

SKILLING OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

he Zillmere PCYC has recently launched their Get Set for Work program, which provides young people who are no longer at school and not working an opportunity to get into the workforce.

During the program, young people aged between 15 to 19 are taught skills that will benefit them in their future studies, employment and everyday life.

PCYC Zillmere Get Set for Work Program Coordinator Sophia Walker said participants learn valuable life skills including nutrition, cooking skills, and improving their fitness.

"The program delivers a wide variety of activities including on-the-job experience, accredited courses, and qualifications including a Foundation Skills Training Package Certificate II, and the opportunity to complete things such as a Responsible Service of Alcohol, Responsible Service of Gambling, and First Aid certificate available to all participants," Sophia said.

Participants also have the opportunity to work with Braking the Cycle, a learner driver mentor program, among others, to provide young people with a 'leg up' and give them additional support. Get Set for Work runs in a number of locations around North Queensland, another being Pine Rivers, where their team are hard at work with their own participants.

A current Pine Rivers participant said, "The Get Set for Work course really helped me move forward after leaving high school. I felt welcomed and supported throughout the whole program and felt like I had a community to rely on."

PCYC Zillmere Youth Club Program Manager Acting Sergeant Megan Dwyer said, "We are so excited to be able to offer this valuable program to the young people of our community. We will provide a variety of support suited to participant's individual needs and we want applicants to know we are here to help them succeed."

The program allows youth in the community to be supported through an increase in their capacity to find work but also provides support through friendship and teamwork.

Get Set for Work is a Skilling Queenslanders for Work program funded by the Queensland Government.

BUSHCARE PROJECT RESTORING NATIVE HABITATS

new bushcare project is underway at Rainbow Lorikeet Park in Aspley, led by North Brisbane Catchments (NBC) in collaboration with Brisbane City Council.

The project aims to restore and enhance the riparian zone along the creek and create and support biodiversity at the park.

The project's group leader, Robert Jamieson, said he had lived locally for six years and saw the potential for a bushcare project at Rainbow Lorikeet Park.

"Many other locals, including long-time residents, had lamented to me about the loss

of many small birds and varieties of lizards," Robert said. "Also, I envisaged the benefits to the members of the community of a bushcare project.

"Our initial effort is to widen the bush along the creek near the Agnew Street entrance, which includes a 'welcome garden' with flowering natives to provide beauty for the public and attract pollinators."

NBC, a volunteer subgroup of Brisbane Catchments Network, will work with Council's Creek Catchment team to identify and replant native plants (trees, shrubs, grasses, groundcover and vines).

"The plan is to improve the ecosystem for native flora and fauna," Robert said.

Rainbow Lorikeet Park has resident eastern water dragons, possums, moorhens, magpies, butcher birds, noisy miners, crested pigeons, native frogs, and native bees.

Many native birds also visit, including rainbow lorikeets, laughing kookaburras, Australian wood ducks, ibises, rails, brown ducks, paleheaded rosellas, willy wagtails, cormorants, egrets and corellas.

Robert said they were hoping to have a couple of working bees each month, one during the week and one on the weekends.

"Each working bee will be one hour and followed by a social gathering for tea/coffee and chats," he said. "Activities will vary but could include spreading mulch, planting, weeding and watering with some discussion, for example, plant identification, comment on the progress of the plantings, etc. We would also like to have local schools involved."

Those interested in participating in the working bees can follow North Brisbane Catchments on Facebook or check the noticeboard at each park entrance for updates.



ne of the community's biggest Christmas events, the Christmas Lights Festival, is returning for its tenth year, promising to be bigger and better than ever. Bridgeman Baptist Church will be hosting the festival from December 13-15, offering a magical experience for the whole community.

"We are thrilled to welcome everyone back to celebrate the holiday season," said Senior Pastor Nathan Harris.

With thousands of lights illuminating the church grounds, visitors will be mesmerized by the festive atmosphere. Two unique shows, featuring talented musicians from the region, will entertain the crowds. In addition, there will be a wide array of food stalls, markets, carnival rides, and carollers, ensuring there is something for everyone to enjoy.

iona Hammond, the long-standing councillor for Marchant Ward, has officially stepped down from her position.

Ms Hammond, who was first elected in 2008, has decided to embark on a new political journey as the LNP candidate for Stafford.

She said it was time for a new challenge. "I

first walked into the Marchant Ward office 15 and a half years ago as a young naïve mother of two young children full of ideas on how to make Marchant a better place," she said. "I quickly learnt it was not my ideas that mattered, it was the ideas of our residents and bringing their ideas to life."

Reflecting on her time in the position, Ms Hammond said one of her fondest memories was working with local young people at the Stafford Skate Bowl. "I empowered them by giving them ownership of the park and it was amazing to see that the crime rate dropped by 80 per cent," she said.

She said other highlights during her tenure included infrastructure upgrades like the Geebung overpass, library improvements and flood restoration works.

"I have delivered many local park upgrades over the years, and of course this year I was so proud to stand beside the Lord Mayor and Chair Tracy Davis at the opening of the fantastic new play space at Bradbury Park, which transformed a dusty dry space which no one could use into one of the most visited parks in the city," she said.

She added she was proud to be a patron of many clubs and organisations over the years and would continue to support them.

Ms Hammond said she had observed firsthand how the community came together to support each other, recalling the response to the fire at the Brothers Football Clubhouse in 2012, which resulted in significant fundraising efforts to rebuild the clubhouse.

"This is real community, of which I am so proud," she said. "This proves that community is not defined by electoral boundaries.

"When the floods happened, I witnessed the community stand up together and support each other, as they still do now. Without the help of volunteers and passionate community members, we couldn't achieve the positive change in such short timeframes as we have."

Ms Hammond added she was proud of community events like the cricket charity match supporting Hearts of Purple, and Mayfair at Lanham Park, thanking Inner North Rotary for their support and expressing her hope the event would continue for many years.

"It really is our community that makes the Marchant Ward so special," she said.

"I have loved my time as the Marchant Ward Councillor, representing my residents as best as I can and forming strong relationships within the local community. I am looking forward to still doing this on a daily basis from a state level of government."

GINGER BEER FRUIT CAKE

INGREDIENTS

1kg of mixed dried fruit 375ml (1.5 cups) ginger beer 1 cup of caster sugar 250gr of butter 4 eggs, lightly beaten 2 cups of self-raising flour

METHOD

Place dried fruit, ginger beer, sugar and butter in a saucepan. Bring to the boil and stir until the butter has melted and the sugar has dissolved.

Set aside to cool.

Preheat the oven to 140C. Grease a 200mm cake tin and line the base and sides with 2 layers of baking paper.

Stir through the eggs and fold through the flour. Pour into the prepared tin and bake for 2.5 hours or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.

Cover with foil if the top is browing too quickly. Enjoy on its own or with warm custard, cream or icecream!

LOCAL AUTHOR FINDS SUCCESS IN SELF-PUBLISHING ENDEAVOUR

ESCAPE

Northside resident and author Travis James has achieved his dreams of becoming a published novelist by taking matters into his own hands.

After 30 years of "getting nowhere" with traditional publishers, Travis self-published two of his fiction novels this year, with more on the way.

He said his head was full of stories.

"I've always been a dreamer, an observer," Travis said. "Most of my eight novels started with a simple idea, often not knowing where it would end. Some are loosely themed: death, love, hope, mystery – although they all have a little bit of everything. I guess my writing is very honest, exposing everyday themes and emotions."

Travis' most recent release, Escape to Patonga, was inspired by an experience he had while working as a real estate photographer. He visited the seaside village of Patonga in New South Wales to photograph a shack along the creek.

Twelve years later, the memory of that shack sparked his imagination, leading him to write about a mysterious stranger staying there during the off-season. As he works full-time, Travis writes mostly at night. He said he worked best with headphones on, playing loud music to drown out his thoughts.

"When I sit in silence, my thoughts go in all directions and I can't concentrate," he said. "Music gives my wayward thoughts something to focus on, which allows my creative thoughts the freedom to generate."

He encouraged aspiring writers to take the leap and self-publish.

"Self-publishing is easy," he said. "You pay to have your work edited and proofread professionally. Then load it to Kindle Direct Publishing for printing in Sydney.

"There are plenty of websites, forums and Facebook groups that offer all the help and guidance you need. The best thing for me was joining a writer's group to surround myself with other self-publishers.

"The hardest part is marketing, which can be extremely daunting and expensive."

Looking ahead, Travis intends to release novels three and four in February and April 2024 and aims to publish two additional works in 2025.

"There are still plenty of stories in my head," he said. "I'm not done yet!"



'Uproar' is set during South Africa's tumultuous rugby tour of New Zealand in 1981. Why should a rugby tour be a problem? Well, with thirteen years left to go before apartheid ends, protests were still underway across the world against racial segregation in South Africa - most prominently in New Zealand.

In this semi-autobiographical story of cowriter and director Paul Middleditch's life, a young Māori named Josh discovers his passion for acting. With a white English Mum and Māori father, Josh, played by Julian Dennison is torn between these two worlds, never feeling like he belongs in either.

Not only feeling out of place as the only non-white boy in school, but also longing to perform on stage when his family wants him to perform on the rugby pitch.

This is a political film, but not in a preachy way. Similarities are clearly made between apartheid and the Māori struggle with racism and their loss of land. The divide is showcased by the way the characters are treated and the restrictions imposed on them, rather than a lecture about how racism is obviously a bad thing.

Despite the sensitive topics on display there's plenty of laughs to lighten the mood, with Minnie Driver's dry, yet witty performance as Josh's single parent mother and Rhys Darby playing his loveable teacher - who owns every scene he's in.

Like any period piece, authenticity is key, and Uproar feels like a time capsule.

From the authentic (and awesome) 80's clothing to the toe tapping soundtrack, it will transport us older moviegoers to our youth. The story however is timeless, as unfortunately, similar problems that are still evident today.

It's an insightful and thought provoking film that offers an interesting perspective on our recent history, through the eyes of Josh. Making you wonder what he's willing to risk to help his family, his community and start his own journey.

If you're a sucker for a true story with political undertones, a dash of humour and a lot of heart, then Uproar is for you.

HISTORY CHERMSIDE

Surviving Nature's Fury:

The 1924 Australia Day Cyclone and Kedron's Catholic Community's Triumph

he tapestry of Kedron's Catholic history is woven with threads of tenacity and unwavering devotion. Prior to 1923, Kedron was under the canopy of Wooloowin's parish. However, a pivotal moment occurred on 27 May 1923, when Archbishop James Duhig blessed the foundation stone for the Kedron Church, a beacon of faith for the local Catholics.

The emergence of the Kedron Parish signalled a new chapter, extending its embrace to the communities as far-reaching as Bald Hills and Petrie. The weighty task of erecting the church and presbytery rested on the shoulders of Fr Keating and Fr Stanaway, who, alongside the support from Wooloowin locals, orchestrated fundraising dances across Chermside, Aspley, Bald Hills, Geebung and Zillmere.

Within three months of the church's inauguration on Australia Day in 1924, a fierce cyclone

ravaged Kedron and Nundah, causing the swift and complete destruction of the modest Kedron church. However, the calamity birthed unity and support from across Australia, as funds poured in for the church's reconstruction. Local efforts supplemented this, ensuring the church would stand debt-free upon its resurrection.

Noteworthy figures in the fundraising efforts included the Hennessys, Maguires, Wrens, Heffernans, Stantons, O'Briens, Scanlans, Eccles, and Kennedys, raising approximately four thousand pounds. Archbishop Duhig returned on 27 April 1924 to lay the foundation stone for the reconstructed church, a cornerstone of the present-day worship space.

Despite initial setbacks, the parish flourished. Initially, a modest congregation of 50 swelled due to an influx of residents, prompting additional masses to accommodate the growing numbers.

The dedication and contributions of families like the Wolfes, Wrens, Flanagans, Gallaghers, Tynans, McMullans, and Lacey's were instrumental in adorning the church with altars, statues, and furnishings, fostering a haven for worship and spiritual connection.

The present-day place of worship, constructed in the late 1960s, incorporates a treasured stained-glass window salvaged from the 1924 church.

This living testament to resilience, faith, and community proudly graces the present-day church, embodying the enduring spirit of Kedron's Catholic community and serving as a testament to their unwavering faith and unity.





Australian Lungfish Neoceratodus forsteri

While this amazing fish is listed as a protected and vulnerable species, I see them quite often while fishing North Pine Dam and the upper reaches of the Brisbane River. They are called lungfish due to their ability to breathe air using a single lung when the water is very low or devoid of oxygen.

Brown to green and an orange belly, with large scales, a flat head, flipper-like fins and a broad eel-like tail they are quite an unusual looking Aussie native. Found only in south east and central Queensland lungfish can grow to more than 1.5 metres and weigh up to 40 kilograms.

Fossil records indicate that the Queensland lungfish has existed in Australia for at least 100 million years, making it a living fossil and one of the oldest living vertebrate genera on the planet.

Around this time of year if you sit quietly when it's calm in the morning at Bullockys Rest on North Pine Dam, you can see them breaking the surface and when they come to the surface for a breath, you can hear the intake and exhalation of air.
