usic is an expression of love and for those who engage in singing, they share with us their very heart and soul.

Such is the case with the Queensland Irish Choir. Their musical aspirations — to simply share the Irish and Celtic melodies that have entertained both young and old throughout the ages.

Coming in July, 2023, the Queensland Irish Choir will present its mid-winter concert, 'A Celtic Winter.'

"The Queensland Irish Choir is more than a choir. They're a choir family and I'm privileged to be a part of this group," said Morag Wilson, president.

Celtic music, in particular, is part of the language in Scotland and Ireland and extends to areas including Cornwall, Wales, Nova Scotia and more. Musical Director (MD), David O'Keefe, has this year's repertoire ready with favourites from these areas. Some of which you may recognise are; an Irish favourite, 'The Foggy Dew,' a Welsh piece, 'Yma o Hyd' (Still There), and a Scottish, 'Go Lassie Go.' There are many more, of course; all aimed to please.

"We are very fortunate to have a few members who our MD can call on to do solos or duets," said Wilson. These special moments will include sopranos, a bass, tenor and duet by a soprano and alto.

In addition, "We are blessed to be able to incorporate performances by two trios. Both are students from Canterbury College, as well as the

University of Old Chamber Music Academy," said Wilson.

Guest performers Trio Bellisimo will perform at the Chermside concert, while Timli Trio will perform at Camp Hill. Both trios specialise in Chamber Music, so it should be quite a treat. Tim Li is also the accompanist for the Choir.

'A Celtic Winter' is scheduled for two dates and locations. First, Sunday 23 July at the Chermside Kedron Community Church and the second on Sunday 30 July at St Thomas Catholic School. 

MEET TOM, A NEW PUP FOR PIP

ix-year-old Pip is waiting for the day a very special canine companion will join her family in their Kedron home.

A Smart Pups Assistance Dog is currently training to live with Pip, her mother, Rachel and little brother, Rhys, thanks to the family's fundraising efforts and a sponsorship by Kedron-Wavell.

Rachel said they were given a big surprise at the Craig Harley Smart Pup luncheon in May. "We thought we were there to raise awareness for Smart Pups," Rachel said. "I had no idea until

they said, 'we'd like to introduce you to another Smart Pups family – Pip and Rachel'.

The next thing I know, we are up on the stage and someone has given me a microphone and is asking me questions about my family. Then they point to the back of the room and Tom McGuire is carrying a black lab puppy towards us and they are saying he is for Pip."

Pip is autistic and her Smart Pup, named Tom after the McGuire Hotels director, will assist her with sleep, safety, emotional regulation, social interaction and gross motor skills. Rachel started fundraising for a Smart Pup in September 2021, contacting local businesses and sharing Pip's campaign on social media. By December, she had the \$20k required to go on the waitlist.

Kedron-Wavell's general manager, Vjorn Bradow said they would support the family by covering the costs of the puppy when it lives with them.

"Having a pet can be very expensive with food and vet bills, so Kedron-Wavell will take that stress off the family and let them focus on the enjoyment of having Tom as a part of their family," Vjorn said.

"Words cannot describe the impact a Smart Pup has on a family, and the club is proud to be able to contribute in a small way to one family in need within the local area." Rachel said it was hard for Pip to imagine life with

"I talk about him a lot and show her pictures and she remembers and says, 'he is my puppy, I love him'," Rachel said.

Tom just yet.

"Rhys is excited too but for a different reason. We have permission from Smart Pups to bring a kitten into the house once Tom is fully settled. I've promised him a kitten because, 'I'm a cat person, Mummy'."

DHEM SLIDES TOWARDS STARDOM WITH NEW **SINGLE**

local music producer, DJ and artist is blowing up on Spotify and is ready to take on the world.

With his single Heaven reaching almost 500k streams on the digital music service, DHEM (pronounced Dem) has built a loyal following and is preparing to drop more music this month.

The Stafford resident said his new single, Slide touched on a relationship where one side continued to create distrust and disharmony.

"We've all been in situations similar to the theme of this song," he said. "It will probably be the soundtrack for someone that's going through it right now.

"I wrote the concept, chorus idea and produced the music, and sought out which artist makes sense for the song. I might create two or three versions - an Aussie version, New Zealand version and LA version."

The track has "acoustic guitar with trap elements" and features Sydney rapper, Big Kash, and Malik from Los Angeles.

An entirely self-taught artist, DHEM described his music as "emotion, moody and low-end driven" and said he became a musician because he wanted to contribute to the art form.

"I'm a music nerd, having an ear for sound selection and understanding a bit of music theory," he said.

Last year, he reported 372K streams on Spotify with more than 61K listeners across 118 countries. The music video for Heaven is currently on rotation on MTV Australia. DHEM said he was grateful the track had been so popular.


"I want to up the ante every time," he said. "So Slide is going to be my first song to hit a million (streams) in a short amount of time."

At the moment, DHEM is planning more gigs, expanding his brand and promoting his music. Last month he performed a show in Toowoomba supporting rap artist Lisi. He said his goals for the future included being recognised as a serious musician.

"To inspire others," he added. "To have a financially sustainable career in music. Tour the world from my music. Plus I want to put on for the Northside, the surrounding suburbs of Chermside.

"My worldview is this - there's two types of people that exist. Participators and spectators – which one are you?"

ORGANIC GARDENING

Snip Snip, Clip Clip!

t's cold now but set your sights on preparing your garden for abundant fresh growth in spring.

Snip snip, clip clip! Prune your hedges, roses (except old-fashioned varieties), frangipanis, citrus and summer-flowering shrubs like plumbago and crepe myrtle for compact foliage and healthy blooms later. Leave the spring-flowering climbers and shrubs e.g., azaleas, jasmine and Brunfelsia until after they have bloomed.

Finish those projects you began in June before the Ekka winds of August take the fun out of being outdoors. Speaking of which - check your lawn for bindii and eradicate those carrottop rosettes BEFORE they turn prickly. Dig them out by hand, or if prolific, try a natural weed killer like Earthfood Maintain or Slasher. Your feet will thank you later.

Cold, wet soils and the long shadows of winter reducing life-giving sun make July less than ideal for planting vegetable seeds. Empty vegetable beds, particularly those earmarked for growing peas and beans in summer, will benefit from application of organic lime to sweeten the soil. Dig lime into top 10 to 15cms of soil where it will leach over time and raise the pH.

If you want to plant something try beetroot, silverbeet, cabbages, peas, lettuce and carrots.

In the early 1940s, the local community recognized the importance of officially defining and renaming the suburb. Various names were suggested, including Beverley Heights, Avon Hill, Inala, and Wavell Heights. After voting, Wavell Heights emerged as the most popular choice, and it was officially designated as the suburb's name in 1941.

The name "Wavell Heights" was chosen to honour British Field Marshal Archibald Percival Wavell, who served as the Commander-in-Chief of British and Dominion Forces in the Middle East during World War II. Many Australians had the privilege of serving under his command, particularly in significant campaigns in North Africa, Greece, Crete, and Syria. He was a distinguished British military commander who played a crucial role in shaping the course of history during the first half of the 20th century.

Born on May 5, 1883, in Colchester, England, Wavell demonstrated exceptional leadership qualities from an early age, which ultimately led to his rise through the ranks of the British Army.

In June 1915, he distinguished himself by earning a Military Cross during the arduous confrontation against the German Army in Ypres, Flanders, although he tragically lost an eye during that engagement.

Wavell gained recognition both within and outside the army in the interwar period. Renowned for his exceptional training skills and commanding abilities, he became a respected figure among military circles.

Upon retiring from public office in 1947, Wavell was bestowed with the title of Earl.

Today, Wavell Heights stands as a symbol of the enduring legacy of Field Marshal Archibald Percival Wavell. This tribute serves as a testament to Wavell's exceptional leadership and his role in strengthening Australia's defence during a time of great adversity.

riginally known as West Nundah, Wavell Heights had a predominantly agricultural landscape, with dairy farming and pineapple cultivation taking centre stage. Its strategic location near the Nundah Railway Station led to the subdivision of a portion of the farmland into smaller residential lots in the 1920s. Further residential development took place during the interwar period, resulting in an increase in the number of houses in the area.





ocal residents have been asking me recently about the upgrades to the Sea Scouts building at Gibson Park in Stafford.

I am pleased to see that Brisbane City Council has started minor rectification works on the building. The two skip bins are onsite, and the temporary fencing has been installed. Please remember this is now a worksite and no entry is permitted.

Externally, the team will cover two holes to block possum entry locations, clean the roof and building, and repair the staircase to make them safe.

Internally, the kitchen will be removed to identify the extent of termite damage and Council will be investigating further into the structural integrity of the building.

The building, which is formally known as the T.S. Paluma Naval Cadet Hut, previously a Sea Cadet Training Depot, is a Heritage listed building with a rich history. It was built to replicate a ship with a mast and gun at the board.

The Gun, which originally was at St. Helena, has now been transferred to Shorncliffe.

A Fun Fact - Do you remember the Old Cannon at Gibson Park?

Cast in 1803, the E. Cannon (serial 63914) was sent to Brisbane in 1862 on the immigrant ship Clifton, with eleven other cannons to defend the colony of Queensland set up in Queens Park (now part of the Botanic Gardens) as a firing battery on the bank of the river. In 1909 it was moved from Queens Park to Cameron Rocks Reserve by Hamilton Town Council. In 1954, it was relocated again and set up at the Bulimba power station on Gibson Island. In 1982 it was swapped with another cannon restored by the Naval Cadets. The cannon was reinstated in the City Botanic Gardens in 2015. It is close to its original location near the Alice Street entry and faces the Brisbane River.



MOTOR ENTHUSISTS REVVED UP FOR NEW MUSEUM

new motor museum in Banyo will showcase themed automotive collections and the best of motoring history.

The Brisbane Motor Museum opened last month and the first exhibit, The Cars We Grew Up With, displays the kind of vehicles car lovers have been admiring since they were kids.

Brisbane Motor Museum director Jackson Smith said the museum had long been a dream of his grandfather, Colin Galley.

"He has a large collection of classic prestige vehicles and has always wanted to create a place for his as well as other's cars, motorbikes and memorabilia to be showcased." Jackson said.

"So rather than keep dreaming, in the last two years he decided to make it a reality. We have done a lot of work to make the museum a destination. It is designed to be a home for motoring enthusiasts and attraction for tourists."

Some of the must-see vehicles in The Cars We Grew Up With are a 1991 Ferrari F40, 1979 Lamborghini Countach and 1988 HSV Walkinshaw Commodore VL.

Jackson said the exhibit focused on bringing back memories.

"The display cars were chosen if they were at least one of the following," he said. "A poster

car for people growing up - something people dreamed of owning or driving, such as a Ferrari or Lamborghini.

"A model of car that people have a connection to because they had one, or their relatives or mates had one growing up, which for a lot of Australians were Holdens or Fords.

"A car that people sold and now regret selling. We all hear from our mates or relatives, 'I shouldn't have sold it,' so we wanted to bring in some cars that people maybe do not own now but still wish they did."

The museum will feature rotating exhibits on all things motoring.

"Some exhibits will focus on the cultural and historical aspects which influenced a vehicle's design and construction," Jackson said. "Some will present the achievements and performance that vehicles made. Other exhibits will present the history of a vehicle and its ownership. And others are just cool."

The museum has a café, gift shop and space for functions and meetings.






