

woman of many talents, Nadeen is probably best known for her basketball career, but she has recently set her sights on making a difference by publishing a children's book that celebrates curly hair.

Released last year, 'Kenzie and Her Curls' tells the story of a young girl's journey of hating her curly hair, to absolutely loving how unique and different it makes her.

"I really wanted to write a book for a few reasons. Firstly, I wish I had something like this when I was younger. I then end up chatting to their adults and more often than not, they mention that the child hates their hair. Being able to relate so much to that, I just really wanted to do this for all the curly babies. I want them to see themselves in the book and say 'they look like me!'.

For the past 10 years, Nadeen has worked as a massage therapist, gaining inspiration from working with massage therapists in her sporting career.

"I love helping people, I love the human body and I also love giving people a safe space. My massages are heavily influenced by how I like my treatment - which I believe

helps me give my clients great results."

At age 7, Nadeen started playing basketball and went on to gain a scholarship to the Australian Institute of Sport at just 16. She represented Australia in under 17, and under 19 at the junior world championships and 3X3 in France.

Nadeen then started playing professional basketball and went on to have a career spanning 12 years, accumulating over 250 games in the Women's National Basketball League, and also earning her Life Membership.

"I would tell any young player willing to listen and learn, is to just be a sponge. Absorb everything you can and don't compare yourself to other people, stay in your lane and focus on you!"

Carby's Bakehouse Celebrates 25 Years

popular Wavell Heights bakery has reached a milestone anniversary. Last month, Carby's Bakehouse on Hamilton Road celebrated 25 years of baking delicious pies, pastries, bread and cakes for locals and visitors.

Owner and operator Andrew Carby said the secret to the success of the business was employing good staff and offering consistent quality of products.

"Also bringing out different things and giving (customers) a bit of variety," Andrew said. "Stick to your basic eight out of ten, and vary those other two. I'm aware there are fancier places around but we feed the masses and we aren't overpriced, we are reasonable."

Andrew, who has been working as a baker for 43 years, opened the bakery on 6 March, 1998.

"I've worked for enough people to see it was worth having a go and plucked up enough courage," Andrew said.

"I remember the existing shop, which included a doctor's surgery, newsagent and TAB, which have

disappeared over the years. And also remember the kids coming in with their parents and now they are coming as parents. I also remember we had a good response – pretty well instantly – at the shop."

All of Andrew's children have spent time working in the shop and his son Ryan, 25, has been working there for the past seven or eight years.

"He's learning what he can for the future," Andrew said. "I don't know how many kids we would've employed over the time but it'd have to be well over 100 kids. It is good to see one who is a radiographer now, and one is a doctor."

Carby's milestone is even more important considering the challenges encountered by small businesses during the COVID-19 outbreak.

"Through COVID all customers were very respectful when in the shop and obeyed the rules we were enforced to apply," Andrew said.

To mark the occasion on 6 March, the bakery offered each customer a free birthday cupcake. Customers were also given stubby coolers and bottle openers and had the opportunity to win a gift voucher.

"We are very proud of the achievements over the years and look forward to many more years to come," Andrew said. "We thank all of our loyal customers and those who stopped in to give our treats a try."

HISTORY CHERMSIDE

George Marchant

THE HISTORY OF MARCHANT PARK

he land that is today known as Marchant Park, was first bought by George Marchant in 1899, a wealthy soft drink producer and philanthropist who was to use the paddock for his company's horses. Marchant, the son of a builder and a hotel manager, was born in Kent, England. He boarded the Ramsey on June 9, 1874, and with just a few shillings he arrived in Brisbane. He was eventually employed as a station hand and gardener in the outback, and when he returned to Brisbane, he worked as a carter for an aerated waters firm.

After putting in a lot of serious effort, George went on to own soft drink factories all over Australia and was the owner of the world's only bottling machine patent.

George was a generous man who supported numerous organisations, notably the Wheller Gardens Settlement aged care home, by contributing tens of thousands of pounds. Along with his wife, Mary Jane Dwyer, Marchant also supported the New Jerusalem Church in Ann Street.

Following the end of the war, George offered the Kedron Shire Council the use of his field as a park. There were a few requirements to this agreement, however once they were fulfilled, Marchant Park was transformed into a public place. The Australian Light Horse Regiment and the artillery and machine gun battalions of the Australian Imperial Force trained there during World War One.

Marchant Park served as a part of the Chermside Army Camp, which was created across Ellison Road (in Sparkes' Paddock) on October 7, 1940, during World War Two. Marchant Park was designated as "Camp Area J" and was only to be utilised for practise because it was a public area with crucial cricket amenities.

After receiving the paddock to make way for a public space, Kedron Shire Council named it Marchant Park. To honour George Marchant, a rectangular monolith of quarry-faced granite was erected in the small garden close to the memorial gate entrance on Murphy Road.

DRAGON CELEBRATES 50 YEARS WITH ANNIVERSARY CONCERT

t's time to reminisce about our 'young years' because Dragon is heading on tour to mark 50 years of making some of the biggest hits in rock history.

Don't miss the iconic New Zealand band when they perform all of their best loved songs at the 'Dragon 50' concert on Thursday 4 May, at The Lounge in Nundah.

Bass player and founding member of the band, Todd Hunter encouraged the audience to come to a Dragon 50 show and sing their way through a host of golden songs.

"This is not only a celebration of the band's existence, it's a celebration of you and your relationship with the Dragon songs," Todd said. "Each song is a recognition bomb of what was happening to you the first time you heard it on the radio or Countdown and is branded indelibly into your memory.

"Witnessing a Dragon show with the current band triggers a powerful emotional response that can only be resolved by losing oneself in the moment with people who were, until moments ago, complete strangers."

Dragon formed in Auckland in 1972 but relocated to Sydney in 1975. They rose to fame with chart-toppers like April Sun in Cuba, Still in Love with You and Are You Old Enough when the band was fronted by Todd's brother, Marc Hunter.

Over time, the line-up has changed and the band has broken up and reformed, but they have continued to deliver track after rocking track. In 2006, Todd reformed the band with vocalist and guitarist, Mark Williams, guitarist Bruce Reid and drummer, Pete Drummond.

Dragon was inducted into the Australian Recording Industry Association (ARIA) Hall of Fame in 2008 and the New Zealand Music Hall of Fame in 2011.

Since the 2006 reformation they've played 893 shows, and this year will be adding even more live and loud performances to the impressive tally.

Todd said the Dragon 50 audience could expect to hear "songs like Sunshine, This Time, Get That Jive, Still In Love with You, April Sun in Cuba, Are You Old Enough, Dreams of Ordinary Men, Speak No Evil, Rain, Young Years, Celebration and many more."

Ney Ney Brings Back the Old School R&B Vibes

R emember the name Ney Ney because you'll be hearing a lot more from this rising star.

Ney Ney is a proud Kuku-Yalanji man from Far North Queensland, currently residing locally, who is a finalist in The QUBE Effect, a music program run by Brisbane City Council that provides development opportunities for young artists. Describing himself as an "old school R&B artist", Ney Ney said his music was "soulful R&B with a little taste of New Jack swing".

"I've been raised from a musical family all my life but started taking it seriously in 2020, and released a video clip which got 22,000 views and progressed further with my music," he said.

"My audience inspires me to do music. Hearing my audience sing my song back to me is a blessing and a half, so mainly it's all the love and support I get from everyone that loves my music."

Each of the 23 finalists were given the opportunity to be mentored by industry experts and make a professional music video. Last month, Brisbane residents were asked to vote for the video they wanted to see win the People's Choice Award, including Ney Ney's track, Vibin.

He said the song was influenced by American singer/songwriter, Tevin Campbell. "Really the song is all about trying to serenade a dream girl and to make her feel that love and energy that I got," he said. "And in every song I have told stories that are true and really have happened to me, so I go on what has happened in my life. I feel like my music needs to come from the heart and to speak my truth in life."

The QUBE Effect winners will be announced at an awards ceremony at The Triffid in Newstead on Tuesday, 23 May.

His future goals include taking his music internationally. "But I'm happy to be just popular around Australia," he said. "That's how I know I made it and also being well known in my Aboriginal communities. They're definitely my loyal fans and I owe them heaps for showing that love for me."

Marni and David Robertshaw opened The Trellis late last year, located at the former Eden Gardens centre on Gympie Road, Carseldine - and with a café, classes, live music, and plants for miles, there is something for everyone to enjoy.

Owner and creative director, Marni said they were keen to find a space on the northside with the same environment and vibe as their other garden centre, The Nurso in Chandler, giving it a new name that resonated with the site.

"The Trellis signifies the front signage on the corner of Gympie and Beams Roads that will one day be covered in vines like a trellis," Marni said. "It is also representative of the idea of a place that community springs from, everything attached and interworking. We want to be a place where community comes to meet and where they want to spend their special occasions."



Reduce, Reuse & Recycle at Repair Cafe

id you know there's a place where you can give your broken items a second lease on life? The Repair Café is a quarterly workshop run by The Community Place (TCP) at Stafford, where expert volunteers help you fix your items, keeping them out of landfill.

Community engagement worker, Rebecca Hainsworth said the Repair Café was one of a number of programmes run by TCP that provided opportunities to meet new people.

"Because of its international goal to create connections within communities by sharing skills, knowledge and the good old cuppa tea, the project was a natural fit with the work TCP does," Rebecca said.

"Our fixers are very generous with their knowledge and talk people through what needs to be or is being done, so people gain knowledge. It is a great chance to have a cuppa and a chat with other people who are waiting to have their items looked at, so it is wonderful for building connections within the community.

"Each of the repair stations has a coloured bell they ring when they have fixed an item and the

whole hall gives a cheer. It really creates a party atmosphere!"

Rebecca said community member Barbara brought in a straw hat that had become brittle with age.

"After looking at it closely, and lots of ideas being bandied about, Barbara agreed with the recommendation to cut off the straw crown and replace it with a fabric one sewn onto the existing brim," Rebecca said. "Our sewist, Tahnee, used the remnants of the straw crown to make a flower to decorate the new hat, further reducing what went to landfill."

The next workshop is on Saturday, 20 May. People can bring in any items (other than electrical items), as long as they can be easily carried.

The Repair Cafe are seeking more volunteer fixers, including an electrician and someone who can sharpen knives and garden tools, as well as volunteers to help on the reception desk, with tea and coffee, and with lifting and shifting.

popular, long-standing Sunday market has relocated to Chermside. The Markets at Kedron-Wavell, formerly the Ferny Grove Markets, moved to its new site in the car park at the Kedron-Wavell Services Club last month.

Owner Colin Smith said the markets changed location after they were no longer able to continue operating in the Ferny Grove Station car park on Samford Road.

"Queensland Rail sent me a letter last year stating that I had to close down the markets in September 2022 – this was due to the new construction work being done in the car park, and there was no future for the market at the station," Colin said.

"Due to the community uproar of this news, Mark Furner MP for Ferny Grove negotiated with Queensland Rail for the market to remain at the station for the future. Unfortunately, the only location they could offer to us was the top floor of the multi-storey car park being built.

This was not suitable due to high winds and limited vehicle access – no trucks, trailers, and cars with roof racks, which many of my stallholders use. After many discussions with the stallholders, there was great concern over the vehicle access to the roof level."

No alternative location could be found in the Ferny Grove area and a decision was made

to relocate to the new site at Kedron-Wavell Services Club.

"I felt lucky to find such a great location at short notice," Colin said.

For more than 40 years, the markets have become well-known for being a traditional market and a large social event for the community each Sunday, offering fruit and vegetables, clothing, plants, bric-a-brac and more.

Colin said the majority of his regular stallholders had verbally advised him they would join him at the new location and he had also received quite a few enquiries from stallholders in different suburbs.

He encouraged more stallholders to apply and hoped many members of the community would visit the markets at the new site.

"It's a great location, come down and check us out," he said. "We are still a traditional market. You never know what you are going to find."





Zillmere-based small business owner has turned her passion for the environment into a buzzing beekeeping organisation with a focus on conservation.

Sarah Hamilton, a Meliponist (aka stingless beekeeper), founded Bee Yourself in 2013 and this year was given the opportunity to share in a pool of \$250,000 as part of Brisbane City Council's Lord Mayor's Women in Business Grant.

She said Bee Yourself offered beekeeping, consulting and educational services, as well as rescues and removals and splitting services.

"I also sell established hives and all stingless bee related accessories," Sarah said. "Having started out my working life as a horticulturist and hosting native bees for years, it seemed a natural progression to start keeping my own hives and I haven't looked back since."

She said keeping native bees was a safe, enjoyable and low maintenance hobby that

everyone could take up to help reverse the decline of pollinators through conservation.

"Keeping native bees is being practised throughout the country, not only as a safe and fun educational tool with a wide variety of learning outcomes, but also as a therapy for people who are experiencing mental, emotional or physical difficulties," she said.

Sarah's clientele includes corporate clients who want to improve their contribution to environmental stability, farmers and crop pollinators who require bees for successful harvest, and community groups who use hives to liven their physical space and to allow their own clients to connect more deeply with nature and Indigenous culture.

"Through building connection and communication with my customers and community, I am continually striving to improve my products and service to ensure that Bee Yourself remains recognised as a relevant and high quality local business," she said.

Sarah said she was "stoked" when she found out she was a recipient of the Lord Mayor's Women in Business Grant and that she intended to use the funds on her business website.

"To have a functioning, informative website will allow me to direct people to my website, which will save me so much time on a daily basis," she said. "This will then allow me to focus on other areas of my business that need my attention, such as being out in the field working the bees."

ast month, the North Brisbane Crime Prevention team joined the Motorcycle Rider Training Australia (MRTA) and numerous motorbike enthusiasts for the first ever 'Bike Night' event, promoting road safety.

Organic Gardening in May

How to get more referrals for your business

tep 1. Whenever you have a new lead or customer, say the following...

"Most people find out about us through our existing clients, just wondering who referred you to us?"

Step 2. Ask their permission to ask for referrals once they are a quality client. We use the following script in our initial conversations once someone becomes a client/ customer.

Again, this is just reminding them that we are a referralbased business, and we would like their permission to help someone they know who could really use our help.

"Just curiously, do you know anyone who is like you guys (who we love working with by the way), who could use our help? If you are happy to introduce us, that would be awesome, but if not, that is totally OK. We can reach out to them anonymously if you like."

If you have been doing a great job in helping these clients, they will be more than happy to connect you to those they know (they probably will already have done so), otherwise, you let them off the hook, by reaching out anonymously.

LIVING WITH CHUCKY - MOVIE REVIEW

hat if you grew up with a killer doll. For writer and director Kyra Elise Gardner that's exactly what she did.

Her father was the makeup artist and head puppeteer who literally helped bring a killer doll named Chucky to life.

The titular Chucky has been starring in his own film franchise for over 30 years so Kyra was curious to see how her Dad has been spending his time.

Which led her to create this documentary and was also a great excuse to meet the cast and crew involved in the franchise. Like any good documentary it has a purpose.

Kyra has grown up hearing about the crew but has never had a chance to meet them. So, she set out to interview all of the key contributors to find out why Chucky means so much to them. Including the film's creators, crew and stars.

Initially the film brings you up to speed on the premise of the franchise and then takes you on

a blow-by-blow journey through each film. Even though there are massive diminishing returns with the Chucky sequels, I'm always fascinated with how bad films are created. It helps you understand the decisions people made and what they were hoping to achieve.

These films have been surrounded with some controversy which I would have liked to see explored more but I can understand the reason for leaving some elements out due to their sensitive nature and the fun tone of the film.

You don't necessarily need to be a Horror aficionado to enjoy this doco, although it would definitely help as Horror nuts will lap up all of the backstage secrets and on set stories.

If you have an interest in the filmmaking process it offers great insights into the techniques and skills used. Although be warned, if you're more on the squeamish side, there are moments of blood and gore that could be a bit too much for the more discerning viewer.

On the whole this is a solid documentary exploring people's fascination and love for the horror genre, in particular, a little doll named Chucky.
