xcitement was high as Boss Boxing, a cultural safe space and gym, opened its new location in Zillmere, bringing the community together.

Boss Boxing aims to be a pillar of the community, providing a cultural safe space, especially for First Nations members.

Boss Boxing Founder and community leader Sammy Leone said Boss Boxing helps to improve social outcomes and the emotional and physical wellbeing of its patrons.

"As a First Nations Boxing academy it is a place that can bring people together from all cultures to learn from First Nations people and culture with the sport of boxing as the connector for people from all walks of life," he said.

The gym was originally opened due to cultural conflict in their local community, with the idea to

create a place to help get youth, 'off the streets and into the gym.'

They facilitate programs during the day within local State Schools and offer workshops to the elderly, NDIS and at-risk youth.

"The Boss Boxing has been contracted over the years to work for many companies and entities throughout the community including QLD Government funded services, Youth Justice, Health, Education, Social Services and the likes," Sammy said.

Boss Boxing was also nominated as a 2023 Queensland Reconciliation Award Finalist after winning the Health and Wellbeing category in 2022.

"To be acknowledged by our community and the government for our work was a massive achievement in this year's community award nomination, and to make it through to the final round has meant a lot, giving us inspiration to work harder to get positive outcomes for our community," he said.

Sammy and his team at Boss Boxing enjoy helping their community reach their health and fitness goals by embedding the philosophies of Boss Boxing into everything they do.

"We believe that this gives the foundation and fundamentals that are missing in today's society and building character and resilience within our communities."

wo of the most celebrated singers in Australian music have teamed up to showcase the works of one of the greatest singer-songwriters in history.

Wendy Matthews and Grace Knight are bringing their cabaret show, We're Going to Graceland -The Songs of Paul Simon to Kedron-Wavell on Friday, 29 September, presented by Wild Goat Entertainment.

Founder and director of Wild Goat Entertainment, Melanie Evans said she was thrilled to present two of Australia's most cherished artists to Brisbane audiences.

"These are two of my favourite artists, and it's an absolute pleasure watching them perform this show," Melanie said.

Both award-winning musicians with several platinum albums between them, Grace and Wendy will delight the Kedron-Wavell audience with their interpretation of Paul Simon's songbook, including his 1986 album, Graceland. The record sold more than 16 million copies worldwide, with hits like You Can Call Me Al and Diamonds on the Soles of Her Shoes.

Grace is well-known as the lead singer of the band Eurogliders and as one of Australia's leading jazz singers. She said that after 20 years of talking about doing a show together, she and Wendy were finally on stage and having a blast.

"I just love singing with Wendy and it's great to be able to take this show around the country and hang out with my pal," Grace said.

Wendy, a Canadian-born singer of Aria charttopping hits like The Day You Went Away, added that the songs and band were wonderful and it was a lot of fun.

"Grace and I find much joy in performing together and I think that's infectious," she said. "Like Grace, I've done many tours of Queensland and it's always nice to head north to such fun and appreciative audiences."

The duo will also sing songs by Simon and Garfunkel, including The Sound of Silence, Homeward Bound and Bridge Over Troubled Water.

Wendy said it was Grace who suggested the pair perform the music of Paul Simon.

"Paul Simon is such a wonderful lyricist and the stories in his songs are humorous, profound and everything in between," she said.

Grace agreed the biggest challenge was which songs to leave out.

"Paul Simon has written so many great, wellknown songs that the show would go for days if you tried to include them all," she said.

spley Little Athletics Centre (ALAC) are making improvements to the equipment at their community facility in Geebung, thanks to funding from a Brisbane City Council grant.

The not-for-profit, volunteer-run athletics organisation was awarded \$11,000 last month under the latest round of the 2022-23 Lord Mayor's Better Suburbs Grants.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the centre had been instrumental in training future athletes from across Brisbane for over 40 years.

"The club will use the \$11,000 awarded to them to replace the safety netting on their throwing cage at Bowden Park," Cr Schrinner said. "This will make sure that members of the club and the wider community will have the facilities for training and development, as current athletes prepare to be the future Brisbane 2032 Olympians and Paralympians of tomorrow."

ALAC centre manager, Jeff Bayley, said the ALAC Committee was very relieved and excited to hear the centre had been successful in their application for new safety nets under the Better Suburbs Grant.

"The safety nets cost a significant amount of money and without the financial assistance that this grant has provided, ALAC would either have to wait and hope for a successful result in future applications, or risk closing the throws facility for the safety of users and spectators," Jeff said.

"The safety nets on our current multi-use throws cage are around 20 years old, and while this throws cage has provided athletes and the community with a safe place to practice discus, shotput and hammer throw for the past 20 years, the safety nets have reached the point where costs of continual repairs is no longer sustainable and the safety of the community is at risk."

The centre has seen a growth in membership and an increase in the number of athletes training at their venue.

"Without grant programs like this, ALAC would not be able to provide the level of services and quality of facilities to young athletes and the community," Jeff said. "With the Commonwealth and Olympic Games coming up, it is crucial that young athletes are provided with every opportunity that they can get to help them improve not only their athletic ability, but also their social skills that come with being part of a passionate and supportive athletics community."

Your August Garden

old and flu season is in full force! Nurture and heal your body with the life-giving goodness ▶of your own fresh produce. From vegetable soup to ginger tea - whether a cure or preventative - treat yourself to nature's medicine from your own backyard.

August is the month to dig up your potatoes, ginger and turmeric. You may have carrots and pumpkins, winter greens like cabbage and celery, and onions and garlic. Any vegetable can go in soup to nourish your body and soul. Non-vegetarians can add a chicken frame for a boost of minerals.

Ginger tea is a delicious flu-fighter. Finely slice a piece of fresh ginger about the size of your thumb. Boil for 10 minutes, strain into a mug and add honey and lemon to taste. No fresh ginger? This is a good time to plant ginger, ready for harvest next year. Cut ginger into 3cm wide pieces with 'eyes', leave them to cure for a few days, then plant 10-15cm deep in well-drained soil.

Check soil isn't drying out in the Ekka winds. As temperatures rise towards the end of August, summer vegetables can be sown. Plant tomatoes, capsicum, eggplants, cucumber, zucchini, beetroot, cabbage, carrots, lettuce, and corn.



ICE CREAM FOR A BERRY GOOD CAUSE

The beloved Ekka strawberry sundae is not only a local icon, but each one sold helps to fund medical research for The Common Good (formerly the Prince Charles Hospital Foundation).

The Common Good's general manager, Chloe Nguyen said she hoped to see many community members at one of their five stalls at the annual agricultural show from Saturday, 12 to Sunday, 20 August.

"Whether it's a sense of nostalgia from Ekkas gone by, or a chance to finally try this iconic ice cream, there's something so special about the Ekka strawberry sundae," Chloe said. "What makes it particularly special is the heart of it – the strawberry ice cream. Over 16 tonnes is produced right here in Brisbane by family business Lick Ice Cream.

This particular flavour is only produced for Ekka, and the team works for three months to produce the volume needed to serve Brisbane its favourite treat."

All profits from sundae sales support research into heart disease, lung disease, mental health and dementia, providing funding opportunities for researchers who undertake groundbreaking work to help people live healthier for longer.

"These researchers work out of the humble labs at Australia's leading heart and lung hospital, The Prince Charles Hospital – right here in Chermside," Chloe said. "Earlier this year, we unveiled two state-of-the-art ICU bed spaces at The Prince Charles Hospital, which use the latest technology and innovations to reduce the environmental factors like light and noise that can lead to delirium and other mental health conditions for patients."

Scooping more than 100,000 sundaes annually would not be possible without the help of thousands of volunteers. Chloe said The Common Good needed around 400 more volunteers to help chop, scoop and serve this year.

"Many of our amazing volunteers have their own personal and special connection to The Prince Charles Hospital and the incredible work which our researchers do," she said.

"Volunteer shifts are only 4.5 hours long, and you will receive free entry to the Ekka on the day of your shift and a free Ekka strawberry sundae."



edron was named after Kedron Brook, a creek that runs through the northern suburbs of Brisbane. An important watercourse with its source in Ferny Grove, Kedron Brook flows into a wetland near the airport in Toombul. In 1838, German Moravian missionaries established a settlement there to protect Aboriginal people, and they named the watercourse after the biblical Kedron River.

In 1856, the land along Kedron Brook was divided into farm lots, and Judge Alfred Lutwyche purchased two lots near Gympie Road in 1859. The area, now the location of Kedron High School and an emergency services complex, was named Kedron Lodge

by Lutwyche. Lutwyche then donated land to the south for St Andrew's Anglican church in 1866.

The population in the area was scattered, but Gympie Road served as a primary access route. The Edinburgh Castle Hotel opened on Gympie Road around 1868, and in the 1870s, bridges were constructed over Kedron Brook to replace the previous river crossings.

It was the Kedron Park Hotel in 1880 that brought vibrancy to the district. The hotel owner organized horse races, polo matches, and sports days at Kedron Park with the cooperation of those who benefitted from Lutwyche's estate. The majority of the Kedron district consisted of farms and tanneries lining Kedron Brook and the intensity of the hotel's operations resulted in complaints regarding pollution of the brook.

In 1911, the notorious Melbourne figure John Wren acquired Kedron Park as an unregistered horse racing track. Wren provided gambling facilities for the working class, and a park named after him was established next to Kedron Brook.

The Catholic Church expanded its presence in Kedron by obtaining Delamore House on Turner Road for the Missionary Sisters of St Francis. Furthermore, Kedron Shire was incorporated into Greater Brisbane in 1925.

Pony racing at Kedron Park ended in 1931, but harness racing and dog racing continued until 1956. The population of Kedron reached its peak in the 1950s, with a large number of students at the primary school and the opening of secondary schools by the Catholic Church. Kedron State High School and an adjoining teacher's college were established in 1957 and 1961 respectively.

CALL TO SUPPORT LOCAL FESTIVAL FOR HOMELESS

ocal medical student Jessie McLachlan is the CEO and co-founder of Altru, a charity which helps thousands of homeless people at an annual festival in Los Angeles.

The one-day event sees a homeless person (guest) paired with a volunteer tour guide as they receive essential health and wellbeing services before connecting with others in a festival atmosphere with food and live music.

Now Brisbane is set to hold its own Altru Festival in November

"Altru is more than an event but the event is the catalyst for forming the bond with individuals within the community," Jessie said. "It's a fun spin on charity, because you have fun donating your time and seeing the joy it created."

Jessie was living in New York when she was hospitalised with an illness. Despite having medical insurance, she spent more than two years fighting a \$586,000 bill. She then discovered the impact medical bankruptcy had on homelessness in the United States.

"I couldn't not do something," Jessie said. "My birthday was coming up and my friends thought, how about we throw a birthday party for people in the streets?

"In 2015, we all came together in a car park in downtown LA and hosted a small BBQ with a clothing donation and live music and we ended up serving over 800 people."

The following year saw 2000 guests receiving services from optometrists, doctors and mental health workers. Since then, the Altru Festival has evolved to include one-on-one mentoring and tutoring programs.

Jessie said while Nike, Netflix and Uber were major sponsors in the States, they hadn't received as much support for the Australian festivals.

"We need financial donations and financial support," she said. "We have little to no admin costs and 100 per cent of the money raised is given back to the community. The biggest cost of the event is infrastructure and safety."

They also need more volunteers.

"When you volunteer at the event you actually see where your dollar donations have gone in real time and not a lot of charities can show you the path to that," she said. "You will see the positive impact you are having on someone's life and that's pretty profound to be part of that human experience."

In the lead-up to the Altru Festival, Jessie has been reaching out to people in Musgrave Park where the event will be held.

"A lot of the homeless people I'm meeting, the majority of them have jobs, and meeting children, that's horrifying," she said. "The odds are already stacked against them. We can solve a lot of these things by coming together as a community, to create a secure, safe society for our children and our children's children."

with arthritis feel very alone as they don't know anyone else their age with the condition," she said. "Having someone to speak with who knows exactly what you're going through, and who is a similar age now or when they were diagnosed, can help people feel less alone, better understand and cope with their condition, and to learn more about treatment options and who can help.

"Often younger people diagnosed

"Early treatment can help to slow or prevent the condition from worsening and can help limit the impacts of the condition on day-to-day life. With the right treatment and support, most people with arthritis can continue to

live a healthy life."

Peer-mentor, Geraldine Keating was diagnosed with osteoarthritis in her late thirties. She experienced a flare-up in her fifties before having a hip replacement in her sixties.

"Callers with a new diagnosis are usually in shock and feel overwhelmed with too much conflicting information or not enough medical guidance," Geraldine said. "They want to know how to ease the pain so their condition doesn't affect their ability to work, earn income, care for their family, enjoy their social and recreational pursuits. They eask questions around operations, medications, natural alternatives, ways of managing weights, mobility, strength, staying social and enhancing wellbeing.

"Being anonymous and on the end of a phone provides a freedom to just be ourselves and say things and ask questions others may not understand. People feel listened to and understood and leave with options they can use. They leave feeling more uplifted and with a sense of hope."


diagnosis of arthritis can be an overwhelming and lonely experience, particularly for younger people, which is why an understanding ear makes a big difference.

Arthritis Queensland operates a free, phonebased peer support program called Arthritis Assist, where people living with arthritis can have a confidential chat with a fully-trained, peermentor.

Health promotion manager, Jessica Neri said speaking with someone who also lived with the condition could be reassuring and empowering.

"While family and friends can be well-meaning, many people with arthritis report a lack of understanding among their loved ones about what arthritis really is," Jessica said. "While health professionals play a very important role in helping people manage their arthritis, they often don't have a personal experience with the condition and the day-to-day challenges people may experience."

She added there was a huge misconception that arthritis only impacted older people.

he Australian Government is providing a year's free broadband services to up to 30,000 families with school-aged children as part of the School Student Broadband Initiative.

To be eligible, families must have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school in 2023, and have no active NBN service.

The initiative will provide 50 megabits per second (Mbps) fixed-line services, Fixed-Wireless Plus and Sky Muster Plus services, depending on where the family lives, with

large or unlimited data quotas.

The School Student Broadband Initiative is an affordability measure to narrow the digital divide and boost education opportunities for students without access to home internet.

Given the cost-of-living pressures impacting so many Australian families I want to make this assistance accessible as widely as possible.






