THERAPY DOG BRINGING JOY TO PATIENTS

eet Bonnie and Hugo, the newest Delta Therapy
Dog team making a difference in the lives of
patients and staff at St Vincent's Private Hospital
Northside.

The hospital in Chermside has been able to engage the pair thanks to a community initiative and partnership between Northside Bingo and Kedron-Wavell, which sees a local charity receive a \$1000 donation each month.

St Vincent's Private Hospital Northside volunteer coordinator, Sharyn Smith said Bonnie and her Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, Hugo offered companionship and pats for patients, visitors and staff in the cancer care ward.

"This donation is extra special as Delta Dog handler, Bonnie, is a serving defence force member herself so it seemed the perfect match that a donation from Kedron-Wavell RSL support her placement with St Vincent's Private Hospital Northside," Sharyn said.

Delta Therapy Dogs is a national non-profit organisation delivering animal-assisted programs to hospitals, aged care facilities, youth services and

other health and community services.

Sharyn said a five-minute "pat and chat" with Hugo could make a world of difference to a patient, especially as many were missing their own pets.

"When visiting with patients and their visitors, Bonnie and Hugo assess what each patient needs," Sharyn said. "Sometimes it is a chat about Hugo, other times it's a pat and a snuggle in the patient's bed. Because Hugo provides a calm, affectionate presence, patients are often commenting that his visit has made their day and has improved their pain levels."

Bonnie said she first learned about Delta a few years ago when she was dogless and living in Canberra, serving full-time in the Australian Army.

"I thought it was the most wonderful way to bring joy to other people and decided that when I got my own dog, I would investigate what the steps were to us becoming a Delta Therapy Team," Bonnie said.

She found Hugo at a breeder and they attended puppy preschool and dog obedience classes before moving to Brisbane, where she started the process of becoming a volunteer. The pair began visiting the hospital in April this year.

"Hugo and I have completed two shifts in Ward 1C, which is a cancer and palliative care ward," Bonnie said. "We love bringing joy to the staff and patients and look forward to our visits."

Community Grant 'Game Changer' for Local Charity

ocal charity organisation Care Kits for Kids Old has been busy providing even more essential items to children in need, thanks to the Kedron-Wavell Community Grants Program.

Applications for the 2023 program are now open, giving North Brisbane based individuals and community organisations the opportunity to share in \$175,000 funding for a specific initiative.

Care Kits for Kids Qld secretary, Stephanie Hinrichs said receiving the Kedron-Wavell community grant last year had been a game changer for their sewing volunteers, providing new sewing and embroidery combination machines, coverstitch machines and ScanNCut machines.

"As part of our mission of supplying care kits to children in care or crisis, who often own nothing, these machines help our sewing volunteers make clothing and accessories for our care kits faster, more efficiently and to a very professional standard," Stephanie said.

"The new machines all work beautifully and it is so encouraging for the volunteers to produce beautifully sewn, high quality clothes for children in need. These machines make such a difference in helping us to produce so much more in less time."

Care Kits for Kids Qld provide free care kits to children in out-of-home care or crisis, including homelessness, domestic violence, disaster and extreme poverty. The backpacks contain two days' supply of clothing, toiletries, stationery, toys and books, a handcrafted quilt or wrap and a pocket heart with a message of love and hope.

The charity has provided more than 6000 care kits since it began in February 2018, with 1447 kits provided in 2022 and more than 1650 kits so far this year.

"We are not regularly funded and rely on grants, donations and fundraising to raise the thousands of dollars it takes every month to buy the backpacks and shortfalls in public donations, so that no child misses out on any component of their care kit," Stephanie said.

"We don't want any child to go without. Grants such as the Kedron-Wavell community grant all support this ultimate aim, helping us to create care kits."

The amount of each grant will be based on the merit of the application, but ranges from \$500 to \$10,000 per applicant. Applications close Monday, 31 July.

EXPLORING, CONNECTING AND MAKING A DIFFERENCE

t 70 years, Warwick still has a real love for life and meeting new people. Having spent most of his life working in sales roles, he has a natural ability to connect with others.

Hanging up his boots after 15 years as a senior sales manager in New Zealand, Warwick decided it was time for a change and made the move to Australia. He was soon followed by his three daughters.

His love of people and adventure means

travel has always been a big part of Warwick's life.

"What I love most about travelling is the people. I've been lucky enough to experience many different cultures, taste exotic cuisines, and made countless friends along the way." Warwick said.

Warwick retired at the age of 66, but he did not want to slow down and wanted to stay active within his community. He decided to see what Burnie had to offer.

"Once I saw the activities, gym, café, and all the rest of it – I thought this is for people my age who want to socialise, the activities are affordable, so I signed up as a member."

Before he knew it, he was playing 500, doing aqua aerobics, and even learned how to play mahjong. Warwick soon heard about the transport program at Burnie Brae, which provides services for older people who need to get to appointments, grocery shopping, or other errands.

"I saw Burnie Brae were looking for volunteer drivers. I've been driving all my life and still like talking to people, so I thought why not?"

Warwick loves listening to people's stories, sharing his own experiences, and feels like he is making a real difference in their lives. The wonderful connection Warwick has with Burnie Brae clients makes it easy to give a friendly reminder when needed.

"One lovely lady I pick up regularly asked me one day 'What are you ringing me for?' I said I'm coming to pick you up in 10 minutes. Are you ready? With everything going for her at that time she had forgotten what day it was. So I reminded her she had cards on that day."

Sometimes being a transport driver is a bit like being a superhero, but with a Burnie Brae car instead of a cape.

In many ways, Warwick feels like he is living his best life at Burnie Brae. He can stay active, engaged, connected to others, and he can make a difference.






HISTORY CHERMSIDE

CHERMSIDE: A HISTORY

hermside was originally known as Downfall Creek, which presently forms the northern limit of the suburb. When the Gympie gold rush started in 1867, many travellers heading north would run into trouble at a creek, and it was because of this troublesome waterway that Chermside was first known as Downfall Creek.

Residents were looking for a more appealing name, and when it was revealed that Sir Herbert Chermside would be appointed Governor of Queensland in 1902, they chose Chermside. The name was formally adopted the following year.

Chermside was formerly a farming community. Farm lots were incrementally sold starting in 1865 and continuing until 1868, with the majority of lots being 15-20 acres. After the Gympie goldfield opened in 1867, Gympie Road saw a lot of passing traffic as Cobb and Co. transported supplies and prospectors to the northern workings. A German Quarter was developed close to the intersection of Hamilton and Webster Roads by German immigrants.

Signs of a long-term settlement didn't emerge until the 1870s. A general shop on Gympie Road opened and a Methodist church was formed in 1877. Two years later, a post office was opened and in 1884, Andrew Hamilton was appointed postmaster. Later, Gympie Road was home to blacksmiths and coachbuilders, while Downfall Creek saw the start of multiple slaughterhouses.

In 1911 the Australian census recorded over 400 people in Chermside, and other authorities suggest a figure of 1000 in the district (including Aspley and Chermside West).

East of Marchant Park, along Downfall Creek, there is territory that has been utilised for military training since World War I. The site for the Chermside Army Camp was purchased by the Commonwealth in 1941, which resulted in a massive influx of people and related services. Some of the military buildings were put to use after the war to help with the housing crisis, and the 7th Brigade Park, which is located east of Marchant Park, was named in honour of the military's presence.

AWARD-WINNING LOCAL RECYCLING CENTRE TURNS 40

n 1983, a teacher named Harry Johnson established a can-crushing work experience program. Today it's one of the largest school-based recycling centres in the southern hemisphere.

An initiative of Aspley Special School, the Kingfisher Recycling Centre not only processes tonnes of recyclables each year, it also provides training for students with disabilities.

Christine Brownridge, the centre's unit officer, works with two part-time staff and a team of volunteers who sort, repurpose and dismantle the large volume of material coming into the centre each day.

"Kingfisher wouldn't exist without the wonderful support of our volunteers and the local community – their donation of goods are what keep the volunteers busy and the student classroom functioning," Christine said.

The classroom space is used by students at Aspley Special School and neighbouring special schools.

"They learn about wearing PPE gear, how to be safe in a work environment, how to follow instructions, how to use bottle and can crushing equipment, as well as being able to tinker with computers and e-waste and learn how to use tools," Christine said. Many past students volunteer on a regular basis, including Grant Mackay, who has been a volunteer since 2000.

Members of the public can donate recyclables like cans, glass bottles and jars, electronic equipment, building materials, car batteries, stamps and envelopes and whitegoods, as well as raw vegetable scraps for composting. Some reusable items are resold at reduced costs.

Christine said the benefit to the community was enormous.

"It gives people satisfaction to know that their items are not heading straight for the waste bin," she said. "We get many people expressing their pleasure at supporting the special school. We also know many of our customers love the bargains they find in our small sheds."

The centre has won many awards, including the Brisbane City Councillors' WasteSMART Choice Award in 2020.

Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers said the centre provided alternative ways residents could choose to recycle everyday items.

"Additionally, in recent years Kingfisher Recycling Centre has become a well-established Council Community Composting Hub, which has in turn provided residents with greater awareness of the centre," Cr Landers said.

"We can all do our part to reduce landfill and reuse by visiting Kingfisher Recycling Centre."

Organic Gardening in June

bbrrrr! Baby, it's cold outside. The cooler temperatures make working outside a pleasure so tackle some of the bigger tasks now. Labour intensive projects like digging new garden beds, putting in paving, building garden structures or doing some repairs and maintenance, are perfect ways to keep warm.

Another way to enjoy your organic garden and escape the chill is with a fire – there is something very relaxing about staring into the flames and basking in their warmth.

Stay within BCC bylaws by ensuring the fire is contained in a barbeque or another cooking device. Grill up some of those beautiful organic vegetables you have been growing. Cube them, if making kebobs, or cut into large slices, marinate in a little olive oil and seasoning (Tuscan Seasoning mix is a personal favourite) and cook up a storm. Use clean and dry combustible material so you don't smoke out your neighbours.

Temporary Full Expensing is Ending

Currently, most businesses that purchase business assets can claim 100% of its price in full, in the year that its purchased and ready for use. This will finish on 30 June 2023. If you need to purchase a business asset and have the cash flow to do so, we recommend you purchase it BEFORE 30 June 2023 to be able to claim 100% of its cost in the 2023 year.

Low-and Middle-Income Tax Offset has Ended

The temporary LMITO was introduced in the 2019 Budget and then extended during the COVID-19 pandemic.

It resulted in extra tax refunds of between \$675 and \$1,500 (depending on your level of income) for individuals. The Government didn't extend the LMITO, so it has ended as of 30 June 2022. Individuals who received an extra tax refund of up to \$1,500 in 2022 will not receive it again this year in 2023.

Lower Asset Write Off Tax Deductions

Compared with prior years, from 1 July 2023 a small business can only claim up to \$20,000 inc. GST as an instant write-off. Any assets that cost more than this amount will be added into the small business simplified depreciation pool and depreciated at 15% in the first year and 30% each year thereafter. Remember, this is a tax deduction, and it is not \$20,000 cash back to you.

Small Business Tax Lodgement Penalty Amnesty

This new amnesty will apply to small businesses with a turnover of less than \$10 million to encourage them to re-engage with the tax system. A small business will not be charged failure-to-lodge penalties for outstanding tax lodgements that are lodged between 1 June 2023 and 31 December 2023 that were originally due between 1 December 2019 to 29 February 2022.



wenty years ago, three of Shirley Singh's children were murdered in their Bridgeman Downs home. Now she's telling her story in the hope it may help others.

Shirley's Story: A tale of strength, courage and hope by Emily Eklund Power was written in memory of Neelma, 24, Kunal, 18, and Sidhi, 12, who were killed by Neelma's ex-boyfriend in April, 2003 while Shirley and her husband, Vijay, were on a business trip to Fiji.

Shirley, 72, spoke to the Chermside Guide about how her happy memories and love for her children had helped her stay strong.

"My children were the best children on the face of this earth," she said. "They used to get along so well. They used to laugh, they used to go out. I never saw them fight. They were always there for me. Neelma would say, 'don't cook, you look so tired'. I've got a big house and Kunal used



to vacuum downstairs and Sidhi used to do the dusting. She used to put on Indian costume and jewellery and put music on while she was dusting. And that is what I am doing now when I am doing my chores in the kitchen, I'll put music on."

> Shirley shared memories of how Neelma used to laugh ("she can blow the roof off"), Kunal as a popular, witty student who everyone loved, and Sidhi playing jokes on her sleeping father by clipping his toes with pegs so he wouldn't wake up after a toe massage, which Shirley said was "genius".

"My life with them was like they're more my friends, not my children," she said. "If you see my children's photos, you never see a glum face. It's

always smiling. I'm happy that I had such beautiful children, even though it was such a short time."

In 2015, Shirley met local journalist Emily Eklund Power, the daughter-in-law of her best friend, Angie Power.



"Shirley had been approached to tell her story before, but wasn't ready," Emily said. "I think she trusted me to put the pieces together for her.

"On that first meeting, Shirley cooked for me; curry, roti, and rice. We pored over photos of her children, looking through newspaper clippings of the crimes, and watched VHS tapes of family events. Shirley and Vijay still lived in their home at Bridgeman Downs. The children's rooms appear untouched, although – knowing the gravity of the crimes committed there - I knew they'd been painstakingly redressed.

In spite of the trauma Shirley experienced in her life, her recollection of events - including her memories of her children and their life together - never ceased to amaze me."

Emily interviewed lead detectives on the case and examined court records and police and witness statements from the longest criminal trial in Queensland's history.

"I appreciate her hard work," Shirley said. "We just wanted all the facts and she did the research."

As the pair began pitching the manuscript to publishers, Emily was forced to add a final chapter to the story she never envisioned – eldest daughter, Archana died of a brain aneurysm in 2020.

"Despite the significant and unimaginable trauma Shirley has faced in her life, her strength is undeniable," Emily said. "She's sassy, passionate and loving. She has a great sense of humour, and is at her happiest when talking about her children.

"I hope she feels proud of the story she's put together in memory of her children, and finds some peace from delivering on something that I think will help others."

Shirley said her message to other victims of homicide, or anyone who had lost a child or family member, was to be strong.

"To be really strong, be courageous and have hope," Shirley said. "Hope leads to faith and faith performs miracles. That is my belief and that is the fact of life."

Having said that, the main hero of the piece -'Phoenix Jones' also packs a punch as a trained mixed martial arts champion. At a glance Phoenix seems as close to the real deal as the world's going to get (minus actual super powers). What do Business Cash Flow and Bathtubs have in common?



Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said Uncle Lewis was a fierce advocate, a compassionate Elder and a real friend to many on the Northside.

"As a long-term Zillmere local and respected community Elder, Uncle Lewis had a strong connection to O'Callaghan Park and the nearby Zillmere PCYC, becoming a vital part of their Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Youth Justice Program," Cr Cassidy said.

Uncle Lewis was a founder of Koobara Kindy, which began in 1974.






