A BEST MATE FOR MARGARET

how your 'sup-paw-t' for a three-year-old girl who needs your help.

The Lions Club of Brisbane Inner North are hosting a trivia night at Club Chermside this month to help Margaret raise \$20,000 for a Smart Pup assistance dog.

Fiona Hall said her daughter, Margaret was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder at 20 months old and Hypermobility Ehlers Danlos Syndrome (hEDS), a rare connective tissue disorder, just after her third birthday.

"Despite Margaret's struggles, she never lets them get the better of her," Fiona said. "And this is where a Smart Pups assistance dog would greatly benefit Margaret.

"A Smart Pup can act as a bridge between the child and the outside world, guiding the child through their daily routines, keeping them safe and comforting the child when the world becomes too much for them."

The family applied for a Smart Pup after a chance meeting with Ember 'The Crisis Response Dog' who comforted Margaret on a family holiday.

"It was like she went into work mode and knew that Margaret needed some assistance," Fiona

said. "She broke into her world and they sat nicely together and cuddled.

"Until this moment, we had never even known that assistance dogs for children like ours were even a thing but here we were seeing how one of these dogs could calm our child when we couldn't."

Smart Pups is a notfor-profit organisation

based on the Sunshine Coast that provides assistance dogs to children with special needs. They receive no government funding and rely on donations.

"The approximate training cost for an assistance dog/Smart Pup is \$30,000," Fiona said. "Families are required to contribute \$20,000, which is why we are fundraising.

"We are currently sitting at around \$6k in the pot so would love to run up to \$10k but anything raised is something raised and we are extremely appreciative and grateful for any and all donations made."

Fiona thanked Brisbane Inner North Lions president Debbie Williams for organising a fundraiser for Margaret.

"The trivia night was all their idea and it looks set to be a great night," she said.

The event will feature quizmaster Andrew McMicking and include a multi-draw raffle, lucky door prize and heads and tails. Dinner, drinks and snacks will be available from 6pm.

A PASSAGE IN TIME A TIME TO REMEMBER

nsuring that the history of Infant Welfare and Child Health Services are not lost with the passage of time is the purpose of a new book which is set to be launched this October.

A Passage in Time - A Time to Remember details the invaluable services provided to mothers and babies in Queensland over a period of 73 years.

According to Janet Henry, author of the book, retired Child Health nurse and chairperson of the Child Health History (QLD) Inc. Committee information for the publication was drawn from a variety of sources, including annual reports from the Queensland State Archive.

"The Committee wanted to include examples of the 'human side' or information from practicing or retired Child Health nurses as a great deal of our history had already been lost," Ms Henry said.

She said nurses endured all sorts of obstacles in their efforts to provide a service to mothers and babies in the most remote areas of Queensland.

According to Ms Henry, they travelled mostly by goods trains, which were dusty and dirty and

departed at any time of the day or night, and this was just one example of their many struggles.

A Time to Remember

"One of the comments tells of how nurses in the northern and western areas of Queensland slept between damp sheets during the summer months to keep themselves cool at night," she said.

As the author, Ms Henry said that her writing process brought back many memories of her own time working with the Service.

"I was able to draw on my experience, as well as information provided in informal discussions to expand and illustrate my research," she said."

She said funding for the set-up and publishing costs came via a Kedron/Wavell Community Grant, a donation from the Queensland Nurses' and Midwives Union and the remainder from nurses, their family and friends.

"It is due to their contribution and support that this rich record of the Infant Welfare and Child Health Service in Queensland has been recorded and published."

oeliacs, gluten intolerant people and those who prefer gluten free food will be able to eat whatever they want at a new market where vendors will be selling 100% gluten free goodies.

The Gluten Free Markets is a free, two-day event being held at VEND Marketplace in Virginia this month.

Bel, the Gluten Free Markets Coordinator, said people with special dietary needs were often left out of enjoyable experiences like eating an ice cream at a market or having a burger from a food truck.

"I realised there is a massive gluten free community in Brisbane that is being underserved with food options at markets," Bel said. "I love markets and food truck festivals, yet as a coeliac I am always limited in what I can eat with many stallholders not aware of how to prepare food in a coeliac-safe way, which is often disappointing.

"I figured if I was wishing for safety, choice and variety, that others on a gluten free diet would be in the same boat, and I wanted to give them the opportunity to go to a market and be able to choose from anything and everything, just like other non-restricted people can do."

Stallholders will be serving sweet and savoury options, including buy-it-now and take home treats. Market-goers will be spoilt for choice with delicious burgers and Asian street eats, as well as donuts, pizzas, churros, dumplings and more. "All stallholders have agreed to provide a 100% gluten free menu on the day of the market," Bel said. "There will also be options for people with additional dietary requirements, such as dairy free options, egg free options and vegan options."

Ticket-holders will go into the running to win one of eight prizes from local businesses including gift vouchers for cafes and hampers with pasta, brownies and other goodies.

There will be four sessions held over the weekend, consisting of a morning and afternoon session on each day.

"It's important that people's experience at the market is an enjoyable one, so to curb food wait times and overcrowding, we will have a ticket system for attendance," Bel said.

"I believe the weekend will be well-attended and a great success."

THE BRISBANE TRAMWAY NETWORK

HISTORY CHERMSIDE

he Brisbane tramway network serviced the city of Brisbane between 1885 and 1969. The trams that were built before 1938 had an open-air design, proving very popular by the community on hot Queensland nights. The trams were mainly used for the public to commute however, were regularly charted by social groups for fundraisers.

Most of the trams running in Brisbane operated with both a driver and a conductor, whose job it was to collect tram fares. This is with the exception of a few short tram lines where passengers would simply drop their tickets into a ticket box at the start of their trip.

The tram line that connected Chermside to wider Brisbane, was route 72. This through route connected Chermside to Enoggera and return. This line was the northernmost point of the tram line and proved to be popular with the Chermside community as it would connect them to the city and beyond.

Route 72 ran down Gympie Road, Lutwyche Road, and Bowen Bridge Road where it would continue on through the city. It would then cross the Fiveways onto Kelvin Grove Road,





before continuing on Samford Road out to Enoggera to the terminus.

The tram service was popular throughout the duration of service however 1944 and 1945 saw a spike, reaching almost 160 million passengers per annum. While there could have been several factors for this, the most likely reason was due to petrol rationing.

Post-war transportation saw the steady increase in the use of buses and motorcars. The popularity of these new ways to travel saw a decline in the number of people using the trams, decreasing to 110 million passengers in 1950, and a further 80 million by 1960. After 72 years of servicing the people of Brisbane, the decision to cease tram use came in 1969, when the annual number of passengers dropped to 46 million passengers per year.

Chermside apartment building has seen residents forging new friendships, planning regular social events and even getting married!

Estilo on the Park, located on Kittyhawk Drive, has become a hive of activity for its inhabitants, including several senior community members.

Ed, 73, is one of the residents organising and taking part in social activities, many of which take place on the building's rooftop terrace.

"On the last Friday of every month, you bring a plate of food and your preferred drink and go up to the rooftop," Ed said. "Whatever food you bring is now communal and you spend the night talking.

"Sunday night if you are hanging around, go up to the roof at 4:30pm with a glass of wine and you will always find someone to talk to."

Other events include monthly lunches at Westfield Chermside, morning teas, a book club, aqua aerobics, a library, and bus trips to places like the Hunter Valley.

"Two of the residents here met because they were living next door to each other and both participated in social events," Ed said. "They had a wedding ceremony and reception on the rooftop. The bridesmaid was another of the residents.

"Last year, four couples who were all married 50 years ago within a three month span had a 200

year wedding anniversary and a party with a big cake."

Ed, who has been living in the building since 2017, said the regular social group consisted of more than 70 people.

"I didn't expect the level of social interaction here," he said. "It's really quite phenomenal.

"When you go down and check your mail here, it takes between 20 and 40 minutes by the time you talk to everybody. It's just that kind of place."

Marchant Ward Councillor Fiona Hammond said it warmed her heart to see the community spirit bringing people together.

"With so many people feeling lonely today, this amazing group of residents show that just by taking each other's hand and leading them with kindness, an open heart and with a sense of adventure, together we can achieve a strong and supportive community," Fiona said.

Brisbane City Council encourages local seniors who want to keep fit and meet new people to take part in their GOLD (Growing Older and Living Dangerously) program, which includes everything from Tai Chi and orienteering to paint and chat sessions and making clay jewellery.






