atch Australia's hottest country duo, Adam Eckersley and Brooke McClymont, as they take to the stage for their Up, Down and Sideways tour.

The married couple, known for their awardwinning country music, are set to deliver an unforgettable concert experience at Kedron-Wavell in June.

Brooke said they'd played Brisbane before but with only the acoustic set.

"This time we're bringing a full band and they are killer players, so it's a show not to be missed," she said.

"We are genuinely excited about this show as we have new songs from our upcoming Up, Down, and Sideways album to play and we have put together a whole new show, and all of our musical catalogue from the past."

Brooke is no stranger to country music fans, performing with her sisters as the top-selling country music trio, The McClymonts. Adam has also had his fair share of success as a solo artist, winning five Golden Guitar Awards and being recognised for his songwriting, including the APRA Award for Country Work of the Year in 2015.

The pair's most recent album, Up, Down and Sideways debuted at number one on the Australian ARIA all-genre Album Chart. It features hit songs like Star of the Show, which won Song of the Year at the 2023 Toyota

Golden Guitar Awards, and Memory Lane, which was acknowledged as Apple Music Single of the Year.

Brooke said they loved playing all of their songs.

"We don't have a particular favourite but we do love it when we hear the audience sing back to us," she said.

During the COVID lockdowns, Brooke and Adam launched a new venture called Hang at the Wang, where guests camp on their property, enjoy an intimate musical performance, and 'hang out' for 24 hours.

The Up, Down and Sideways tour will conclude at Kedron-Wavell, promising to be a special event.

"Being the last show of the tour, we do know that the show is going to be very tight and it will be a party...most definitely!" Brooke said.

"After Kedron-Wavell, we go straight into our Hang at the Wangs for the winter season and then finish the year off with a bunch of festivals, so 2024 is looking to be a massive, but fun, year for us."

OF SCALY WONDERS AT REPTILE EXPO

et up close and personal with snakes, lizards and more incredible creatures at the Brisbane Reptile Expo.

The event, hosted by Shikito's Critters and the Brisbane Reptile Society, will take place this month at the Northside Indoor Sports Centre in Zillmere.

Owner of Shikito's Critters, Elizabeth Randall, founded the expo after complaining to her grandfather about the lack of reptile expos.

"I'd never been to a reptile expo before and I really wanted to go to one without going interstate," Elizabeth said. "So I organised the Brisbane Reptile Expo in 2023. I had a lot of support from fellow reptile keepers and it was a blast."

She said this year's expo was in a bigger venue with more breeders and a lot more reptiles.

"Last year was just over 1000 square metres, this year it's over 4000 square metres," she said.

"This year we have also made a special needs early entry time. With a maximum of 200 people for the first hour, this allows people who struggle in large crowds to still enjoy the love of reptiles.

"There will also be a few species that are quite rare in the hobby on display at the expo, including green tree pythons, white-lipped pythons, green tree monitors, oenpelli pythons and many more."

Elizabeth founded Shikito's Critters in 2019 with four

reptiles. She now has over 100 reptiles and amphibians, some of whom will be appearing at the expo, like Lefty the baby green tree python.

"He only has his left eye, hence the name," she said. "There is a few hypotheses about why he hatched with only one eye – the most likely is due to temperature fluctuations in incubation."

Another highlight is Aurora, the Hypo Chimera/ Paradox carpet python, who was born with a random mutation.

"She hatched out with a split-coloured face!" Elizabeth said. "She reminded me of the Phantom of the Opera with his mask."

The expo will feature over 40 vendors, including breeders, enclosure manufacturers, jewellery designers, artists and authors. For the younger audience, Reptile Relocation and Awareness will provide entertaining shows, alongside facepainting and photo opportunities. Those with a QLD native animal permit may also have the chance to purchase a reptile.

HUTTON'S HAM AND BACON: ZILLMERE'S CULINARY LEGACY

Hutton's Proprietary bacon factory, Zillmere

n 1873, a culinary legacy was born in Preston, Victoria, when James Carruthers Hutton laid the foundation for what would evolve into an enduring ham and bacon business. Fast forward to 1889, the crescendo of Hutton's enterprise reverberated in the establishment of the Ham and Bacon Factory at Zillmere, weaving an intricate thread into the history of this Queensland suburb. Beyond merely satisfying local palates, this bustling hub of innovation became a beacon for quality meats, leaving an indelible mark on the community.

The Zillmere operation was not just about sizzling bacon and savoury hams, it embodied a unique fusion of industry and agriculture. Within the factory grounds, a segment of the property thrived as fertile ground for pineapple cultivation, leading to the creation of the iconic "Pineapple" brand. This symbolised a commitment to excellence and the harmonious integration of land and factories, creating a narrative that extended beyond the confines of geographical boundaries.

The corporate evolution in 1908 saw the emergence of J C Hutton Pty Ltd, with John Reid assuming the role of managing director in Queensland. Under Reid's astute leadership, the "Pineapple" brand and the distinctive "Don't Arque" trademark achieved not just local eminence but international acclaim, particularly in East Asian markets.

The Ham and Bacon Factory, established in 1889, remained a cornerstone of employment in Zillmere until its closure in 1965. Through economic downturns, including the 1890s Depression and the Great Depression, Hutton's provided a lifeline for struggling farmers in the district.

The factory also served as a local store, offering meat and milk to residents. Hutton's became deeply ingrained in the Zillmere community, organising social events that brought people together.

Hutton's historical links to Zillmere, however, are faintly visible today. The former factory site now hosts a lone fig tree planted around 1891. Along Zillmere Road, where workers' cottages once stood, only two remain out of the original 10. The subdivision purchased by Hutton's in 1893, on which a house now stands, was sold in 1950. As we savour the legacy of "Pineapple" and the echoes of "Don't Arque," we are reminded that culinary empires often trace their roots to visionary pioneers like James Carruthers Hutton, placing suburbs like Zillmere on the map of gastronomic history.



t's time to warm up your vocal chords because the Hops and Harmony bar choir is back.

The community singalong experience conducted by Billboard and Aria chart-topping singer/songwriter and music producer JVMIE (Jamie Lee Wilson), is returning to Royal Quarters in Nundah this month.

JVMIE described Hops and Harmony as an inclusive, welcoming event, which was part concert, part comedy.

"The first thing people say before they come is, 'I can't sing,' but that's where I come in!" she said. 'It's not about perfection, it's about having fun. And nobody will hear you anyway.

"There are no special skills required, nothing to prepare, we'll learn it on the night. If you like good music and bad jokes, then you're in the right place."

JVMIE has performed all around the world, supporting artists like Kelly Rowland, David Guetta, and Salt-N-Pepa. Her songs have also been featured in films and television shows like Packed to the Rafters

As the owner/operator of Hops and Harmony, she started running the events almost a year ago on Tamborine Mountain.

"Our first show was a success and it has just grown from there." JVMIE said. "It feels like there is a real desire for connection and community post-Covid, and Hops and Harmony provides a unique opportunity for friends and strangers to come together and connect through music."

The concept of gathering a crowd to learn and sing a popular song in a pub or similar venue originated in 2017 with Astrid Jorgenson, an Australian vocalist, conductor, and composer. Her brainchild, Pub Choir, achieved global success and paved the way for similar musical experiences like Hops and Harmony.

JVMIE said she had been humbled by the feedback from attendees.

"From 'Better than therapy' to 'You've changed our lives' or 'You filled a gap in my soul', people come up after the shows elated, with tears in their eyes," she said. "I have never experienced an audience connection like this before."

She encouraged everyone to come along and try something new.

"I heard a great quote from someone at a show last week: 'When is the last time you did something for the first time?" she said.

"It's entertaining, it's therapeutic, it's good for the soul. And science says that singing makes you better-looking!"

"Here, I keep my brain active while playing Mahjong, Canasta and Cribbage," he said. "I particularly enjoy helping others learn to participate in these activities."

Burnie Brae was initially started by the Chermside Rotary and was known as the Chermside Senior Citizens Centre.

"It later expanded its role in the community to embrace a wider population and provide an expansion of services," Doug said. "The name was changed to Burnie Brae to reflect this wider range of activities and honouring the name of the original homestead."

Burnie Brae plays a significant role for the people in its community, including providing services to the vulnerable.

"It continues to provide the on-site services as in the past, but now manages a broad range of activities that help ageing people stay in their homes," Doug said. "It is supported by My Aged Care.

"My favourite part about Burnie Brae is the people. The staff are friendly and supportive, the members – a wonderful social environment."

To celebrate 40 years of service to the community and to showcase its offerings, Burnie Brae will be hosting presentations, morning teas, come-and-try activities, and technology training every Wednesday during March.

NORTHERN TRANSITWAY PROJECT UPDATE

The Northern Transitway from Sadlier Street to Rode Road will be opened next month. This will mark the completion of this stage of the project, with over 900 metres of Gympie Road transitway completed in both directions.

All Gympie Road bus stops from Stafford Road to Rode Road will be open in April, aiming to alleviate congestion and improve traffic times through the corridor. The dedicated bus lanes will allow buses to travel more efficiently and separate them from general traffic.

The remaining section of the project, from Rode Road to Hamilton Road, will be delivered under a new contract, following the release of the Gympie Road Bypass Investment proposal later this year.

he Brisbane Netball Association (BNA) is providing new opportunities for male players.

With an increasing number of men playing alongside women in the opens competition, the Chermside-based association has decided to introduce a male-only competition for juniors aged up to 14 and an opens competition for those aged 15 and above.

BNA Competitions Director Hayley Larkin said it seemed the best time to give male players their own space and competition.

"We believe that having a full men's comp will bring in new male players of all ages and create a strong men's competition," Hayley said.

Hayley said the male-only competition would allow male participation to grow in the area.

"There are opportunities to play under Netball Queensland competitions under senior and junior state age (JSA) within the boy's divisions," she said. "A few of our players play for The Suns, the premier league for men's netball. Having more males within the sport will only open up opportunities to higher level competitions and different pathways."

One junior boys netball player, Flynn, who plays for Brisbane North Fever, said he had played three netball seasons in the positions of Goal Attack (GA) and Centre (C).

"(I'm) still playing this season in the mixed inters comp and those girls are really good and a bit rough but if I play JSA it would be something different," Flynn said.

He expressed his enthusiasm for the teamwork aspects of netball.

"Everyone on the team has a job and everyone has to get the ball to get a goal," he said. "You can't just rebound and then get to the other end and shoot yourself."

LOCAL ICE HOCKEY TEAM WINS BRONZE AT MASTERS GAMES

local ice hockey team has returned from playing a major winter sports event in Italy, bringing home the bronze.

The Brisbane Rusty Blades, based in Boondall, travelled to Lombardy in January to compete in the Winter World Masters Games 2024.

Mason Grieco, a forward player for the team, said the competition was for athletes aged over 30 and lasted five days.

"A total of four teams were involved in our competition: the Brisbane Rusty Blades, a team from Czechia, a team from Hungary, and a local Italian team," Mason said. "We played a total of five games over three rounds – a preliminary round, semi-finals, then finals."

The Brisbane Rusty Blades is a travelling masters (35+) ice hockey team formed in 1997. Mason said players were selected from the local Brisbane ice hockey league, many of whom have been playing together for more than 15 years.

"The team is managed and captained by our leader Francois Guilbert, who does an amazing job building the team and ensuring everything is organised for any tournament we enter," he said.

"The Blades generally compete in local tournaments (Melbourne, Newcastle, Adelaide, Perth, and Dunedin, New Zealand). However, occasionally an opportunity comes up where the team gets to travel overseas like the Winter World Masters Games."

This year's trip to Lombardy marked the second time the Blades have competed in the World Masters Games. In 2020, they also participated in the competition held in Innsbruck, Austria.

Mason, a Wavell Heights resident, has been playing ice hockey since he was six years old and competing since he was 10. He grew up in Toronto, Canada, "where ice hockey is deeply ingrained in the culture".

He said the highlights of this year's competition went beyond the game itself.

"While we ended up with the bronze after beating the local Italian team, the main highlight for me was being able to play the sport I love in an incredible location, in a partially outdoor ice rink in the Italian Alps – breathtaking," he said.

"The other highlight was getting to experience the tournament with a great group and their families.

"They haven't announced the next location yet but I'm already looking forward to the 2028 Games."

Brisbane is gearing up for local government elections on 16 March.

he Chermside Guide caught up with some of the local candidates, who shared their vision for a vibrant, sustainable, and liveable city.

Marchant Ward

Incumbent Marchant Ward Councillor Danita Parry, the LNP candidate, said she would focus on road and transport projects to help residents get home safely, and upgraded community amenities.

"We know everyday costs are an issue for residents, so we'll continue to deliver new initiatives, like our half-price green bins," Cr Parry said.

Labor candidate and Marchant resident Darren Mitchell said he would listen to locals and advocate for issues that mattered.

"With these opportunities, I've been able to gain the experience, skills and abilities to deliver change and improvement for our Northgate Ward," Ms Peneha said.

The candidates for the Brisbane City Council Lord Mayoral election are incumbent Lord Mayor, Adrian Schrinner (LNP), Tracey Price (ALP), and Jonathan Sriranganathan (Queensland Greens).

Could you believe a convicted murderer?

s most crime aficionados know, when a wife is found dead, the prime suspect is always the spouse. So, in 1987 when Michelle Schofield's body was discovered in a pit in Florida, few people believed the innocence of her husband Leo. That is until over 30 years later when Pulitzer Prize-winning author Gilbert King and his researcher Kelsey Decker start investigating the case. Although this is a true crime podcast, it unfolds more like a work of fiction from the mind of John Grisham - two plucky reporters try to free a wronged man, unearthing new evidence, going up against the government and sticking their noses where they don't belong.

Without spoiling anything, what sets this podcast apart from other true crime podcasts is that it features a blow-by-blow confession from the killer - but that's just the beginning.

At its heart, it's about injustice and trying to uncover the truth. If you love Netflix shows like Making a Murderer then this is perfect for you. The podcast is well produced, even including music from the convicted murderer - a strange choice I know, but it'll make sense when you listen to the podcast.



Beverley Isdale, Chermside West, and Jyoti-Amarjot Goraya, Aspley, were presented with Australia Day Achievement Awards at a ceremony in January.

Beverley, a founding member of the Chermside Districts Historical Society (CDHS), said she was extremely surprised to win the award.

"I genuinely felt as if all those who received awards were being thanked for their contributions," she said.

"I thought I was rewarded for doing something I totally enjoy doing. I was also amazed at the range of people and organisations who contribute to our city, especially for less fortunate people."

Beverley's involvement in the CDHS has ranged from committee member to archivist to president. As an archivist, she preserves the community's most treasured records.

As the Cultural Coordinator of the Federation of Indian Communities of Queensland (FICQ), she coordinates special projects related to cultural service delivery.

She has been involved in many community activities including organising and hosting Punjabi ladies' events. She is also a key team member of the Australian Sikh Games, acting as the Netball Game Coordinator, and this year assisting with the cultural program plan and hosting part of the opening ceremony.

"When we appreciate diversity, then we become more aware of ourselves as to who we are and what we expect from others as well," Jyoti-Amarjot said. "With that experience we not only become more aware, but we also gain a sense of pride for the diversity of our own culture."

She said she felt happy, overwhelmed and proud to win the award.

"This award provided me with a sense of accomplishment after working for the community for so long," she said. "Such kind of validation will boost anyone's confidence to do more good work for the community."

iona Anchal, the founder of Wholesome Bellies. is on a mission to teach people how to cook nutritious and delicious plant-based meals.

Her passion for cooking began at the age of 12, when she spent her weekends at her parent's Italian restaurant, helping serve meals to 250 people every night.

Now, with over 14 classes on offer at her Woolloongabba location, Fiona is sharing her love of creating flavoursome food with others.

"I'm passionate about teaching others how to create mouth-watering plant-based dishes,"

Fiona said. "Mainly because I know we all need to eat more vegetables and more whole foods.

"Learning to cook your own plant-based meals means that this way of eating is more sustainable. With variety and flavour, it's easier to maintain. Protein is a huge factor too and learning how to cook legumes and tofu is crucial. Otherwise, most plant-based eaters who can't cook end up eating processed vegan foods and that's not ideal every day.

"Another great thing is cost saving. Right now, everyone is looking to cut down costs with the increased costs of living. Knowing how to whip up a quick, healthy lentil dhal, for example, will set you back a mere \$8, add some rice and you've got an awesome dinner."

One of the newest classes is the Asian Fusion class, where participants will cook dishes like curried potato wontons, sweet potato stir-fried Chinese noodles, and caramelised sticky garlic egaplants.

In the coming months, Wholesome Bellies will be running Malaysian, Middle Eastern, Moroccan, Sicilian, Indian, and Mexican classes, as well as an Aussie BBQ class.

SOLDIER CRAB MICTYRIS LONGICARPUS

ut of the three different species of soldier crabs that inhabit Moreton Bay, the Light Blue Soldier Crab is the most prolific and found across the eastern coast of Australia inhabiting tidal wetlands, sand-flats and estuaries.

About the size of a 20 cent piece they feed on the detritus and algae in the substrate leaving behind little round balls of sand.

Commonly seen as large armies on our local tidal flats and burying themselves like a corkscrew in seconds when threatened, they are probably one of the most loved crabs of Australia, fascinating children (and adults like me) for years.

Larger fish such as bream and whiting, along with a host of others such as sting rays, love feeding on soldier crabs too making them a fantastic and easy to collect fresh bait.
