinator will match a mentor with a young person depending on level of skill and experience and consider if there are any mentor/ participant preferences," Mandy said.

The program has proven a great success with 48 participants engaged at PCYC Zillmere in the last 12 months, and 22 graduating.

"We have helped many young people find employment in trade positions that require a licence as well as increasing the employment opportunities for many others," Mandy said.

"We have graduates with young families who are now able to drive their children to day care, school, and doctors and hospital appointments. We have a partnership with Domino's Pizza who have helped BTC financially and provided an employment path for our participants and graduates."

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON BEAMS ROAD RAIL OVERPASS

he Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) have commenced works at Carseldine Station as part of the Beams Road Rail Level Crossing project.

The works began in June and are the next stage of the project, which involves removing the existing level crossing and constructing a new overpass.

Aspley MP Bart Mellish said locals had been keen to see the project get underway.

"I've been pushing to fix the Beams Road level crossing since 2017, but as locals know this has been an issue for a generation," Bart said.

"The removal of the level crossing in Carseldine will provide well-needed traffic relief to anyone who drives on Beams Road and has been caught at the bottleneck."

This stage of the works includes moving the station's access point to Balcara Avenue and upgrading the park 'n' ride facilities on the western side of the station.

"These works will ensure that accessibility and connectivity requirements are satisfied, minimising disruption for local residents once the construction work on the overpass commences," Bart said.

The majority of the work will take place between 7am and 5pm, from Monday to Saturday, and is expected to be completed in mid-2023.

The business case for the overpass was completed late last year and confirmed the preferred design option to remove the existing rail level crossing.

The designed detailed phase between Brisbane City Council and TMR is now underway, which will include the detailed plans for constructing the overpass over the level crossing.

The project aims to improve traffic flow on Beams Road, which experiences significant congestion at the rail level crossing, particularly during peak hours.

An overpass above the rail line will mean vehicles can continue along Beams Road without having to give way to trains, reducing congestion, increasing safety and improving travel times.

In addition to removing the rail crossing boom gates, the project also involves providing paths for walking and bike riding.

TMR is expecting to share the detailed design with the community later this year.

The Australian Government has committed \$50 million to the project, with the Queensland Government committing \$119.33 million and Brisbane City Council committing \$40 million.

elebrate the history of Australian circuses with a special carnival that promises to be the greatest show.

As part of the festivities, a Circus Carnival Cabaret will be held on Saturday, 20 August at the Woolshed Baa and Grill in Blackall. The event will include a meal, drinks and entertainment from actor and former Broadway dancer, Matt Young.

"Matt has recently made Blackall his home," Gretchen said. "He is a big-time performer who has travelled the world and he will be our MC for most of our major events."

Local streets will be decorated in a circus theme with painted animals and bunting made by community members.

"It's the first circus carnival and the start of many we believe," Gretchen said.



Your Organic Garden in August

WITH SALLY EBERHARDT

f you have limited space or aren't sure how to start growing your organic garden, a container garden may be the perfect solution. Pots, planters and even hanging baskets can grow your own delicious, healthy, organic food. And with the price of lettuce nowadays, you could save a fortune!

Container gardens are no-dig, use little water and are easy to shift to find the right position. All you need is a large pot, some organic potting mix and your seeds or seedlings.

Plant seeds or seedlings according to directions on the packet or punnet. Potting mix provides ideal

conditions for seed germination so spread seeds out. Don't plant seedlings too close together – think about how big each plant will grow and leave space to reach its potential. Tomatoes only need one strong plant per pot, beans and peas only two to three plants per pot.

Mulch seedlings immediately but let seeds sprout first. Fertilize your plants every 1-2 weeks with organic liquid fertilizer. Mix fertiliser and water in a watering can and drench foliage as well as the soil.

What to plant now - strawberries (from runners), tomatoes, capsicums, beans, pumpkin, cucumber, zucchinis, lettuce, eggplant, okra, rosella, cabbage, silverbeet, corn.

'SO DAMN EASY GOING'

s if being a teenager wasn't hard enough, 18-year-old Joanna is dealing with the loss of her mother, being broke and trying to find herself. Sounds pretty bleak right, and at times it is, but there's plenty of joyful and comedic moments to lift the otherwise sombre tone.

What sets this adaptation of the critically acclaimed novel by Swedish author Jenny Jägerfeld apart from other coming of age stories is that Joanna suffers from ADHD. It doesn't just throw this angle in for the sake of it, it offers a real insightful look into how people often struggle with a condition that so many of us still

don't understand. What heightens the situation is that she's forced to take extreme measures to secure her medication when her pills run out and can't afford her next dose.

This is Director Christoffer Sandler's first feature film having only worked in TV, but he's created a visually interesting movie that offers a unique look at Gothenburg, Sweden. Using interesting camera work and innovative lighting techniques. Such as manifesting the lead character's ADHD in the form of flashing fairy lights, subtly at first but then becoming more prominent as her condition worsens through lack of medication.

The performances are solid, with the lead actresses Nikki Hanseblad and Melina Benett Paukkonen delivering a convincing and interesting relationship. Their burgeoning and often tumultuous affair is a bitter sweet reminder of just how hard growing up can be. Hansebald as Joanna does take the lion's share of the screentime with a believable portrayal of the escalating complexities of her character's struggles, whether they're social, sexual or medical.

Although I may not be able to relate to being a teenage girl and the trials faced by the characters there's still plenty here to enjoy. So


