# GROWL THEATRE CONTINUES TO ROAR

rowl Theatre may still be a relatively small local company but they're set to kick off their 2023 season with a roar.

Their next show, A Comedy of Tenors by Ken Ludwig, is billed as a fast-paced, over-the-top farce – full of mistaken identities, blissful romance and madcap delight.

Rhiannon Said, President of Growl Theatre, said the aim at Growl Theatre has always been to deliver quality live entertainment that doesn't break the bank.

"Since 2020, we have really found our stride with the local community and our growing audience. I think people now realise the importance of community run entertainment and supporting local businesses and organisations," Rhiannon said.

Rhiannon said that the theatre company consistently draws large crowds and that a lot of effort is invested into each production to make it a genuine spectacle and sensory experience.

"Considering our theatre is merely a community hall (with a small stage and without all the backstage space a professional theatre has) it's always a fun challenge to build sets that will wow audiences when they walk in," Rhiannon said.

According to Rhiannon, the theatre has come a long way since its humble beginnings performed at the Wilston Presbyterian Church.

"The stage was tiny and there were no dressing rooms (we all piled into the kitchen behind the stage). We only had limited refreshments for our audiences, but it was a hit and we just kept going," she said.

In 2013, Growl Theatre relocated to the Windsor School of Arts hall on Lutwyche Road where they have held many different and exciting productions since.

"Our humble stage has been transformed into everything from a drawing room in a Victorian home, a swinging 60's French apartment with five slamming doors, an elegant old-South verandah, Pemberley Manor (both upstairs and the servants quarters), and once we even had the challenge of building a second storey loft bedroom," Rhiannon said.

he Salvation Army Drive for Life program teaches more than just simply driving instructions. Drive for Life is about life mentoring, positive role models and the support to overcome life challenges and help move towards a safer future.

This program assists young people aged between 16 and 25 who are disadvantaged and require some extra help reaching their 100 hours of driving required to receive a license.

Drive for Life Program Coordinator Justin Maher said this important program exists because of the volunteers that believe a license provides access to employment, education, and health appointments.

"This is as much about engaging both young people and mentors in their community as it is about licensing; we know that feeling part of a community assists with building a sense of belonging, improved mental health, developing pro-social behaviours and connecting to a shared social responsibility," he said.

"We want to facilitate a mission which can benefit other members of the community, for example, taking the elderly to a doctor's appointment." Justin Maher said the requirement to reach 100 hours of driving practice before being able to receive a license has positively decreased the number of road fatalities but has created further barriers for young people who do not have the means to a vehicle or adult supervision.

"Our Volunteers are ordinary folks who make an extraordinary difference in the lives of our young people. We have gathered many success stories all of which we can attribute to the goodwill and dedication of our driving mentors."

Drive for Life is searching for more volunteers to help maintain its success and ensure many young people are able to access the privilege of driving.

This community engagement program is calling for people who can not only help with driving but who can run events and assist in raising money for Drive for Life.

Drive for Life is a part of the Salvation Army's Youthlink program that provides a variety of services for disadvantaged youth who are at risk due to homelessness, drug and alcohol problems, social isolation, mental illness and family trauma.

hile the school year officially kicks off for 2023, students at Jabiru Community College are preparing for another big year of doing it differently.

Based in Zillmere, the community college is an independent and non-government school, which provides a flexible, personalised education for young people in years 10, 11 and 12.

The college was established in 2011 after the Jabiru Community Youth & Children's Services Association Inc., saw a need to support the educational development of young people who were at risk of falling through the cracks of mainstream education. Through engaging with various communities of northeast Brisbane, it provides a safe community where diversity is respected and appreciated.

Co-principle of Jabiru Community College, Frances Missen, said that learning happens when young people are allowed to realise their individual talents and interests.

"Our learning is driven by curiosity, expanded through reflection, and maintained through perseverance," Frances said. "We believe that powerful, transferable learning happens, when learners are enabled to explore their passions and interests with others and develop their personal agency.

"Our focus is on inviting young people to learn and explore things they care about. It's about their personal interests and their personal journeys."

The college is small by design. Made up of no more than 90 students, it strives to foster the principles of Respect, Relationships, Responsibilities, Rights and Reflection. Their mission is to create a safe and creative learning community where young people from diverse backgrounds can take up their human right to a 21st Century education.

"The young people who attend our college are vibrant, creative and beautiful people. Many have had multiple barriers placed in their path." Frances said. "They radiate determination and courage as they navigate their lives and work toward their goals.

Frances said that the community can support the college by offering students time spent in their workplace or business to learn and develop lifelong skills.

"People can support Jabiru Community College by offering opportunities for the young people to visit and learn about local business and community organisations. This could be anything from one off visits, through to work experience."



#### **Brookhill Private Hospital**

rookhill Private Hospital served the people of Wavell Heights from 1928 to 1953. The building, which was constructed around 1919, served as the private residence for Joseph and Daisy Cressey, who acquired the land from the Gleadhill family on 26 September 1917. When Joseph died in 1928, Daisy became the sole owner of the building.

After World War One, West Nundah and surrounding districts experienced a steady population growth prompted by returning soldiers moving into the new estates. At the time, the nearest private hospital to West Nundah was the Virginia Private Hospital. After the surge in population, Daisy, who was a trained midwife and nurse, decided to convert the residence into a private hospital.

To help pay for the conversion of her home to a hospital, Daisy sold off a portion of her land to John Francis Nolan and quickly named the private hospital, "Brookhill". Once up and running, the hospital served an area that extended to Chermside, Boondall, Zillmere, Geebung and Aspley. While most reports have the hospital operating from 1928 to 1953, there are reports of births at the hospital as early as

Prior to World War II, local private hospitals such as Brookhill formed a major part of the healthcare industry in Brisbane, as they offset the patient load of the two existing public hospitals - Royal Brisbane Hospital and the Princess Alexandra Hospital. These private hospitals were generally run by the nurses who lived at the hospital and the attending physician, who was usually the local general practitioner, would admit the patients and attend the hospital for daily rounds.

While there are many reports of births at Brookhill Hospital, being a rural hospital at the time meant farm accidents and childhood illnesses would also have brought in many patients.

By 1950, the hospital had become a two-building complex, with the buildings connected by a separate corridor with its own external stairs. Daisy managed the hospital until her death on 15 October 1951.

The hospital continued to operate after her death, when it was leased to E. Trumble on 11 September 1953. Trumble would later apply to the Brisbane City Council to have the hospital converted into a convalescent home. Over a decade later in 1966, it was re-converted for use as a private residence.

Lead vocalist and musical director, Sam McCaughey said audiences could expect to hear toe-tapping country music supported by a full, nine-piece band.

"theBlueShamrocks draws on a vast range of experience from nine musicians and a creative production team," Sam said. "We have crafted our stage performance to provide an evening of entertainment reminiscent of the country music show-band era. Every tune musically has something to offer, which will keep the audience entertained."

Joining Sam in the band are Geoff Schuh on drums, bass guitarist John Sargent, guitarist Steve Henderson, lead and rhythm guitarist Jeremy Dwyer, Quiana Morgan on the fiddle, pianist Don Petterson, vocalist Lani Wagner and for the first time - accordion player, Fredy.

Sam said the band formed three months before COVID hit Australia and experienced several cancellations during lockdown, so were looking forward to this month's performance.

"This will be the first time at Kedron-Wavell," Sam said. "Some of our members have performed here previously and have enjoyed the community spirit and appreciation for live music. We are looking forward to the full-size stage, the first-class sound system, plus the excellent dance floor.



# Local Centre forming lifelong friendships

f Covid taught us anything, it's that social connections are vital to our health and well-being.

Come down to the Banyo Bowls Club on Saturday 18 February to rally around this community icon and help support their goal to remain open while maintaining their beautiful grounds.



Celebrations at the Tamil Thai Pongal festival

#### FESTIVAL BRINGS THE COMMUNITY TOGETHER

he local community gathered together last month to celebrate Tamil Thai Pongal.

The All Saints' Anglican Church in Chermside invited everyone in the area to join them in observing the important harvest festival on 14 January.

Parish priest, Father Daniel Jayaraj said it was the first time he had brought the Chermside community together to celebrate the festival.

"In other parts of Brisbane, this celebration has been going on for a long time," Fr Daniel said.

The annual festival is observed on the first day of the tenth month of the Tamil calendar, which usually falls on 14 January.

"In Tamil-speaking places, it is a thanksgiving for farmers, earth, sun, water, fire and animals

involved in agriculture," Fr Daniel said. "And also it is the beginning of the Tamil New Year in some places.

"Pongal is not a religious festival, it is an identification for all Tamil people, whether they are Hindus, Muslims, Christians or any other religious group, but we are united as Tamilians.

"We have many Tamilians living in Australia. Wherever we are, we should not forget our origins and also we should thank Australia for all the support we get here – a country that accepts us as we are, and be as

we are."

The local celebration was attended by Australians and Tamilians from India, Sri Lanka and Singapore.

Attendees enjoyed cooking Pongal, a sweet rice dish with cashews, sultanas, spices and ghee. They were also given a traditional Tamil breakfast of idly (rice cake), sambar, which is cooked with lentils and vegetables, Pongal and vadai (lentil and vegetable cutlets).

Traditional Tamil musicians played the parai, a Tamil drum.

Fr Daniel said the festival usually takes place over four days, with different rituals for each day.

"On the first day, they will burn or throw all unwanted things in the house and clean the house for a new year and new blessings to enter in." he said.

"The second day, they celebrate Pongal with families, friends and relatives. The third day, they celebrate all things and animals, which help them in farming. The fourth day is the day to celebrate with communities with traditional games."

#### **Organic Gardening** in February

ummer typically brings many storms and heavy rain that can leave your garden oggy and over-watered. Plants may be nutrient-stressed or overgrown, and in need of immediate attention.

To replenish your garden, apply natural fertilisers like animal poop, seaweed, or green manure crops to areas where you can dig them into the soil. For ornamentals and pot plants, use liquid natural fertilisers like compost tea, worm castings liquid or good commercial fertilisers. Also look at re-potting those plants that are outgrowing their current containers.

Many plants grow rapidly over summer and may be straggly and overgrown. Most plants respond well to being pruned and will regrow stronger and healthier. Do some research as some plants like a heavy prune while others thrive on a lighter touch. Add the cuttings to your compost.

February is still hot and humid so don't work too hard in the garden until conditions are kinder for both humans and plants. Nurturing your plants is most important this month.

This is an ideal time to order heirloom seeds or unusual varieties from specialist seed vendors, ready to plant them in autumn.

What to plant now - tomatoes, capsicum, eggplant, sweetcorn, beans, cucumber, zucchini, broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower.

Nuoc Cham Dipping Sauce

f you are a lover of Asian recipes and flavours, then you would be no stranger to this sauce. However if you are new to it, this is your answer to most Asian salads you will cook and eat in your kitchen.

It's sweet and fresh, and the delicate flavours will have you wondering why you have never tried it before.

Yes, you can buy this sauce at the supermarket, but I promise you, the flavour

you get from making your own will far outweigh the extra effort of making it from scratch. The great thing about this dressing is how versatile it is.

You can use it in Vietnamese salads, as a dipping sauce for spring rolls and dumplings, and of course you can drizzle it in rice paper rolls.

I have even seen it used as a marinade, and it goes beautifully with white fleshed fish.



#### Nuoc Cham Dipping Sauce

#### **INGREDIENTS**

6 tbsp water 2 tbsp raw sugar 1.5 tbsp freshly squeezed lemon (or lime) juice 2 tbsp fish sauce 1/2 clove minced garlic 1 long chilli deseeded ½ small carrot grated A few drops of sesame oil (optional)

This recipe can be tailored to your taste buds. Some people don't like a strong fish sauce taste, so just add a little at a time. Taste as you go to learn the flavours you like.

Start by mixing the water and sugar until the sugar dissolves. Depending on what sugar you have used (you can use caster, raw or palm sugar), you may need to heat the water a little so the sugar granules dissolve. Then add the lemon or lime juice. This is where the freshness and zing come from so I suggest putting all of it in, but you could add it a little at a time and keep tasting.

Then add the garlic, chilli, grated carrot and if you are using it, add the sesame oil. This isn't traditional, but it gives it a beautiful savoury flavour. Mix everything together and serve!

"Cricket Australia brought the NCIC to life to create a pathway for players to compete at a national level, to test their skills, and to put their best foot forward for selection in national teams. The 2017 NCIC was the first time in Australian sport these three divisions were played as part of one competition."

The event has been held annually since 2017 until Covid forced the cancellation of the 2021 and 2022 championships.

This year marks the first occasion the NCIC have been held outside Victoria, with Aspley selected as the location for the event.

"Marchant Park was chosen due to the large number of turf grounds at the same venue, meaning the event will have a real, exciting atmosphere and teams can easily attend other matches from their division or other divisions." Jess said.

"Queensland Cricket have also been fantastic and eager to support hosting this event for the last few years."

All three divisions will play T20s from Sunday, 5 February to Thursday, 9 February before the placing and grand finals on Friday, 10 February.

"There are plenty of big trees for shade, so bring a deck chair or a picnic rug and watch the country's best cricketers with a disability compete for national titles," Jess said.

- Ensure hot water system is on off-peak tariff and temperature is checked;
- Limit time of showers to reduce hot water usage;




