hermside may have been a small community in World War II but that didn't mean it wasn't a bustling town.

With a population of about 3000 people, the area consisted of farms, bushland, houses, a school (with its own air raid trench), churches, grocery stores and a theatre, but no public hospital, with the closest doctor at Lutwyche.

In History of Chermside and District by Patrick O'Shea, Chermside and Districts Historical Society (CDHS) archivist, Beverley Isdale writes: "Young men and women from the area enlisted in the armed services and the progress of the war was closely monitored by the locals while the presence of the military camp highlighted the serious aspects of the war, and its proximity."

Camp Chermside was located in Sparkes' 400-acre paddock, where soldiers camped six to a tent on a timber floor, using shoes for pillows. The Australian Women's Army Service (AWAS) also had a camp in Chermside, with many working in secret as code-breakers for the Central Bureau in Ascot.

One memorable but tragic tale from the time involved a fatal aircraft accident.

The History of Chermside by D.R. Teague reports that a Kittyhawk plane on a training flight crashed at Camp Chermside in 1944 (near to where Kedron-Wavell is now located), killing the pilot.

While Kittyhawk Drive was later named to commemorate the accident, investigations undertaken by the CDHS indicate the plane was likely not a Kittyhawk. Ron Alvisio, who was 16 at the time, provided an eyewitness account, recounting that the plane with the backfiring motor he saw fly overhead and clip the camp's amenities block before it crashed was a P47 Thunderbolt. Another eyewitness believed it was a P43 Republic Lancer.

The CDHS established the pilot was 2nd Lieutenant Sol S. Scherr, 5th Air Force of the United States Army Air Force. He was a member of the 317th Depot Repair Squadron, which was stationed at Eagle Farm in 1943.

In 2009, the CDHS and the Kedron-Wavell Sub Branch installed a remembrance plaque for 2nd Lieutenant Sol S. Scherr in the Chermside Historical Precinct to commemorate his sacrifice in his defence of Australia.

There is little evidence left of Camp Chermside, now 7th Brigade Park, but as Beverley states, it is a place to enjoy and "remember the young men who passed this way in the early 1940s."

NEW LEASE OF LIFE FOR ZILLMERE COMMUNITY HALL

onstruction has begun at Zillmere Community Hall in a bid to restore and revitalise the historic building.

Brisbane City Council announced last month that refurbishments were underway at the hall, which will see improved facilities for community groups, as well as commercial and private hirers.

Bracken Ridge Councillor Sandy Landers said the works would take approximately four months to complete.

"These are extensive works to ensure this beautiful piece of history continues to provide a place where communities come together for many, many more years," Cr Landers said.

"Now that the memorabilia is safely stored away, work can get underway to begin the improvements, while promoting the building's history by keeping the wooden floors, old-style windows and stage.

"The kitchen, hall space and electrical and audio-visual equipment will all get an upgrade while outside external fencing will be replaced and upgraded to be DDA (Disability Discrimination Act) compliant."

Zillmere Community Hall, located at 52 Murphy Road, was originally a bible college

in the 1960s. The building was mortgaged to four people who were members of the Zillmere and District Senior Citizens Club in 1981, before the club gifted the land to Council in 2013.

These days, the members of the Senior Citizens Club are regular occupants of the hall and are looking forward to reaping the benefits of the upgrade.

7illmere and District Senior Citizens Club

treasurer, Jennifer Jacobs said the group's long history with the hall would be safeguarded and celebrated as part of Council's renovations.

"Council understands the importance of the club's memorabilia not only to us, but to future generations," Jennifer said.

"We chose a number of items that will be displayed in the hall, once the refurbishment is complete, including small honour boards and framed certificates. We're excited to see these pieces of history inside the upgraded and improved hall."





The History of Hamilton Road

amilton Road in Chermside is named after one of the suburb's earliest settlers who significantly contributed to the development of the area.

In 1866, Andrew Hamilton and his family immigrated from London to Brisbane. To support his family, Hamilton initially tried farming, however in order to increase his income, he returned to his former job as a tradesman. Eventually he was able to purchase 20 acres of land at Downfall Creek, later known as Chermside.

A local school teacher worked to change the name from Downfall Creek, to Chermside, in honour of the then Governor of Queensland, Sir Herbert Chermside.

Chermside, like many Gympie Road suburbs, experienced an initial boom during the Gold Rush, which increased traffic on that road, however after the 1867 Gold Rush, this area really took off.

To make it easier for farmers to travel to markets to sell their harvests, Hamilton began

to build drays for them to use as their mode of transportation. As his company expanded, he added services like blacksmithing.

Young Thomas Hamilton was just six when his family came to Australia and began a diary in 1890. He continued writing diaries for the next 60 years. The journals paint a beautiful picture of his family and life in a developing neighbourhood. They also show how outside factors like World Wars 1 and 2, the Spanish Flu, the Great Depression, and chain migration affected society.

The majority of the Hamilton family members kept their own journals that chronicled their daily lives. Along with anecdotes about his daily life, Andrew's diary mostly spoke of the successful family business.

After his father passed away, Thomas carried on the business. The Hamilton's assisted in establishing a Methodist Sunday school in 1873 and were also members of the United Methodist Free Church.

After Thomas's death, his son, Hue, continued in the business, opening H F M Hamilton Motor Body Works. Hue sold the business in 1951, thus cutting the family ties. The shop is still operating today and goes by the same name.



Students bound for Europe to Commemorate War History

ocal high school students will visit Europe's WWI battlefields as part of this year's Premier's ANZAC Prize.

Eight students and two teacher chaperones will embark on a 16-day educational tour of Australia's war memorial sites this month, accompanied by the Assistant Minister to the Premier for Veterans' Affairs, Bart Mellish.

Mr Mellish said it was a fantastic opportunity for students and teachers to see, hear and learn all about the ANZAC tradition, heroics and spirit.

"As a passionate advocate for veterans, I look forward to taking part in this trip and meeting with the organisations that are preserving the ANZAC legacy," Mr Mellish said.

"This cohort will form Queensland's next ambassadors for the ANZAC legacy – coming away with a richer understanding and appreciation of what took place, and what it means to be an ANZAC."

The students will visit the Churchill War Rooms in London before heading to France to see the Hall of Mirrors in the Palace of Versailles where the Versailles Treaty was signed, and the battlefield in Fromelles where 5,533 Australian soldiers lost their lives in one night.

LUCIA RETURNS TO THE SPORT SHE LOVES

ucia Liessi joined the Aspley Hornets U15 girls' team in 2017, but a serious knee injury last year left her wondering if she would play Aussie Rules footy again.

After four operations and 16 months out of the game, Lucia will return to the Hornets' state league women's team this month.

Lucia had a meniscus repair in 2016 and booked an MRI last year after noticing her knee was swollen. She knew it was bad news when the doctor called with results the same day.

"He essentially told me I ripped my meniscus off the bone and my knee was bone on bone," Lucia said. "As a result, if I didn't get surgery I would be requiring a knee replacement due to severe arthritis by the time I turned 25."

Lucia needed a high tibial osteotomy and meniscus transplant, but the doctor was unable to source a replacement meniscus. He advised Lucia the surgery would go ahead anyway, meaning she would no longer be able to play sport.

"I couldn't stop thinking 'why me' and 'why did I deserve this'," she said. "On the other hand, I suppose this ignited a spark in me to be more determined than ever to go out there and come back better than I ever have."

Thankfully, a new meniscus was found three days before Lucia's surgery in August. She described her rehab journey as a "mental battle", which she wouldn't have gotten through without her physio. She attended gym sessions five days a week and volunteered at the Hornets every weekend.

Now Lucia is ready to return to the field with the 2023 QAFLW squad.

"I'm beyond excited to be back playing at the nest, but with that of course I'm flooded with nerves," she said. "I love footy and everything that comes with it and I'm just so excited to see my hard work pay off and socialise with the girls again, doing what I love."

Lucia's recovery journey has been captured by sports photographer Michael Lovell, as part of a Facebook group project run by the AFL's photography team.

"Being away from the game you love for more than a year is tough," Michael said. "So I wanted to capture the things that helped her through it and the hard work she put in to get her body ready to play again, with the final images of her on the field in action."

COUNCIL PROPOSAL FOR NORTH WEST TRANSPORT **CORRIDOR DERAILED**

risbane City Council's proposed underground transport solution along the North West Transport Corridor has been rejected by the federal infrastructure authority.

Last month, Council announced that Infrastructure Australia had rejected the findings of its north west transport network (NWTN) program business case, which proposed an underground rail and road option to help alleviate traffic congestion in Brisbane's north.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the former federal government had asked Council three years ago to do planning work "to progress options for transport improvements in the north-western suburbs of Brisbane".

"We know that as our population grows, including the areas surrounding Brisbane City Council, that transport solutions are urgently needed for this part of Brisbane," Cr Schrinner said.

He said the council engaged experts and consultants to do traffic planning and environmental reports. Community consultation was also undertaken before putting forward a report on the findings to Infrastructure Australia last August.

"The feedback from the community was crystal clear," Cr Schrinner said. "They want better transport options for this part of Brisbane but they know it has to go underground. The alternative is bulldozing bushland to build rail corridors."

The North West Transport Corridor, also known as the Trouts Road Corridor, extends from

Gympie Road in Carseldine to Shand Street in Alderley.

The area is a combination of open space and bushland, which has been preserved by the state government since the 1980s but has since had homes built alongside it.

Council's business case found that the area, including the Chermside Hills Reserve, contained threatened plant species and important habitat for threatened and vulnerable fauna.

Enoggera Ward Councillor and the council's infrastructure committee chair. Andrew Wines said council's environmental research and community consultation determined that "underground was the only way to go".

"The surface options provide too much damage to what are really important and sensitive environmental corridors," Cr Wines said.

Council's study was reportedly rejected by Infrastructure Australia because the proposal did not have state government support and because an above-ground option was not considered. At the time of going to print, Infrastructure Australia had not released a formal comment on the status of the project.

Queensland Transport and Mains Road Minister Mark Bailey stated last month on Twitter that there was no proposal or plan to bulldoze bushland or resume homes.


