# THREE ELVISES ROCK THE BUILDING

trio of the world's leading Elvis Presley tribute artists are taking to the stage for a journey through the many eras of the King of Rock and Roll. Described as "the show that embodies the essence of The King", Elvis: An American Trilogy will return to Australia and New Zealand this month with a performance set to captivate the audience at Kedron-Wavell.

One of Leong's kites is titled 'Mantha,' which is a flying manta-ray with a 5m wingspan. The second kite is titled 'Raptor,' and is a "overkill bird scarer" with a 5.5m wingspan.

"We believe in making KiteFest accessible to everyone, and as part of that commitment, we offer complimentary entry for carers with a valid companion card," Natassia said.

#### WOMEN'S SHED WORKING WONDERS WITH WOODCRAFT

n enthusiastic group of local women have been meeting regularly to create their own woodwork projects in the name of learning new skills and building community.

The Bramble Bay Women's Shed recently moved to a new location in Bald Hills, where members participate in DIY Build Your Own Project days on Wednesdays and Sundays between 9.30am and 12.30pm. Acting president Linda Kirby said the Bramble Bay Women's Shed, formerly the Brighton Women's Shed, was formed in 2021 by Brighton woman Eloise O'Toole and other local women interested in DIY and learning to use tools with timber.

"There is a strong need in the community for a safe space for women to meet and learn these skills with confidence, no matter what the skill level," Linda said. "Women also desire and enjoy recycling, restoring and reusing existing furniture."

The idea was shared on Facebook with nearly 100 women replying to the post.

"As women from outside the Brighton area were also expressing interest, the decision was made to change the name to Bramble Bay Women's Shed to include the 4017 and Redcliffe peninsula areas," Linda said.

She added that finding a suitable space to call home was a major hurdle to overcome. It was nearly a year before the Women's Shed found a shared space in Clontarf. In June this year they had to move again. Thanks to Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers they found a new shed at PM Aged Care in Bald Hills.

"In our new premises we have had one workshop, Build a Sawhorse, where eight women were given the opportunity to learn power and hand tool skills, whilst building a project of their own under the guidance of a volunteer experienced woodworker," Linda said.

The shed plans to offer more workshops in timber, furniture restoration, leatherwork, resin and other crafting skills, and invite PM Aged Care residents to join smaller scale activities.

Members come from Bald Hills, Brighton, Sandgate, Bracken Ridge, Taigum, Caboolture, Albany Creek, Warner and surrounding areas.

"With only one other established Women's Shed in Brisbane working primarily in timber craft, there is strong demand," Linda said. "More recognition needs to be given to this interest as financial backing is difficult to attain."

Membership is open to women over 18, with an annual membership fee.

#### SPRING FAIR TO CELEBRATE SCHOOL TURNING 60

**S** t Dympna's Catholic Primary School turns 60 this year and the whole community is invited to the party.

The Aspley school will celebrate the milestone anniversary at its 60th Jubilee Spring Fair on Sunday, 10 September.

Principal Peter Surawski said the event promised to be a fantastic day of fun and community spirit.

"Bring your family and friends for a memorable day out in the community," Mr Surawski said. "We have an array of exciting activities and attractions planned to keep everyone entertained throughout the event.

"It's also an opportunity to support our school and community. All proceeds from the fair will go towards educational initiatives, making a difference in the lives of our students."

Amusement rides like the Super Sizzler, dodgem cars, giant slide, teacups, frog hopper, rock wall and bungee trampolines will keep families busy all day. Food trucks will be stocked with favourites like fairy floss, popcorn and icecream. There will be plant stalls, markets, arts and crafts, pony rides, a petting zoo and more. This year's Art Union raffle has great prizes up for grabs, including a \$3000 VISA gift card. Mr Surawski said live performances would captivate fair-goers.

"We have a range of performances from our students showcasing their talents with DanceFever, the musical talent of the string orchestra and band, performances by local dance company Do Dance and a special performance by St John Fisher College," he said.

St Dympna's School opened in 1963. Fr Tom Guy was instrumental in the founding of the school, writing to many orders of Sisters in Australia before Sisters of St Joseph, Sr Bernadette Barlow (principal) and Sr Marion Joseph, were appointed in 1962.

Classes were large with up to 60 students in one class. Parents helped out with playground duty and children kept classrooms and toilets clean. Early students used Cuisenaire rods (mathematics learning aids) and read Happy Venture books with the characters Dick and Dora.

A very large hailstorm in 1985 caused a lot of damage. Over time many buildings and play areas were built, with some replaced by bigger, better structures. These days classrooms are equipped with the latest technology and each child has their own iPad.

## THE GROWTH OF GEEBUNG

eebung, situated 12 km north of central Brisbane, originated as a farming community and has transformed into a mature, postwar suburb. Originally referred to as Geebong, its name is associated with the Personia species of plants and trees that bear edible fruit or nuts. The name's origin lies in an Aboriginal language group from the Sydney region, rather than A.B. Paterson's poem, 'Geebung Polo Club'. The suburb is separated from Chermside and Wavell Heights by Downfall Creek, with the North Coast railway line running along its northeast side.

During its early years, Geebung had a modest residential settlement. The North Coast railway line, established in 1888, was designed for rural

purposes, contributing to limited population growth. In 1908, the Post Office directory documented a mere 34 farming families residing in the vicinity. These farms predominantly cultivated small crops and fruits. Alongside this, pig farming was prevalent, while Gerns ham and bacon factory (established in 1895) and Hutton's factory in nearby Zillmere processed small goods. Notably, Gerns continues its operations to this day.

Around 1920, a progress association was formed, leading to the construction of the Geebung Memorial Hall in 1923, and the introduction of a bus service in 1922 connected locals to the tram terminus on Gympie Road.

World War II and its aftermath influenced Geebung's development. The Chermside Army Camp occupied part of Marchant Park, and industrial activity surged, leading to the establishment of factories. A community was built around F.C. & E.W. Robinson's Grocery Store, and in 1947, the Industrial Sales and Service (ISAS) started. This was followed by the Olympic Tyre factory's production in 1950, which covered around 24 hectares. Educational institutions, including Geebung Primary School (1953) and a Catholic Primary School (1964), accompanied the population influx, which saw numbers rise from 7,000 to nearly 18,000 between 1954 and 1966.

Amidst a slight population decrease since the 1980s, attributed to evolving business dynamics, Geebung has maintained its appeal by nurturing a thriving industrial zone situated to the northeast of the railway line. This industrial hub has consistently furnished the local populace with reliable job prospects. Accompanying this, the neighbouring Chermside district hosts Westfields, a prominent regional shopping complex.

# HOWZAT?! WORLD CLASS INDOOR CRICKET TRAINING

S aurabh Kumar has played cricket his whole life and loves his cricket so much that he has opened a top-drawer indoor training facility in Geebung for everyone to get the chance to share his passion (and get better at playing it).

Since making Australia his home in 2009, Saurabh has been cricket coaching, starting out with it as a hobby and volunteer.

"I love passing the great game onto others," he says. "I always did loads of PD on cricket and upskilled myself and before I knew it became so big that it needed to turn into what it is now."

Over that time, Saurabh has gained a reputation as an excellent cricket coach, especially for young emerging champions.

The Blaze Cricket facility offers a series of self-contained cricket nets with state-of-the-art "BOLA" bowling machines from the UK that allow the user to set the style of bowling and speed of the ball.

There is also a viewing platform for family, friends and fans alike and gym facilities for the cricketers. The nets are also available to baseball enthusiasts.

"Blaze Cricket is one-of its kind in North Brisbane. Brisbane has lots of cricket lovers



and we want to help those budding cricketers to reach their goals," said Saurabh.

Since opening in early July this year, the facility has become a welcome addition to training possibilities for cricket players.

"The idea is that our community can benefit from it and play the game when they want to," said Saurabh. Parents in particular have welcomed the idea of being able to observe their kids training after hours. Many of them will come along to Blaze and help out by feeding the cricket balls into the bowling machine for their cricketers.

Saurabh says his dream for the facility is that it be "used to its maximum capacity, helping world class, emerging players. We will do our very best to keep upgrading the facility to meet the player's needs and the increasing demands of the game."

## GOING TO BAT FOR A GOOD CAUSE

**Some well-known local faces are limbering up for a special charity cricket match this month.** Marchant Ward Councillor Fiona Hammond has organised the event to take place at Gibson Park on Sunday, 17 September, to raise awareness of the latest developments in blind cricket and fundraise for victims of domestic violence.

Cr Hammond said the games were all about enjoying sport and helping to promote cricket at Gibson Park. "They will also be inclusive with a diverse group of people of various abilities and ages," she said. "Any funds raised will support Hearts of Purple, my choice of domestic violence charities."

Two T20 games will be played at the match, including a charity match with the Fiona Hammond XI versus the FICQ XI (The Federation of Indian Communities Queensland Inc). The other game will be run by the Queensland Blind Cricket team, who will be launching a newly developed cricket ball that continues to beep while moving through the air, providing a constant noise for vision-impaired players.

McDowall Ward Councillor Tracy Davis will also be participating as part of Cr Hammond's team.

The event will include a sausage sizzle to raise money for non-profit charity, Hearts of Purple, who support high risk domestic violence victims. The charity was named 2023 Change Maker of the Year and Community Group/Charity of the Year at the Change Maker Awards in July.

Hearts of Purple CEO Michelle Beattie said the money raised from the charity cricket match would go towards The Hearts of Purple Housing Project, which will be a safe haven for high risk domestic violence victims and their children.

"We are not government-funded, so in 2020 we rolled out the Purple Bin program," Michelle said. "Today we have about 700 bins across Queensland collecting 10-cent recyclables. At the end of September 2022, we purchased our first block of land from collecting 10-cent recyclables. Now we are trying to raise the funds to build four two-bedroom homes on the property. Our main concern right now is getting money for the homes to go into an area where there are no domestic violence services."

#### Local Business Creates Jobs for Young People with Disabilities

ncredible ideas are often born at times of duress and with our recent pandemic, we saw a surge of many innovative businesses. The Baking Bunch was founded when mum, Helen McCarthy, became inspired after witnessing her NDIS participant, assisted by a support worker, bake amazing brownies which said participant's sister then sold in the community.

"I was determined as a parent to have a child with a disability have purpose and obtain paid work that suited them," said McCarthy. "This NDIS participant now has a wonderful paid job with beautiful people and support — the family has had their wish realised."

To achieve this took many hands as McCarthy and all NDIS participants, support workers, volunteers and therapists nurtured The Baking Bunch into becoming the not-for-profit (NFP), hi-level charity and commercial baking facility it is today. Anyone who's started their own business 'from scratch,' knows the challenges. For The Baking Bunch, they had Covid, creating a commercial kitchen, the February 22 floods, town planning, and negligible funding options. Since then, The Baking Bunch has grown a team that draws upon individual talents. From NDIS participants to their workers and volunteers, all engage in building relationships while running a real baking business.

"We have some truly wonderful people as part of the team and with the participants, they have built this business," said McCarthy. "By transitioning to a not-for-profit, government funding came through a Social Enterprise Grant that got us much needed money to create employment opportunities for our young people," said McCarthy.

This was a game changer for The Baking Bunch.

"We even have customers creating jobs on our behalf — so our young people can work for them in the long term," said McCarthy. "It's really exciting that we've experienced such ongoing organic growth."

The Baking Bunch realised its purpose by opening its Coffee Training and Customer Pickup Point. Run by paid NDIS participants, customers conveniently pickup their orders plus a complimentary coffee to boot.

"We're now recruiting for someone to run the site. This certainly does legitimise our business model, being able to pay staff," said McCarthy.

## September gardening

#### opefully you nurtured both yourself and your soil over winter because spring is the time to plant, plant, plant!

September brings mild weather and gentle rain giving the perfect window to plant seeds and seedlings. Before you fill every space, consider your capacity to keep your garden regularly watered in the coming months.

n the first Wednesday of September each year we honour those who served on land and sea, and in the air in the South and South-West Pacific campaigns of 1942 - 1945, repulsing the direct threat to Australia. This year marks the 81st

ralia. This year marks the 81st Commemoration Service to be held on the 6th of September at the Battle for Australia Memorial, Chermside Historical Precinct.

When Japan entered World War II, Australia was immediately in danger of invasion. In September, the Japanese advance was halted at Kokoda and driven back to the north coast of New Guinea.

Then followed Australian victories at Buna, Gona, Sanananda, Wau, Salamaua, Lae, Finschafen, Ramu Valley and the Huon Peninsula. These victories removed the threat of invasion to Australia.

Japanese submarines patrolled the east coast of Australia, attacking coastal shipping until 1943. In all, some 74 ships were sunk, including the hospital ship 'Centaur'.

On 31 May 1942, Japanese midget submarines entered Sydney Harbour and on 7 July, Sydney was shelled from enemy submarines. American forces defeated the Japanese in Dutch New Guinea and then reclaimed the Philippines. Australian vessels were part of the naval force in the latter battle.

After the Japanese surrender, Australian Armed Services were part of the Occupation Force in Japan. All our second AIF Divisions, three AMF Operational Divisions, local residents and Indigenous units, 60 RAN ships and 30 RAAF Squadrons who took part in the fighting were supported by the merchant mariners of a diversity of nations.

The names Milne Bay, Kokoda, Buna, Shaggy Ridge, and Coral Sea symbolise the campaigns of the Second World War which, collectively, can be called the Battle for Australia.

#### embers of the community have been taking part in a special program that connects the young with the young at heart.

Not-for-profit childcare centre Uniting Early Learning Aspley and Aspley Uniting Church have been bringing young children together with older members of the church congregation each week as part of an intergenerational play program.

Area Manager Uniting Early Learning Peta Griffin said the program, 'Grand Friends', had many benefits for the children, older people, staff and wider community.

"The main benefit is the connection to community, however the children have also gained a greater knowledge and acceptance of people and their surroundings," Peta said.

"The congregation enjoy bringing in activities for the children to participate in with them, such as storytelling, art and craft activities, and a favourite activity of 'show and share' where the congregation share childhood games and activities or items from the past, such as a typewriter to show the children."

Recently, grand-friend Greg brought in wood, screws, a hammer and nails to teach the children how to screw in a screw and hammer a nail into a piece of wood.

The Grand Friends program started in February and will continue until the children graduate at the end of the year. Each session goes for an hour and a half with the children and grand-friends sharing morning tea and participating in activities under the supervision of trained educators.

Peta said around ten grand-friends participated in the program, with at least two grand-friends visiting the childcare centre each week on a roster system.

"The children become very excited on Wednesdays awaiting their grand-friends to arrive," she said. "You can see the excitement and they light up."

Grand-friend Elizabeth, who organises the roster, said the effort each person put into making the visit a successful, interesting time for the children was heartwarming.

"My understanding is that the children very much look forward to our coming each Wednesday and their teacher enjoys the interaction as well," she said. "Thank you to UEL for more than meeting us halfway to bring to fruition this idea from infancy to working well, and even more pleasing is the fact that a happy and diverse time has eventuated for all."

o theme parks make for good movies? Disney rides are responsible for more films than you might think. 


