

elly O'Brien, voted the UK's best Dolly Parton impersonator, is set to make her Australian debut with The Dolly Show.

The production, which has toured across the UK and the West End, is coming to Kedron-Wavell in March.

Australian-born Kelly, who is currently based in London, said it was amazing to bring her show back home.

"I cannot wait to share this incredible show with Aussie audiences, celebrating the life, the music and the star that is Dolly Parton," she said.

"She is a songwriter, singer, actress, businesswoman, humanitarian, philanthropist, literary advocate and probably the world's best human. Everyone around the globe LOVES Dolly."

Kelly has been performing for more than 25 years, beginning as a country singer at the age of 14. She was crowned South Australian Country Vocalist of the Year and Best New Talent at the Gympie Music Muster.

The Dolly Show sees Kelly backed by a talented band as she performs iconic hits including 9 to 5, Jolene, and I Will Always Love You.

"I love the song I Will Always Love You," she said. "It's so beautiful and has so much meaning behind it, plus some great stories. Not only did

Whitney Houston make it a huge hit, but Elvis wanted to record it back in the 70s too."

Kelly said she spends two hours getting dressed as Dolly before each performance, allowing her time to "morph into" the superstar.

"I have honed my skills as an impersonator for almost two decades, so Dolly's speaking voice is something I am very proud of now," she said. "Even Dolly's family in the US think it's amazing."

She added meeting Dolly Parton herself in London in 2011 was "like magic".

"I was in complete awe, very surreal," she said. "There is so much you want to ask Dolly Parton, but when I stood there next to her, I couldn't think of anything to say. Luckily, she started chatting away about Dolly impersonators and how much she loves and values them. This was incredible to hear. She gave me her blessing and I left. I was just so incredibly humbled by her presence. I will never forget that day as long as I live."





esidents have a new place to enjoy the outdoors with the opening of a brand-new BMX pump track at Mercer Park in Kedron.

The track is already proving to be popular with local children who tested out the new facility during the summer school holidays.

Northgate Ward Councillor Adam Allan, who announced the project on Facebook in August last year, said Brisbane City Council was encouraging residents to stay active by delivering the brand new pump track and a family hub area.

"The new track in Mercer Park will cater to riders of all abilities with obstacles and challenges to improve their skills while the family hub in Shaw Estate Park will include great new barbecues and sheltered seating," Councillor Allan said.

The pump track was constructed in response to community requests for a BMX facility and was identified in the Brisbane Off-Road Cycling Strategy, which was developed following community consultation between 2019 and 2021.

"The awesome new track at Mercer Park will join a host of other upgrades including a flying fox, scooter and bike trails, new sheltered barbeque and picnic areas for everyone to enjoy," Councillor Allan said.

The Shaw Estate Park Family Hub is expected to open this month and will complement the existing playground and outdoor gym.

Along with the picnic shelter, barbecue and seating, the new family hub and park facilities include scooter and bike elements such as side ramps and a squiggle obstacle along the outer footpath, drinking fountains, enclosed bins, upgraded pathways and tree and garden bed plantings.

There are additional works currently underway at Shaw Estate Park to enhance the footpath from Wavell Park to Fourteenth Avenue, Benelong Street, Eleventh Avenue and Boree Street, finishing at the Shaw Estate Park Family Hub and Mercer Park pump track.

These improvements include scooter play and bike elements along the path, upgraded seating, a new shelter and bins in Wavell Skate Park, an upgraded picnic node, new seating and shade trees on Benelong Street, and improvements to the Benelong Bushcare Group entry.

These works began in October last year and are expected to be completed in March, weather and site conditions permitting.

North Brisbane Lapidary Club A Hidden Gem

he North Brisbane Lapidary Club is a haven for those who are interested in adding to a treasure trove of cut gems, jewellery designs and similar handicrafts and participating in related activities.

The Club has existed since 1966 as a not-for-profit organisation offering a space to learn new skills, connect with like-minded people, and gain a broader knowledge of minerals and gemstones.

North Brisbane Lapidary Club Chair, Lewis Shotter, said that a membership also affords the opportunity to take part in exciting fossicking trips and enhanced social activities.

"Activities include faceting, cabbing, silver work, gold work, wire wrapping, enamelling, lost wax casting and fossicking," Mr Shotter said.

Slightly tucked away near the entrance to Albert Bishop Park in Nundah, this 'candy store for jewellery makers' is complete with a display of gemmological and geological materials to rival any museum's collection.

Upon a chat with Mr Gatfield, one is illuminated to the fact that 'lapidary' is, in fact, a very interesting Latin term, "used to refer to the practice of shaping stone, minerals, or gemstones for ornamental purposes, with the ornamental element distinguishing it from related skill sets such as stone masonry."

The club operates from Monday to Saturday and often incorporates new courses for the various activities over the weekend, with joining and annual fees kept to a minimum.

The folks at North Brisbane Lapidary Club are also gearing up for the next annual gem show scheduled for early March, which is set to feature live demonstrations (such as faceting and silversmithing) with displays and sales of gemstones, jewellery, crystals and much more.

tepping Stone, a membership-based community of individuals with mental illness, is celebrating a significant milestone with the opening of their northside clubhouse.

The new clubhouse in Chermside will aim to foster a sense of community, belonging, and fulfilment for individuals with mental health concerns who are dedicated to rebuilding their lives.

Stepping Stone Program Director - North, Jacqui Gillespie, said many members found it difficult to attend the southside clubhouse in Coorparoo.

"Northside members have informed us that they would like to participate more consistently, however, the distance to travel is the main barrier," Jacqui said.

"A clubhouse on the northside had been a dream for Stepping Stone for over a decade."

The new clubhouse on 88 Delaware Street has made this dream a reality, thanks to funding from Queensland Health.

Jacqui said Stepping Stone aimed to positively impact the lives of its members, reducing the need for clinical support and hospitalisation.

"As Stepping Stone focuses on recovery, the individual along with their family and the whole community benefits as our members regain confidence, re-enter the workforce and actively participate in the local community," she said.

At the clubhouses, members and staff work together to facilitate the 'work ordered day', engage in social recreation, and participate in walking, meditation and swimming as part of the Healthy Active Lifestyle Program.

"I have watched members progress with their health and wellbeing, social, employment and education goals and build strong friendships and bonds to their local community, which is life-changing," Jacqui said. "Belonging to a community that is non-judgmental, supportive and focuses on people's strengths absolutely transforms members' lives in every way as they gain confidence and stamina in work, social, and life skills."

James Jackson (he/they), a Stepping Stone member since 2018, said the club had helped his mental health journey.

"For anyone out there, just having a sense of community can put downward pressure on anxiety and depression," James said. "Having a sense of community and belonging – I consider that a natural way of dealing with it, which I'm very big on."

James encouraged anyone who was thinking about becoming a member to give it a go.

"Stepping Stone is a very warm, friendly, welcoming place for everyone, regardless of who you are," they said.

GREENS DRIVING NEW BUS ROUTES

he Greens have proposed a new bus route that would create an east-west linkage across the northside, connecting The Gap to Northgate.

This would include connections with the Ferny Grove and Shorncliffe train lines, as well as Westfield Chermside

Greens candidate for Mayor of Brisbane Jonathan Sriranganathan said the new bus route would significantly decrease travel times.

"This route connects so many key nodes across the northside including schools, train stations, tertiary campuses, bus stations and major shopping precincts," he said.

"Every day, thousands of people who live in nearby suburbs drive to destinations like Westfield Chermside and Great Western, because they don't have a quick and reliable public transport option."

The proposed pathway would establish a new link spanning from The Gap to Northgate on the northside, incorporating a connection with the Ferny Grove train line. Originating at The Gap Village shopping centre on Waterworks Road, it would proceed northward along Settlement Road to link with the Great Western Super Centre at Keperra.

The route would then connect with Grovely station and the TAFE campus via Dawson Parade, continuing to Arana Hills Plaza. Following this, it turns onto Pimelea Street/ South Pine Road, linking the Everton Hills shopping centre and then heading down

Hamilton Road to connect McDowall, Stafford Heights, Prince Charles Hospital, Chermside Shopping Centre and Wavell Heights.

Afterwards, it turns south to connect Nundah and Nundah Village, passing the train station, before veering north along Sandgate and Northgate Road to link with Northgate, ultimately terminating at Northgate train station.

Jonathan added that public transport options were currently limited for travelling from one side of the northside to the other, with often the quickest route involving travelling into Brisbane city, changing to another service, and then heading out of the city again.

"By providing a direct high-frequency route that cuts east-west across Brisbane's northern suburbs, we could dramatically reduce travel times and costs." he said.

"If people can rely on a high-frequency seven-day/week bus service to get to local shops, schools and workplaces, they won't have to drive as much, which reduces traffic congestion and parking issues."

The proposed new route is part of the Greens' plan for a Brissie Bus Boost, which includes 15 new high-frequency services. The initiative also aims to upgrade 10 existing, highfrequency bus routes including 380 and 390.

egardless of whether you're an individual or a business, establishing authentic and effective relationships is important in all areas of life.

The Rotary Club of Aspley (RCA) is all about creating relationships as they collaborate with community organisations to accomplish their charitable works.

"We do wonderful work in the local and global communities," Belinda Shaw, RCA's current president said. "Our weekly sausage sizzles alone bring much-needed funds that we distribute to many groups in our area."

Examples of these groups include students at Aspley State School, Craigslea State High School and St John Fisher College. The RCA also created the Glen Kinross Rotary Scholarship Fund, which supports a student to attend tertiary education at the University of the Sunshine Coast, Petrie campus.

Money raised from last year's Carols in the Park allowed RCA to donate \$5,000 to Hummingbird House, Queensland's only children's hospice, in Chermside.

spley, nestled just 10 kilometres from the heart of Brisbane, holds a rich history that dates back to the mid-1800s. Originally named Little Cabbage Tree Creek, the suburb witnessed the footsteps of the Turrbal people, the Indigenous Australians who navigated its lands, finding abundant food in its creeks and surrounding areas. Before the arrival of farmers, wildlife flourished, and the landscape provided shelter for its inhabitants.

FROM FARMS TO SUBURBS

In the mid-1800s, pioneers like William John Ward and Judge Lutwyche seized the opportunity, purchasing large blocks of land for investment. The Morris family, with John Morris at the forefront, established Aspley Grove in 1865, initiating a connection that would shape the district's farming landscape. The Morris legacy extended to vineyards, with John Jr. and Alfred Morris cultivating grapes for their winery, Aspley Vineyard, which thrived from the 1870s to the 1890s.

FIELDS, FAMILIES, & THE LITTLE **CABBAGE TREE CREEK SCHOOL**

Farmers in Aspley focused on cultivating small crops, fruits, and vegetables to meet the demands of the burgeoning Brisbane market.

The Berner family's farm on Trouts Road, specialising in lettuce and other vegetables, passed through hands, creating a lineage that eventually led to the Cappello family.

Amidst controversy, William Brown's offer to construct a school on Maundrell Terrace was accepted by the government. Thus, the Little Cabbage Tree Creek School was born in 1890, with forty eager children enrolled. Under the quidance of the first head teacher, Archibald Robert Wing, the school flourished. In 1897, in tandem with the suburb's renaming to Aspley, the school adopted the name Aspley, a shift that mirrored the evolving identity of the community.

Today, Aspley stands at the brink of transformation, with a modest population of 12,871 in 2021. While the suburb's demographic exhibits a remarkably flat age curve, over 18% of residents are aged over 70. Aspley's story, woven through history, farming, and education, continues to unfold, promising a vibrant future for generations to come. Aspley's journey through time encapsulates resilience, growth, and a community spirit that defines its character.

Ithough I can't promise you groupies and TVs propelled out of windows, the documentary 'Welcome to the Darkness' is probably as close as most of us will ever come to being Rock Gods.

Hop on the tour bus with legendary Brit rockers The Darkness, who shot to fame in the early 2000s – selling millions of albums, packing out stadiums across the world and lining their shelves with awards. Now, we join them as they start their comeback tour.

You may know them from anthems such as I Believe in a Thing Called Love and Love Is Only a Feeling, to name but a few. Not ringing a bell? No worries, an insightful backstory is

provided for the uninitiated. You don't need to be a fan to enjoy the ups and downs of their successes and tumultuous relationships. BRAD'S BUSINESS TIPS

The worst question to ask is...

hen it comes to solving challenges in your business and life, it's never the answer that is the hard thing to find, it's the questions you ask that determine the speed at which you get to the answer.



WITH BRAD **FLYNN**

Starting a guestion with 'why' or 'how' can kill potential solutions thus defeating the purpose of the question. Unless you get the sequence of questions and level of trust right.

Asking a 'why' question (e.g. why did you do that?) immediately challenges

someone's values and requires a high level of rapport so they feel safe to answer honestly. Otherwise they are likely to defend themselves with excuses and justifications, thus no solution.

Asking a 'how' question (e.g. how will you fix this?) too soon in a conversation before a person has thought things through, can leave a person lost and confused and unable to propose a solution.

Solving problems with the right sequence of questions is a lot like those charity funnels you put a coin into at shopping centres. The coin rolls around the funnel and speeds up as the funnel narrows until eventually dropping into the bottom.

At the top of the question funnel, use mostly what, where and when questions. Then as you get closer to the bottom of the funnel (the solution) ask future based why and how questions to lead to the best possible solution.



NEW MEDICARE URGENT CARE CLINIC OPENS IN KEDRON

brand new Medicare Urgent Care Clinic (UCC) has opened in Kedron, providing free, priority-based treatment for residents with urgent, but non-life-threatening health conditions.

The new clinic, located on 11 Brookfield Road, has been in operation since December and aims to reduce long waits for patients at emergency departments.

Federal Minister for Lilley and Minister for Aged Care and Sport Anika Wells said the Northside Medicare UCC would make a major difference to the community, as almost 50 per cent of presentations to the Prince Charles Hospital in Chermside were for nonurgent or semi-urgent care.

"I know many families who have had to wait long hours at the Prince Charles Hospital emergency department for nonlife-threatening issues," Ms Wells said.

"The Northside Medicare UCC will ease pressure on the local emergency department and be much more convenient for our communities – closer to home, at short notice, and bulk-billed under Medicare."

The UCC is equipped with a team of doctors and nurses who offer timely care and treatment in a general practice setting for patients requiring medical attention for an illness or injury that cannot wait for a regular appointment with a GP but doesn't necessitate a hospital visit. No referral is needed.

Common illnesses and injuries that receive priority care at the UCC include lacerations and cuts requiring stitches, basic fractures and sprains, minor burns, rashes, urinary tract infections,

insect and animal bites, respiratory conditions, ENT infections, gastroenteritis and Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT). A nurse will triage and admit patients to the service if deemed suitable.

Residents must still call Triple Zero (000) or visit the nearest emergency department if they or someone is experiencing chest pain or tightness, breathing difficulties, uncontrollable bleeding, severe burns, poisoning, unconsciousness or seizures, numbness or paralysis, a lifethreatening injury, ongoing fever in infants or unresponsiveness.

The Northside Medicare Urgent Care Clinic operates from 8am-8pm, seven days a week, providing walk-in care that is fully bulk-billed. Patients are required to present their Medicare card upon arrival.

The UCC is located 3.7 kilometres from the Prince Charles Hospital and close to I-Med Radiology Network in Chermside and Sullivan Nicolaides Pathology on Gympie Road in Kedron.

GARDENING COLUMN

hile many plants have flourished in all the heat and rain, many garden pests have too.

From snails and caterpillars to fungal plant diseases, these can be controlled without resorting to toxic chemicals. Pesticides can damage the entire ecosystem of your garden by killing beneficial species such as ladybugs, butterflies and bees. Cherish your garden a favour and keep family and pets safe via -

Prevention – a healthy plant is less likely to be attacked than a weaker one. Add organic compost to boost your plants. Add coffee grounds to soil as a barrier against many plant diseases.

Companion planting - some plants deter pests from the plants near them. Nasturtiums, marigolds and petunias attract pollinators and repel pests.

Home-made remedies - make your own inexpensive and natural sprays to protect plants. Repel insects with a combination of garlic, eucalyptus oil, salt, chilli or citric oil. Strong coffee kills slugs and snails. Fungal diseases can be deterred by spraying plants with milk.

Chickens – hens love to eat all types of beetles and grubs. In their search for yummy treats, they scratch around your garden, thereby turning your soil, and provide natural compost.

We will explore these options further in the next months' columns.



e have two species of Saratoga in Australia, the Gulf Saratoga (Scleropages jardinii) and the Queensland Saratoga (Scleropages leichardti).

They are spectacular jumping fighters, which are in my opinion one of the better sportsfish we can catch locally thanks to stocking groups and the SIPS fishing permit scheme. Being freshwater fish, our local dams North Pine and Lake Kurwongbah are now some of the best places to chase these fish in Australia.

Top water lures such as poppers, fake frogs and shallow divers are mainly used, although I have caught them with live shrimp under a float too. Sharp hooks are a must as these fish have very bony mouths and throw hooks easily. Growing to nearly a metre long, most fish I have seen are up to about 60cm.

This prehistoric-looking fish that hasn't changed for millions of years is also a mouth brooder with the female holding the eggs in her mouth and the young staying very close, retreating inside when threatened.

It is also a very valued aquarium fish that takes a lot of room and care, with prices beginning at over \$120 each. They are not generally regarded as a table fish.
